




2022 4th Quarter Active Supervision (AS)





Percentage of Eligible youth Enrolled in School







Average time to complete Pre-Plea report is predicated on case complexity and ranges from 5 to 7 days.





JSSB – Average Caseload Size







DJJ/SYTF Transition Supervision Demographics






Suitable Placement STRTP Population Exits Runaways, Detentions and Successful Completions

DSB Youth on Staff Assaults PER100









Total Release vs. Early Release 2022 Q3 - Q4











Youth Outcome Questionnaire (YOQ) Percentage of RTSB & DSB Youth Considered Clinical on Entry by Quarter




Youth Outcome Questionnaire (YOQ) Percentage of Youth Considered Clinical on Entry by Quarter and Bureau


