AMENDMENT TO MEDICAL SCHOOL AFFILIATION AGREEMENT
BETWEEN THE COUNTY OF LOS ANGELES AND THE REGENTS OF THE
UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA
(2nd AND 5th SUPERVISORIAL DISTRICTS)
(3 VOTES)

SUBJECT

Request approval of amendment to the Regents of the University of California at Los Angeles (UCLA) Medical School Affiliation Agreement (MSAA).

IT IS RECOMMENDED THAT YOUR BOARD:

- 1. Approve and instruct the Chairman of the Board of Supervisors to sign the attached Amendment No. 4 to Agreement No. 76850 (H-702099) with UCLA, for the provision of physician medical education and patient care services at Harbor-UCLA Medical Center (H-UCLA MC) and Olive View-UCLA Medical Center (OV-UCLA MC), effective July 1, 2012, to add additional purchased services and to increase the maximum obligation from \$26,728,000 to \$27,074,000 and update the County and University Training Program full-time equivalents (FTEs) per Attachment I for the period beginning July 1, 2012 through June 30, 2013.
- 2. Make a finding as required by Los Angeles County Code section 2.121.420 that contracting for the provision of physician services (trainee and non-trainee) at OV-UCLA MC, as described herein, can be performed more feasibly by contracting with the private sector.

PURPOSE/JUSTIFICATION OF RECOMMENDED ACTION

Approval of the first recommendation will provide six psychiatry residents for OV-UCLA MC's community mental health urgent care center and other directly operated mental health programs to decompress the hospital's overcrowded psychiatric emergency room, and adjust the number of other specialty physician residents participating under the County and University Training Program at OV-UCLA MC and H-UCLA MC to ensure continued compliance with the appropriate accrediting organizations.

Approval of the second recommendation continues prior Board findings that contracting for the provision of physician services (trainee and non-trainee) under this Amendment at OV-UCLA MC and H-UCLA MC can still be performed more feasibly by contracting with the private sector.

Addendum A – Purchased Services

County and University Training Programs

Pursuant to the Agreement, there is a range of County and University training programs in place at H-UCLA MC and OV-UCLA MC. Attachment II identifies the programs and the respective FTE residents and has been updated to reflect changes in the accredited training programs based at each of these facilities. OV-UCLA MC changes include the addition of 6.5 FTE residents in FY 2012-13. The Department of Mental Health (DMH) has entered into an agreement to fully fund 6.0 FTE residents at OV-UCLA MC for the Olive View Community Mental Health Urgent Care Center. Kaiser Permanente Medical Center is funding 1.0 FTE for Hematology/Oncology services. OV-UCLA MC has elected to shift 1.0 FTE of existing resources from the Forensic Fellow program to the more critical Gynecology/Oncology program for .5 FTE and Surgical pathology for .5 FTE. The remaining .5 FTE in the Forensic Fellow program will be eliminated as DMH has elected to discontinue its funding for this .5 FTE. Attachment III provides additional information on these changes.

Implementation of Strategic Plan Goals

The recommended actions support Goal 1, Operational Effectiveness, and Goal 2, Fiscal Sustainability, of the County's Strategic Plan.

FISCAL IMPACT/FINANCING

The maximum annual County obligation for H-UCLA MC and OV-UCLA MC under the amended Agreement in FY 2012-13 will be increased by \$346,000, whereby such increase is fully funded by DMH, for a total contract sum of \$27,074,000. Funding for this Agreement is included in the DHS FY 2012-13 Recommended Budget.

FACTS AND PROVISIONS/LEGAL REQUIREMENTS

H-UCLA MC and OV-UCLA MC

DHS entered into the current Agreement with UCLA effective July 1, 2006 through June 30, 2011, with a one-year automatic extension at the end of each contract year, unless either party serves notice of non-renewal to the other party.

The recommended Amendment includes the changes in FTEs for County and University training programs, the specific volume, and cost of academic purchased services. If DMH anticipates loss of the mental health funding for the following academic year, DHS will give notice to the University 60 days prior to the start of the new year to remove these newly added FTEs. A complete summary of the changes is shown on Attachment I.

On June 28, 2011, the Board made the finding as required by Los Angeles County Code section 2.121.420 that contracting for the provision of physician services (trainee and non-trainee) at OV-UCLA MC and H-UCLA MC can be performed more feasibly by contracting with the private sector. While the provision of clinical services by the six psychiatric residents at OV-UCLA MC under this Amendment is subject to Proposition A and Living Wage Program (LWP) requirements, the Department has determined that the physician services under this Amendment can be performed more feasibly by contracting with UCLA, which also continues to be exempt from the LWP due to their non-profit status.

CONTRACTING PROCESS

Not applicable.

IMPACT ON CURRENT SERVICES (OR PROJECTS)

The Agreement will continue the provision of clinical and academic services at the H-UCLA MC and OV-UCLA MC.

H-UCLA MC

This is to update the County and University Training Program full-time equivalents (FTEs) in Exhibit I to reflect 7 ACGME-accredited County Training Program positions included in the FY 2011-12 Final Budget, approved by your Board on October 4, 2011, to meet mandated residency common program requirements. It should be noted that the numbers reflect the change in funded positions approved by ACGME.

The increase of 7.0 FTEs are for the following areas: Anesthesiology, Internal Medicine – Dermatology, Internal Medicine – Hematology/Oncology, Internal Medicine – Nephrology, Internal Medicine – Pulmonary, Neurology – Neurophysiology/EEG, Pediatrics – Child Abuse, Pediatrics – Neonatal and Radiology. UCLA will be responsible for training the seven additional residents at H-UCLA MC. This will not impact H-UCLA MC's costs under the Agreement.

