

**FISH AND GAME PROPAGATION FUND GRANT AWARDS
(SECOND SUPERVISORIAL DISTRICT)
(3-VOTES)**

SUBJECT

Recommending approval to award grant funds from the Fish & Game Commission to stock fish at Alondra Community Regional Park during calendar year 2014.

IT IS RECOMMENDED THAT THE BOARD:

Approve the Fish and Game Propagation Fund Grant request totaling \$2,500, to stock fish at the Alondra Community Regional Park, 3850 Manhattan Beach Boulevard in Lawndale, to be held during calendar year 2014, sponsored by the Los Angeles County Second Supervisorial District.

PURPOSE/JUSTIFICATION OF RECOMMENDED ACTION

The Commission has determined that the grant request will promote education, conservation and the propagation of fish and game thus benefiting Los Angeles County and the State of California.

At its meeting of January 9, 2014, the Los Angeles County Fish and Game Commission approved a grant request from the Second Supervisorial District, totaling \$2,500 to stock fish for the South Bay Youth Fishing Event to be held at Alondra Community Regional Park, during calendar year 2014.

The South Bay Youth Fishing Event is an annual event for children ages 15 and under that includes a generous lake stocking of catfish, lunch provided by a community based organization, angling lessons provided by the California State Department of Fish and Wildlife "Fishing in the City" program, opportunity drawings and awards. The purpose of this event is to provide the residents

and visitors of Los Angeles County with quality recreational opportunities that promote a healthy lifestyle and strengthen the community through diverse physical, educational and cultural programming.

Since 1952, the Commission has supported activities and projects that promote the best methods for the propagation and protection of fish and game in the State and County of Los Angeles. The stocking of fish at County parks and recreation areas supports this endeavor, by providing opportunities and encouraging the sport of fishing to the many residents within the community.

Implementation of Strategic Plan Goals

The provision of funding for these events is consistent with the County's Strategic Plan Goal No. 1 & 3 (Operational Effectiveness & Integrated Services Delivery). In addition to enhancing the community's knowledge and understanding of conservation and the propagation of fish and game, the event will provide a safe and healthy environment increasing accessibility to County cultural, recreational and lifelong learning facilities and programs.

FISCAL IMPACT/FINANCING

There is no impact to the General Fund. The approved expenditure will be charged to the Fish and Game Propagation Fund, which has sufficient funds to cover the cost. The Los Angeles County Fish and Game Propagation Fund is financed from a percentage of penalty assessments collected relating to fish and game code violations in Los Angeles County.

FACTS AND PROVISIONS/LEGAL REQUIREMENTS

Section 13100 et seq. of the Fish and Game Code establishes guidelines for the expenditure of fines levied for fish and game code violations. It includes enhancing fish and game activities including protection, conservation, propagation, and preservation of fish and wildlife.



The event includes a generous lake stocking of catfish, lunch provided by a community based organization, angling lessons provided by the California State Department of Fish and Wildlife " Fishing in the City" program, opportunity drawings and awards.

The event starts at 8:00AM and ends at 12:00PM. The event is for children ages 15 and under.

Background on Applicant's Organization

Purpose and goals:

We provide the residents and visitors of Los Angeles County with quality recreational opportunities that promote a healthy lifestyle and strengthen the community through diverse physical, educational and cultural programming, and will enhance the community environment by acquiring, developing and maintaining County parks, lakes, gardens, golf courses, trails and open space.

Brief summary of current activities:

The County of Los Angeles Department of Parks and Recreation provides a diverse selection of recreational and educational programs and activities including but not limited to youth and adult sports, fishing, environmental education, cultural celebrations and special events.

Statement of justification of need:

The South Bay Youth Fishing Event is a free to the public event that draws more than 2000 youth annually. Due to the popularity of the event and its continued growth it has become critical that we seek additional resources and partners in order put on the event at the same level each year. The funding provided from the commission to purchase fish for this derby is vital to the program's existence and without this funding the program may not continue.

Statement of purpose and goals:

The purpose of the event is to introduce youth living in an urban setting to fishing, conservation and maintenance of wildlife. Our goal is to introduce and encourage fishing as a recreational activity while establishing an appreciation of the environment.

Action plan to meet objectives:

In December of 2013 - Setup meeting with stakeholders to discuss program implementation and submit grant application. In February 2014 - Secure all equipment and supplies. In March 2014 - Send out Save the date flyers to all school districts in the surrounding area. In April 2014 - Send out official flyer to school district and local businesses. In May 2014 - Implement and evaluate the program.

Statement of how the objectives advance the propagation and protection of fish and wildlife:

By conducting the youth fishing derby we will advance propagation by introducing new fish to the lake's environment, and contribute to the protection of wildlife by educating the attendees to the proper use of fishing equipment, methods of angling and the importance of conservation.
