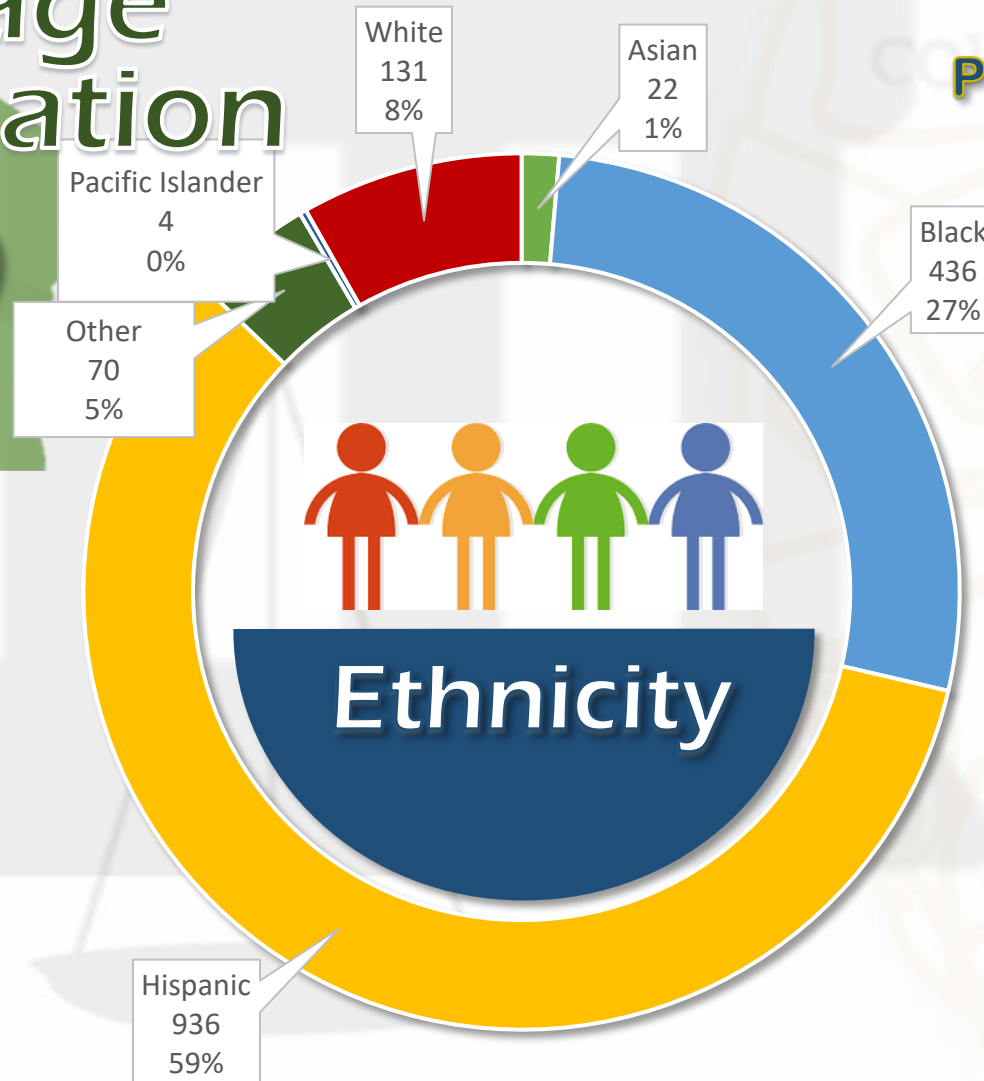

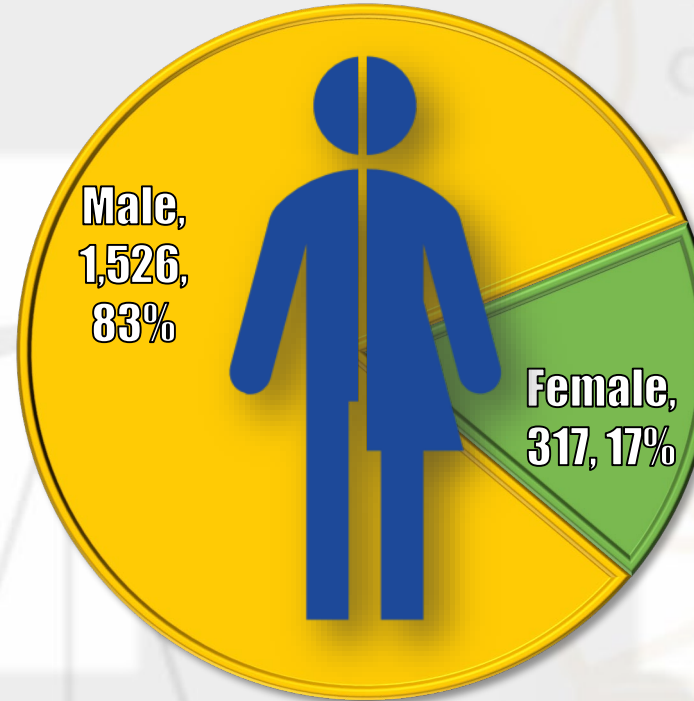

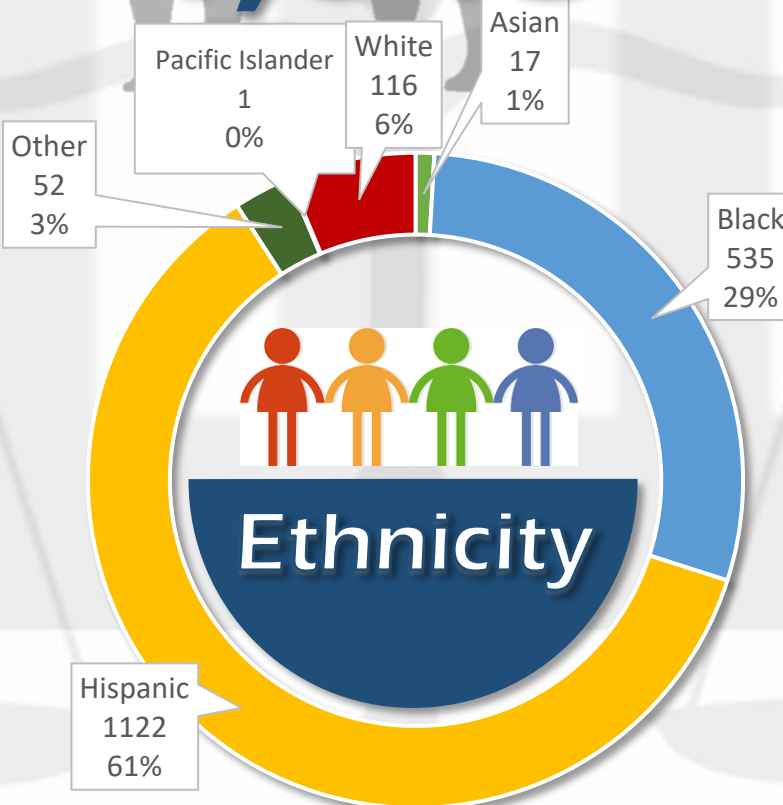

