Related to Set Item 1
Public Safety Realignment – CCP

Assembly Bill 117 clarified and amended portions of AB 109, mandating county boards authority to designate members of the CCP and the CCP executive committee.

Specifically, AB 117 indicates that membership of each county CCP includes "a county supervisor or the chief administrative officer for the county or a designee of the board of supervisors." It further stipulates that the counties' CCP executive committees consist of the chief probation officer (who serves as chair), the sheriff, a chief of police, the District Attorney, the Public Defender, the presiding judge of the superior court, or his/her designee, and *one department representative from either the county department of social services, the county department of mental health or the county alcohol and substance abuse programs.*

The Chief Executive Office plays a significant role in analyzing the fiscal and programmatic impacts of legislation, such as AB 109 and AB 117, and serves in a key advisory role to the Board. Given this role, it is appropriate that the CEO serve as a member of the CCP. The Department of Mental Health (DMH) plays a critical role in assessing and treating individuals involved in the criminal justice system both in the community and in custody. The public safety realignment outlined by AB 109 and 117 will greatly impact DMH and how it provides services to this population.

I, THEREFORE, MOVE that the Board of Supervisors make the following designations pursuant to AB 117 as it relates to the membership of the Community Corrections Partnership and its executive committee:

1. Designate the CEO to serve as a member of the CCP; and,
2. Designate the Department of Mental Health as a voting member of the executive committee of the CCP.
