**ARTESIA BOULEVARD TRAFFIC SIGNAL SYNCHRONIZATION PROJECT
AWARD OF CONSULTANT SERVICES AGREEMENT
SUPERVISORIAL DISTRICTS 2 AND 4
3 VOTES**

IT IS RECOMMENDED THAT YOUR BOARD:

Award and authorize the Director of Public Works, or his designee, to execute a consultant services agreement with Katz, Okitsu and Associates, Inc., to prepare plans, specifications, and estimates, and provide construction assistance services for the Artesia Boulevard Traffic Signal Synchronization Project and to establish the effective date following the Board of Supervisors' approval. The agreement will be for a not-to-exceed fee of \$242,355 to be financed with Los Angeles County Metropolitan Transportation Authority (MTA) Grant Funds and County Proposition C Local Return Funds.

PURPOSE/JUSTIFICATION OF RECOMMENDED ACTION

We are recommending that the Board award and authorize the Director of Public Works, or his designee, to execute a consultant services agreement with Katz, Okitsu and Associates, Inc., for the preparation of construction documents and to provide for construction support and as-built plan preparation for the proposed Artesia Boulevard Project located in the Cities of Compton, Long Beach, Bellflower, Cerritos, Artesia,

La Mirada, and the unincorporated County area and to establish the effective date following your Board's approval.

Construction documents and jurisdictional approvals are tentatively scheduled for completion in March 2004. We will subsequently return to your Board to adopt plans and specifications, as well as advertise the project for construction bids.

The recommended agreement will provide design and construction support services for the Artesia Boulevard Project in support of Public Works' Traffic Signal Synchronization Program. The project includes Artesia Boulevard from Alameda Street to Valley View Avenue. As part of our efforts to proceed with traffic signal synchronization on Countywide arterials of regional significance, Public Works has successfully used consulting firms to perform design work of a similar nature on other projects.

Implementation of Strategic Plan Goals

This action meets the County's Strategic Plan Goals of Service Excellence and Organizational Effectiveness. Completion of this project will reduce congestion, vehicle emissions and operating costs, travel time, and enhance motorist and pedestrian safety.

FISCAL IMPACT/FINANCING

There will be no impact to the County's General Fund. The project will be financed with Proposition C Discretionary Grant Funds for the Gateway Cities Traffic Signal Forum, which was made available by the MTA under their 1999 Call for Projects, and County matching funds included in the Fiscal Year 2003-04 Proposition C Local Return Fund Budget. The estimated total cost of the project, including the design contract, is \$1,692,000. The MTA is providing approximately 79 percent of the funds, and Public Works will finance the remaining 21 percent with matching funds.

The recommended agreement for the design of this project is for a not-to-exceed fee of \$242,355, including \$40,392 for unforeseen additional work which may arise during the term of the agreement. Additional work within this allowance will not be performed without prior written authorization from the Director of Public Works, or his designee.

FACTS AND PROVISIONS/LEGAL REQUIREMENTS

A standard agreement in the form previously approved by County Counsel will be used. The standard Board-directed clauses that provide for contract termination, renegotiation, and hiring qualified displaced County employees will be included.

As required by the Board, language has been incorporated into the project specifications stating that the consultant shall notify its employees, and shall require each subconsultant to notify its employees, that they may be eligible for the Federal Earned Income Credit under the Federal income tax laws. The agreement also contains provisions requiring the contractor to comply with the Safely Surrendered Baby Law.

As requested by your Board on August 12, 1997, and as a threshold requirement for consideration of a contract award, Katz, Okitsu and Associates, Inc., is willing to consider Greater Avenues for Independence/General Relief Opportunity for Work participants for future employment.

Katz, Okitsu and Associates, Inc., is in full compliance with Los Angeles County Code Chapter 2.200 (Child Support Compliance Program) and Chapter 2.203 (Contractor Employee Jury Service Program).

ENVIRONMENTAL DOCUMENTATION

A finding of environmental impact is not required for consultant services agreements for design services. The appropriate environmental documentation will be completed prior to returning to your Board to request authorization to adopt and advertise plans and specifications to construct the project.

CONTRACTING PROCESS

On April 10, 2002, Public Works issued a request for proposals to 31 firms to develop a select list of qualified consultants to provide as-needed traffic design services and 19 firms submitted proposals for review and evaluation. An evaluation committee, consisting of Public Works engineering staff, evaluated the proposals. These evaluations were based on technical expertise, proposed work plan, experience, personnel qualifications, and understanding of the work requirements. These evaluations were completed without regard to race, creed, color, or gender.

Based on the review and evaluation of these proposals, the committee developed a select list of eight qualified firms. The firms selected were Van Dell and Associates; Transtech Engineers; Willdan Associates; Kimley-Horn and Associates; Meyer, Mohaddes Associates, Inc.; Katz, Okitsu and Associates, Inc.; and Albert Grover and Associates. As stated in the request for proposal, Public Works shall select consultants from the select list of qualified consultants for each project in order of established evaluation ranking. Katz, Okitsu & Associates, Inc., is the next firm on the list.

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Participation by Community Business Enterprise (CBE) in the project is encouraged through Public Works' CBE Outreach Program and the requirement that consultants demonstrate their good faith effort to utilize CBEs. Katz, Okitsu and Associates, Inc., is aware of Public Works' CBE Outreach Program and their proposed CBE participation is on file with Public Works.

Public Works has evaluated and determined that the Living Wage Program (County Code Chapter 2.201) does not apply to the recommended agreement, as this agreement is for non-Proposition A services.

As requested by the Board on February 3, 1998, and to further increase consultant awareness of contracting opportunities with Public Works, the request for proposal to develop the select list of qualified consultants was posted on the County bids website. Enclosed is a copy of the website posting for your reference.

IMPACT ON CURRENT SERVICES (OR PROJECTS)

There will be no impact on current County services or projects during the performance of the recommended consultant services.
