## **CONFLICT OF INTEREST AND DISCLOSURE CODE (ALL DISTRICTS) (3-VOTES)**

### **IT IS RECOMMENDED THAT YOUR BOARD:**

Approve the Conflict of Interest and Disclosure Codes for Antelope Valley Transit Authority; Arcadia Unified School District; Castaic Unified School District; Claremont Unified School District; Foothill Transit; La Canada Irrigation District; Los Angeles County Special Education Improvement Authority; Palmdale Water District; and Water Replenishment District Southern California to be effective the day following your Board's approval.

### **PURPOSE/JUSTIFICATION OF RECOMMENDED ACTION**

The recommendations are necessary in order to comply with the provisions of the Political Reform Act of 1974. In accordance with the Act, the Board of Supervisors must approve a Conflict of Interest and Disclosure Code for each local government agency for which the Board of Supervisors is the code reviewing body.

Pursuant to Government Code Section 87300, every agency must adopt and promulgate a Conflict of Interest and Disclosure Code that, as the code reviewing body for Los Angeles County, the Board of Supervisors must approve before the code can then take effect. In addition, pursuant to Government Code Section 87306, agencies are required to amend their Conflict of Interest Codes when such amendments are necessitated by changed circumstances.

### Implementation of Strategic Plan Goals

Approval of the attached codes broadly supports the County Strategic Goal of Workforce Excellence.

The proposed Conflict of Interest and Disclosure Codes have been thoroughly reviewed and approved by the code review staff in accordance with the procedures established by your Board.

### **FISCAL IMPACT/FINANCING**

Local governmental agencies must have a Conflict of Interest and Disclosure Code in which designated employees are required to disclose financial interests at a level appropriate to their decision-making authority. These employees make or participate in the making of decisions that may have a foreseeable material effect on a financial interest. Adoption of a Conflict of Interest and Disclosure Code deters potential conflicts of interest, thereby averting misuse of public funds.

The recommended action has no effect on budget revenues and expenditures.

### **FACTS AND PROVISIONS/LEGAL REQUIREMENTS**

The code review staff recommends that your Board approve the Conflict of Interest and Disclosure Codes for the agencies listed below, pursuant to Government Code Section 87300.

#### New Agency:

#### Antelope Valley Transportation Authority

- This Authority has adopted by reference Regulation §18730 (2 California Code of Regulations, §18730) as its conflict of interest code and has specifically patterned its disclosure categories after the County's Model Code disclosure categories.
- The Authority has designated the following as code filers: *Governing Board Members, Governing Alternate Board Members, Executive Director, Senior Administrative Analyst, General Counsel, Administrative Service Manager, Facilities Maintenance Manager, Contract Compliance Administrator, Analyst I & II Contract Compliance, Finance Manager, Public Information Officer/Customer Service Manager, and Consultants.*

Los Angeles County Special Education Improvement Authority

- This is a newly established Joint Powers Authority. The Authority has adopted by reference Regulation §18730 (2 California Code of Regulations, §18730) as its conflict of interest code and has specifically patterned its disclosure categories after the County's Model Code disclosure categories.
- The Authority has designated the following as code filers: *Governing Board Members, Governing Board Members (Alternate), General Counsel, and Consultants.*

Substantive Changes:

Arcadia Unified School District

- Modifies the Incorporation Page to reflect those positions that will file directly with the Board Executive Office.
- Adds the position of *Supervisor, Purchasing/Warehouse/Risk Management* to the code.
- Changes the titles of one (1) position.

Castaic Union School District

- Modifies the Incorporation Page to reflect those positions that will file directly with the Board Executive Office.
- Adds the position of *District Network Supervisor* to the code.
- Changes the titles of three (3) positions.

Claremont Unified School District

- Modifies the Incorporation Page to reflect the position that will file directly with the Board Executive Office.
- Adds the positions of: *Executive Director, Student Services; Director IV, Special Education; Director II, Special Projects and Programs; Director II, Technology; Director II, Child Development Program; Principals; and Purchasing Agent* to the code.
- Changes the titles of four (4) positions.
- Deletes *Director, Modernization Projects* and *Director IV, Adult Education* from the code due to reorganization.

Foothill Transit

- Changes the title of one (1) position.

La Canada Irrigation District

- Modifies the Incorporation Page to reflect positions that will file directly with the Board Executive Office.
- Deletes *Candidate for Director* from the code pursuant to new regulations.

Palmdale Water District

- Modifies the Incorporation Page to reflect positions that will file directly with the Board Executive Office.
- Adds the positions of: *Finance and Service Manager; and Water and Energy Resources Director* to the code.
- Changes the titles of two (2) positions.
- Deletes *Facilities & Operations Manager* from the code due to reorganization.


Water Replenishment District of Southern California