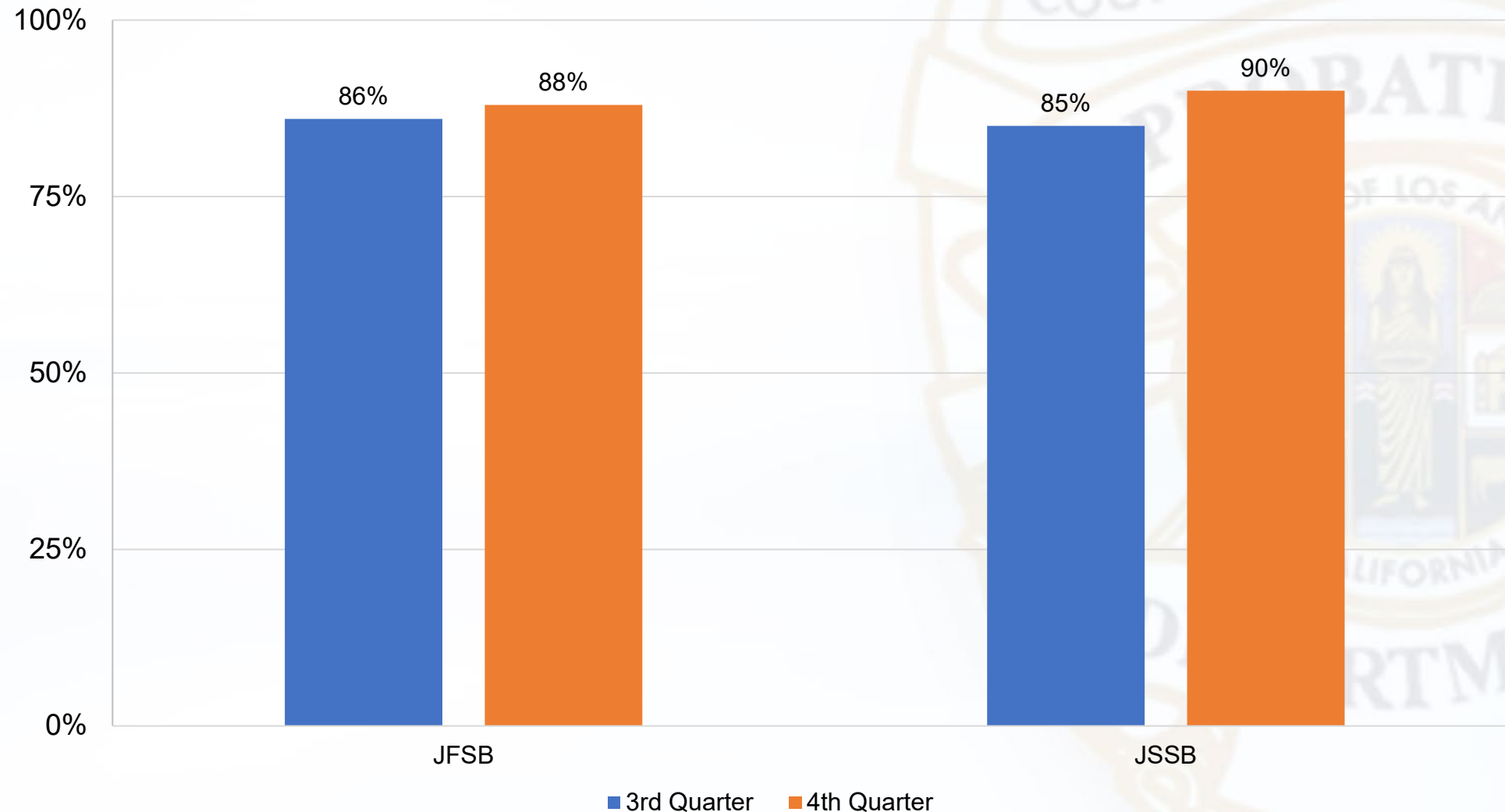

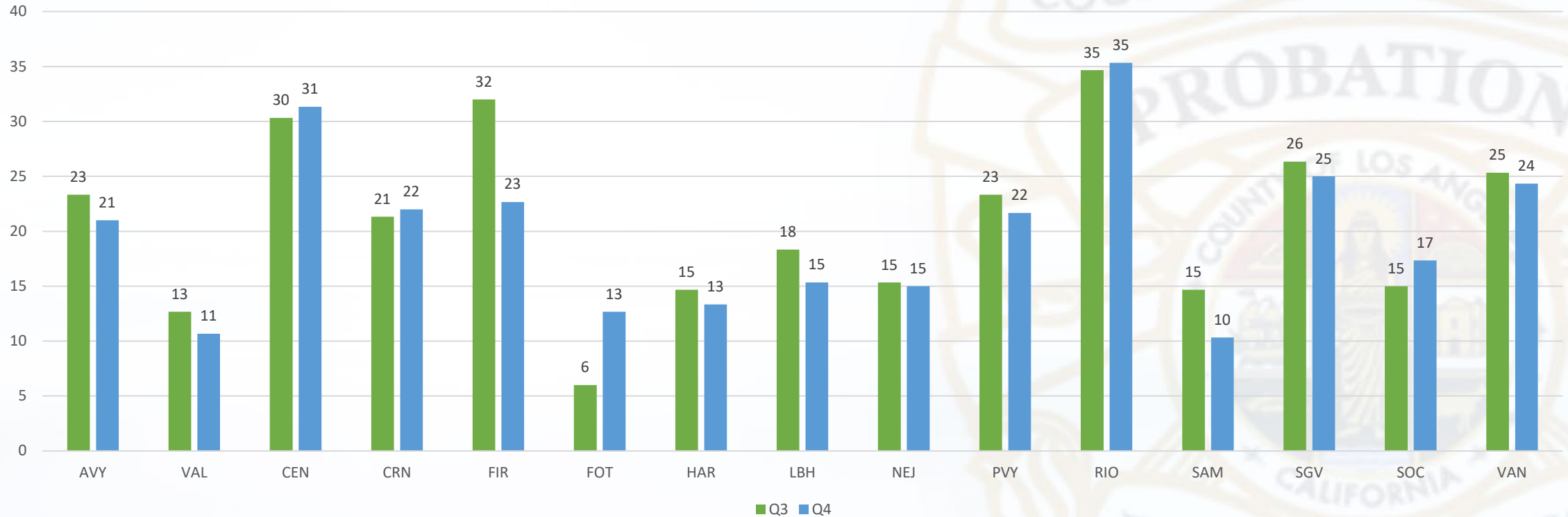

Q4: 57 % of all