OV-UCLA MC

Discontinuation of Forensic Fellowship

For several years, the Veterans Affairs (VA) Greater Los Angeles/UCLA-San Fernando Valley Program in psychiatry has sponsored a fellowship program in forensic psychiatry. Rotations included various UCLA-affiliated sites, including OV-UCLA MC, as well as rotations to the Atascadero State Hospital. Because the forensic fellowship could no longer meet the needs of all the participating sites, the VA decided to discontinue the fellowship, effective July 1, 2012. OV-UCLA MC concurred with this decision, freeing up 1.5 FTE (\$103,000) OV-UCLA MC-paid housestaff positions.

Gynecologic Oncology

Currently, UCLA and OV-UCLA MC share one Gynecologic Oncology fellow. OV-UCLA MC Gyn/ONC cases have increased both in numbers and complexity from a baseline of 287 cases and 1,099 procedures in 2007, to 408 cases and 1,762 procedures in 2010, and further to 448 cases and 2,194 procedures in 2011, with no increases in physician staffing. Similarly, the number of outpatients seen in Gynecologic Oncology clinic has

increased from 1,311 in 2007 to 1,582 in 2010 and 1,727 in 2011. Case load increases between OV-UCLA MC and UCLA over the past several years necessitated application to expand the American Board of Obstetrics and Gynecology (ABOG)-approved Gyn/Onc fellowship by 1 FTE, so that both UCLA and OV-UCLA MC would have a dedicated full-time fellow. ABOG has approved this increase in the summer of 2011, to become effective July 1, 2012. This will optimize the fellow's surgical exposure, allow for continuity of care, improve patient care, mitigate work hour issues, and better accommodate the doubling in workload. It is recommended to add 0.5 FTE for a cost of \$35,500.

DMH-Funded Psychiatry

In August, 2011, the Department of Mental Health (DMH) opened a new mental health urgent care center on the OV-UCLA MC Campus. This facility provides outpatient psychiatric urgent care services daily. Having psychiatry residents at the center would help expand services in a cost-effective way and enhance the quality of both the residency program and the services provided to patients. Using Mental Health Service Act (MHSA) funding, DMH will fully fund 6.0 housestaff FTEs in the amount of \$379,000 in FY 2012-13. It is recommended to add these DMH-funded positions to the affiliation agreement and to add the DMH Olive View Urgent Care Center to the list of training sites in the affiliation agreement.

The current funding commitment from DMH is one year for FY 2012-13 only. The psychiatry program has the ability to flex its numbers and rotations, so that if the MHSA funding is lost, there will be no ongoing commitment from the County for the increase in positions. Hence, if the County anticipates loss of the MHSA funding for the following academic year, the County can give notice to the University 60 days prior to the start of the new year to remove these newly added FTEs.

Oncology Fellowship

This will enhance the OV-UCLA MC fellowship as they rotate to Kaiser by broadening the experience of the fellows in surgical oncology and exposure to patients and doctors in a different practice setting, including seeing patients with earlier stages of cancer than typically seen at OV-UCLA MC. The FTE position will increase the number of fellows by

one, but will not increase the number of fellows stationed at OV-UCLA MC, except that the Kaiser-assigned fellow will return to OV-UCLA MC one to two half-days per week for clinics, thus helping with the heavy outpatient oncology workload. While this position is not added to deal with workload, OV-UCLA MC has experienced a 7% increase in the number of Oncology clinic visits, increasing from 5,600 in FY 2008-09 to 6,000 in FY 2011-12. It is recommended to add 1.0 FTE for \$0 net cost, as it will be fully funded by a Kaiser grant.

Non-ACGME Surgical Pathology Fellowship

Despite its academic setting and increasing workload, the pathology department currently has no allocated residents. Adding a non-ACGME pathology residents will

allow the pathology department to deal with the increased volume and complexity of cases. Total Specimens have increased from 10,000 in 2005 to 11,800 in 2011. It is recommended to add .5 FTE for a cost of \$34,500.

The current agreement only allows H-UCLA MC to have non-ACGME programs, but not OV-UCLA MC. The recommended amendment would also permit OV-UCLA MC to have non-ACGME housestaff.

Most residencies and fellowships are accredited by the ACGME. The accreditation process assures that programs comply with the high standards set by ACGME. However, it is also common for organizations to offer fellowships to physicians who have completed a fellowship and still want further experience or training. These fellowships are advantageous to the hiring organization in that the fellows are already fully qualified in their specialty, and so require a lower level of supervision. Furthermore, they do not need to meet the ACGME requirements, which are quite prescriptive, though they still must be structured as training programs including objectives, curriculum, and supervision.

Pursuant to § 2.5.2.2., County shall also reimburse University for its cost for any University Housestaff assigned to Primary County Facilities. The following UCLA and County fixed costs (including salary and benefits where applicable), which will not vary within a given range of programs and Housestaff: (a) overall academic infrastructure, including graduate medical education fees, (b) Verinform/AmIOn, (c) University Representative, (d) University Graduate Medical Education Dean, and (e) University's administrative personnel.

- A-I.3. Volume of Purchased Services. For Contract Year 2012-13, University shall provide Purchased Services as needed within the ranges or maximum set forth in this Addendum. In the event that County's needs fall outside of such ranges or maximum, the Parties may negotiate a different volume of services for specific line items; but as provided in § A-I.1, the fixed and variable rates set forth in § A-I.4 shall not vary during the course of the Contract Year.
