### **CONFLICT OF INTEREST AND DISCLOSURE CODES (ALL DISTRICTS) (3-VOTES)**

#### **SUBJECT**

Approval of Conflict of Interest and Disclosure Codes.

#### **IT IS RECOMMENDED THAT THE BOARD:**

Approve the Conflict of Interest and Disclosure Codes for the Burbank-Glendale-Pasadena Airport Authority; Charter Oak Unified School District; Department of Mental Health; Foothill Transit; Glendale Unified School District; Internal Services Department; Los Angeles County Children and Families First-Proposition 10 Commission (AKA First 5-LA); Mountain View School District; and recognize the dissolution of the Los Angeles County Workforce Investment Board effective June 30, 2015, and abolishment of their conflict of interest code to be effective the day following your Board's approval.

#### **PURPOSE/JUSTIFICATION OF RECOMMENDED ACTION**

In accordance with the Political Reform Act of 1974, the Board of Supervisors is the code reviewing body for Los Angeles County.

Pursuant to Government Code Section 87300, every local government agency must adopt and promulgate a Conflict of Interest and Disclosure Code. The Board of Supervisors must approve the code before it can take effect.

Pursuant to Government Code Section 87306, agencies are required to amend their Conflict of Interest Codes when necessitated by changed circumstances.

### **Implementation of Strategic Plan Goals**

Approval of the attached codes broadly supports the County Strategic Goal of Operational Effectiveness/Fiscal Sustainability.

The proposed Conflict of Interest and Disclosure Codes have been thoroughly reviewed and approved by the code review staff in accordance with the procedures established by your Board.

### **FISCAL IMPACT/FINANCING**

Local governmental agencies must have a Conflict of Interest and Disclosure Code in which individuals in designated positions are required to disclose financial interests at a level appropriate to their decision-making authority.

Adoption of a Conflict of Interest and Disclosure Code deters potential conflicts of interest, thereby averting misuse of public funds.

The recommended action has no effect on budget revenues and expenditures.

### **FACTS AND PROVISIONS/LEGAL REQUIREMENTS**

Pursuant to Government Code Section 87300, the code review staff recommends that your Board approve the Conflict of Interest and Disclosure Codes for the agencies listed below.

#### **SUBSTANTIVE CHANGES:**

(Burbank-Glendale-Pasadena Airport Authority)

- Adds a new disclosure category and renumbers an existing category.
- Exhibit "B" is modified with the deletion of the section "Public Officials Who Manage Public Investments under Government Code 87200, et seq." The positions under this heading were converted to "Designated Position" filers within Exhibit "B", with the appropriate disclosure category.
- Exhibit "B" is modified with a clarifying footnote for Consultants and New Positions.
- Deletes Deputy Executive Director, Facilities and Planning; Director of Information and Communications Technologies; and Director of Operations and Maintenance due to reorganization.
- Changes the titles of three (3) positions.
- Expands the disclosure for four (4) positions.
- Reduces the disclosure for three (3) positions.
- Adds Director of Human Resources; Director of Operations; and Director, Information and Communication Technology to the code.

(Charter Oak Unified School District.)

### **CATEGORY 2**

### **CATEGORY 3**

Persons in this category shall disclose all business positions, income (including gifts, loans and travel payments) from and investments in businesses that utilize, lease, or rent airport facilities or properties.

### **CATEGORY 4**

Persons in this category shall disclose all income (including gifts, loans and travel payments) from any Burbank-Glendale-Pasadena Airport Authority employee, any representative or association of such employee; and business positions or income from an entity owned or controlled by such employees or his/her spouse or other financial dependent.

### **CATEGORY 5**

Individuals who perform under contract the duties of any designated position shall be required to file Statements of Economic Interests disclosing reportable interests in the categories assigned to that designated position.

In addition, individuals who, under contract, participate in decisions which affect financial interests by providing information, advice, recommendation or counsel to the agency which could affect financial interests shall be required to file Statements of Economic Interests, unless they fall within the Political Reform Act's exceptions to the definition of consultant. The level of disclosure shall be as determined by the Executive Director/Assistant Secretary or his or her designee of the agency. (See footnote for clarification.)

The Board Members' or designee's determination is a public record and shall be retained for public inspection in the same manner and location as this conflict-of-interest code. (Gov. Incorporation of FPPC Regulation 18730 (2 California Code of Regulations, Section 18730) by Reference

The Political Reform Act (Government Code Section 81000, *et seq.*) requires state and local government agencies to adopt and promulgate conflict of interest codes. The Fair Political Practices Commission has adopted a regulation (2 Cal. Code of Regs. 18730), which contains the terms of a standard conflict of interest code. After public notice and hearing, it may be amended by the Fair Political Practices Commission to conform to amendments in the Political Reform Act. Therefore, the terms of 2 California Code of Regulations Section 18730, and any amendments to it duly adopted by the Fair Political Practices Commission, are hereby incorporated into the conflict of interest code of this agency by reference. This regulation and the attached Appendices (or Exhibits) designating officials and employees and establishing economic disclosure categories shall constitute the conflict of interest code of this agency.

Place of Filing of Statements of Economic Interests

All officials and employees required to submit a statement of economic interests shall file their statements with the agency head; or his or her designee. The agency shall make and retain a copy of all statements filed by its Workforce Investment Board Members, and the Executive Director and forward the originals of such statements to the Executive Office of the Board of Supervisors of Los Angeles County.

The agency shall retain the originals of statements for all other Designated Positions named in the agency's conflict of interest code. All retained statements, original or copied, shall be available for public inspection and reproduction (Gov. Code Section 81008).

## EXHIBIT "A"

### CATEGORY 1

Persons in this category shall disclose investments, business positions in and income from:

- A. Business entities located in Los Angeles County whose primary activity is to train persons for employment with other entities.
- B. Employment agencies located in Los Angeles County.
- C. Any business entity that employs, or plans to employ persons who have received Workforce Investment Act (WIA) training for which the WIB was responsible where the total number of such persons employed by the business entity during any 12-month period exceeds 20% of the total work force of the entity.

### CATEGORY 2

Persons in this category shall disclose annual income, investment, or business positions with business entities that receive, or plan to receive, contracts from the WIB directly, or through any of its service providers, for the training or placement of persons under any Workforce Investment Act (WIA).

### CATEGORY 3

Persons in this category shall disclose interests in real property in the service delivery area which were acquired by, leased, or otherwise used by any agency receiving funds under the jurisdiction of the WIB.

### CATEGORY 4

Individuals who perform under contract the duties of any designated position shall be required to file Statements of Economic Interests disclosing reportable interests in the categories assigned to that designated position.

In addition, individuals who, under contract, participate in decisions which affect financial interests by providing information, advice, recommendation or counsel to the agency which could affect financial interests shall be required to file Statements of Economic Interests, unless they fall within the Political Reform Act's exceptions to the definition of consultant. The level of disclosure shall be as determined by the executive officer (or head) of the agency.
