ORDINANCE NO. _____

An ordinance amending Title 2 – Administration, Title 5 – Personnel and Title 6 - Salaries of the Los Angeles County Code, to effectuate the consolidation of the Office of Public Safety's duties and security functions into the Sheriff's Department, and to delete references to the marshal service in the County Code.

The Board of Supervisors of the County of Los Angeles ordains as follows:

SECTION 1. Chapter 2.34.015 is hereby added as follows:

2.34.015 Security

The Sheriff has the authority to provide for security services to all County Departments and facilities.

SECTION 2. Chapter 2.97 is hereby deleted in its entirety as of September 30, 2010.

~~**2.97.010 Created.**~~

~~There is created an office of public safety, hereinafter in this chapter referred to as the "office."~~

~~**2.97.020 Members.**~~

~~The office shall consist of one chief, office of public safety to be appointed by the director of personnel. The chief, office of public safety shall appoint all other employees of the office. Staffing shall include all safety and park police and security personnel and related support staff assigned to the departments of health services, internal services and parks and recreation on the effective date of this section.~~

~~**2.97.030 Duties.**~~

~~—The office shall:~~

~~—A. Provide security services to all county departments and facilities as may be ordered by the board of supervisors or requested by the heads of county departments.~~

~~—B. Make recommendations to the board of supervisors regarding the security of county departments and facilities and participate in emergency and disaster planning activities in cooperation with the chief administrative officer and the sheriff.~~

~~—C. Make recommendation to the heads of county departments as requested regarding security of facilities, personnel, equipment and the general public using such facilities.~~

~~—D. Consult as necessary with the sheriff and local police authorities to ensure a close working relationship to enhance the security of county facilities.~~

~~2.97.040 State standards for recruitment and training of office of public safety, safety police officers and dispatchers.~~

~~—The county declares that it desires that peace officers and dispatchers employed by the office of public safety participate in the commission on peace officer standards and training reimbursable program to receive state financial aid under the provisions of Chapter 1 of Title 4 (commencing with Section 13500) of the Penal Code.~~

~~The office of public safety will adhere to the standards for selection and training established by the commission.~~

~~The commission and its representatives may make such inquiries as deemed appropriate by the commission to ascertain that the office of public safety peace officer personnel and dispatchers adhere to standards for selection and training established by the commission on peace officer standards and training.~~

SECTION 3. Section 5.72.050 is hereby amended to read as follows:

5.72.050 Uniforms— Deputy sheriffs, deputy marshals, deputy marshal, matrons, security officers, marshal, and firefighters.

Persons employed in the items listed below shall be entitled to have issued to them certain items of initial uniform and equipment. Such issue shall be restricted to the initial equipping of newly hired persons and shall remain the property of the county until such a time as normal wear makes them valueless to the county. The chief administrative executive officer shall annually list those items to be issued and the period of time that they must be used before being presumed to be valueless to the county.

SECTION 4. Section 5.72.052 is hereby amended to read as follows:

5.72.052 Uniform allowance— ~~Deputy marshal, matron and d~~Deputy clerk, custody officer.

Any person employed in a position of ~~Deputy Marshal, Matron (Item No. 2746) or~~

Deputy Clerk, Custody Officer (Item No. 2747) shall receive a lump-sum uniform allowance of \$600.00 payable between December 1 and December 15 each year provided such person was employed in said position on November 1 of that calendar year.

SECTION 5. Section 5.72.200 is deleted in its entirety effective September 30, 2010.

~~Any person employed in a position of Chief, Office of Public Safety (UC) (Item No. 2853), and Bureau Chief, Los Angeles County Police (Item No. 2838), shall be entitled to annual lump-sum payments as follows:~~

~~1. \$600.00 provided such person was employed in said position on January 1, 2006;~~

~~2. \$750.00 payable between December 1, 2006, and December 15, 2006, provided such person was employed in said position on November 1, 2006;~~

~~3. \$850.00 payable between December 1, 2007, and December 15, 2007, provided such person was employed in said position on November 1, 2007;~~

~~4. \$1,000.00 payable between December 1, 2008, and December 15, 2008, provided such person was employed in said position on November 1, 2008;~~

~~F. — Office of Public Safety. Any Participant in the class listed in paragraph 2 of Section 6.10.105 A shall be entitled to receive the compensation provided by said provisions. Notwithstanding any other provision of this code, at the time such participant's class becomes subject to the provisions of the Plan, the Participant's salary shall be established within the applicable range without regard to any POST bonus compensation.~~

SECTION 7. Section 6.10.105 is hereby amended to read as follows effective September 30, 2010:

6.10.105 POST bonus.

~~_____ A. _____ Where specifically authorized by the board, persons employed in the office of public safety who are issued an on-call subpoena, properly issued by a court legally empowered to subpoena witnesses and who remain on-call during off-duty hours for court appearances, shall receive compensation at one-half the hourly rate-~~

~~established for their classification in Section 6.28.050 or in Section 6.28.140 of this code for each hour that they are on-call while the court is in session, and for travel time to and from court resulting from receipt of a call to appear in court. Such employees shall be entitled to such compensation for a minimum of two hours for each day they are on-call. For purposes of this subsection, the on-call period will begin at the time for appearance in court specified in the subpoena and will end when the employee is relieved from the on-call requirement by the court, or by the department head or his designee, or upon arrival at the court in response to a call by the court.~~

~~—— B. —— Further off-duty time spent in court by persons subject to subsection A of this section, as a result of such subpoena, shall be compensated pursuant to Chapter 6.15 of this code.~~

~~—— C. —— For purposes of this section, off-duty hours shall be deemed to be those hours not included by the department in the workday or workweek scheduled for the employee.~~

SECTION 9. Chapter 15.65.445(F) is hereby amended as follows:

15.65.445 County-owned or operated parking facilities – Parking restrictions.

...

F. Sheriff's deputies and security officers, contract security guards, and parking services employees of the internal services department are authorized to issue notices of violation of regulations and restrictions imposed pursuant to this section.

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
