



FAMILY ASSISTANCE PROGRAM (FAP)



WHAT IS FAMILY ASSISTANCE PROGRAM?

The FAP consists of trained Family Assistance Advocates (FAA) who receive and respond to incidents of (LASD) officer involved shootings, in custody death (community/hospital, jail settings). FAAs support families, friends and witnesses impacted by such incidents and provide mental health services, socials services and burial expenses.




WHAT DO FAMILY ASSISTANCE ADVOCATES DO?

- 1. Notify families of the death of a loved one, along with law enforcement or coroners, utilizing a trauma informed approach
 - Maintain communication with families and ensure that they receive as much information as possible, without impeding investigations, with an emphasis on maximizing transparency
 - Ensure that burial contributions are available to families and that they are disbursed without administrative barriers, with an emphasis on avoiding additional trauma
 - Identify mental health needs of affected families and link affected individuals with mental health and other supportive services e.g. faith based services and other social services as needed

Provide Psychological First Aid, Trauma Informed Care, and Case Consultation to families, and decrease severity of risk factors
