**ACCEPT A GRANT AWARD FROM THE UNITED STATES
DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE, BUREAU OF JUSTICE ASSISTANCE
FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 2013 SOLICITED – LAW ENFORCEMENT PROGRAM
(ALL DISTRICTS) (3 VOTES)**

SUBJECT

Request Board approval authorizing the Sheriff of Los Angeles County (County) to accept and execute a grant award in the amount of \$194,118 from the United States Department of Justice (DOJ), Bureau of Justice Assistance (BJA) for the Fiscal Year (FY) 2013 Solicited – Law Enforcement Program (Program) to fund the Counterfeit and Piracy Enforcement (CAPE) Team.

IT IS RECOMMENDED THAT THE BOARD:

1. Delegate authority to the Sheriff, as an agent for the County, to execute the attached Grant Award Number 2013-ZP-BX-0013, accepting a grant from the BJA in the amount of \$194,118 with no match requirement. The CAPE Team grant period is from October 1, 2012, through September 30, 2014.
2. Delegate authority to the Sheriff or his designee to execute and submit all required grant documents, including but not limited to, applications, agreements, memorandum of understanding, amendments, modifications, augmentations, extensions, payment requests, and grant renewals that may be necessary for completion of the Program.
3. Delegate authority to the Sheriff, as an agent for the County, to apply and submit a grant application to the BJA for the CAPE Team in future fiscal years and to execute all required grant application documents, including assurances and certifications, when and if such future funding becomes available.

PURPOSE/JUSTIFICATION OF RECOMMENDED ACTION

The objectives of the CAPE Team are to support and improve the capacity of local, state, and federal justice systems in addressing criminal intellectual property enforcement, including prosecution, prevention training, and technical assistance. In order to successfully achieve the objectives of the CAPE Team, the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department (Department), Community Oriented Policing Services (COPS) Bureau, will use the Program funds, on an overtime basis, to facilitate multi-jurisdictional investigations, and integrate multiple agencies for the purpose of enhancing inter-agency coordination and intelligence to reduce intellectual property crimes facilitated by the counterfeiting and pirating of luxury goods.

The \$194,118 in grant funding will be used for Salaries and Employee Benefits (\$187,272 - overtime only for the CAPE Team sworn and professional staff) and Services and Supplies (\$6,846 - travel and lodging expenses).

Implementation of Strategic Plan Goals

Approval of the recommended actions are consistent with the County's Strategic Plan, Goal 1, Operational Effectiveness, by combining a multi-agency response, utilizing Department resources on local, state, and federal levels to reduce intellectual property crimes in the County; and Goal 3, Integrated Services Delivery, by forging law enforcement community partnerships and increasing public awareness about the health and/or safety risks posed by counterfeit and piratical products.

FISCAL IMPACT/FINANCING

This will be the fourth grant award for this program. The \$194,118 in funding will be used for Salaries and Employee Benefits (\$187,272) and Services and Supplies (\$6,846); there is no match requirement for the program.

This funding has been included in the Department's FY 2013-14 Patrol budget.

FACTS AND PROVISIONS/LEGAL REQUIREMENTS

On June 4, 2013, the Department submitted an application in response to BJA's invitation to apply for the FY 2013 Solicited – Law Enforcement Program. Upon review of the Department's application, BJA awarded the grant in the amount of \$194,118, with no match requirement to the Department. The grant period will commence on October 1, 2012, and conclude on September 30, 2014.

This Board letter has been reviewed by County Counsel.

IMPACT ON CURRENT SERVICES (OR PROJECTS)

The program may create workload increases for the County's justice departments, as suspects are identified and subsequently charged with a crime. The Department has made contact with each of the County justice departments. The CAPE Team will have minimal impact on the District Attorney's Office and Public Defender services, which can be managed with existing resources.

The grant will have a positive impact on current services by providing overtime to CAPE Team personnel to reduce intellectual property crimes.


