PROCLAIM OCTOBER 2011 AS “CYBER SECURITY AWARENESS MONTH” IN LOS ANGELES COUNTY

National Cyber Security Awareness Month (NCSAM), conducted every October since 2001, is a national public awareness campaign to encourage everyone to protect their computers and our nation’s critical cyber infrastructure. Cyber security covers a wide range of practices designed to keep people and their computer systems safe when accessing the internet.

Cyber security requires vigilance 365 days per year. Toward that end, the Department of Homeland Security, the National Cyber Security Alliance (www.staysafeonline.org), the Multi-State Information Sharing and Analysis Center (www.msisac.org), and the National Association of State Chief Information Officers (www.nascio.org) coordinate during the month of October to inform home users, schools, businesses and governments what they need to do to protect their computers, data, and most importantly our children from security breaches.

I, THEREFORE MOVE that the Board of Supervisors proclaim October 2011, as “Cyber Security Awareness Month” in the County of Los Angeles. All County employees and citizens are encouraged to learn more about cyber security and to participate in scheduled webinar cyber security training sessions.