Juvenile Investigation Reports are Pre-Plea, Supplemental Pre-Plea and Dispo Reports

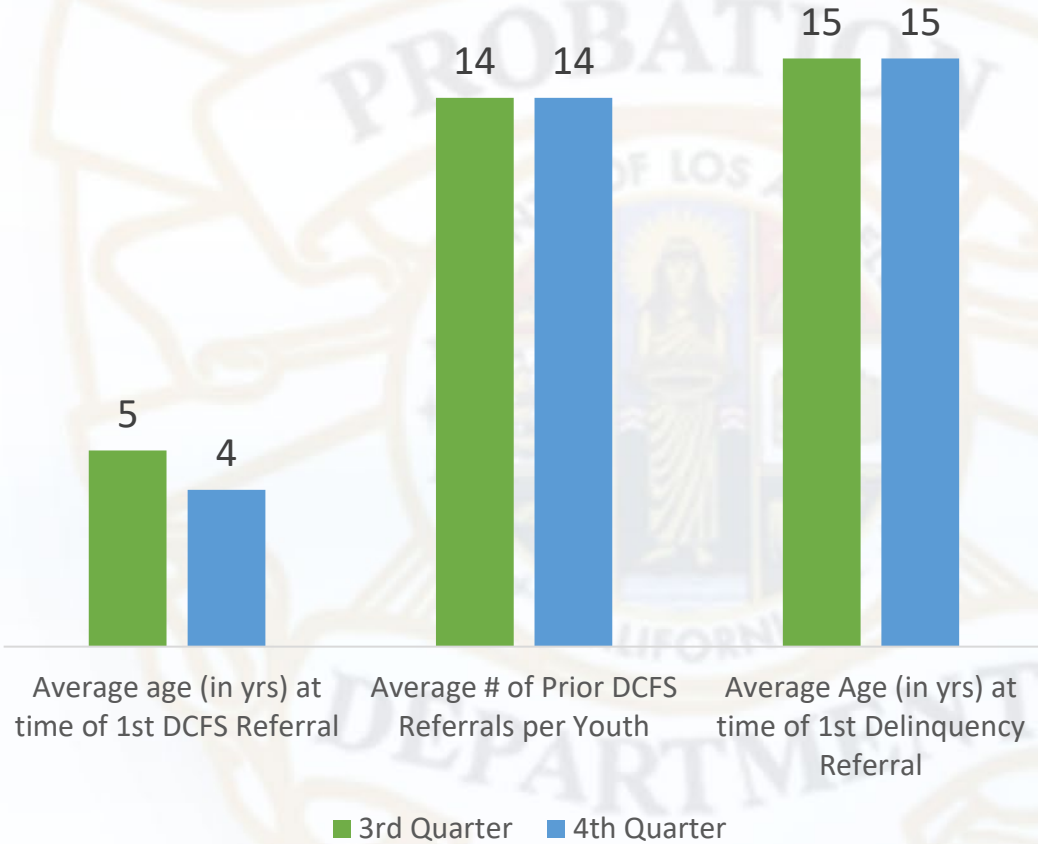
Average time to complete Pre-Plea report is predicated on case complexity and ranges from 5 to 7 days.

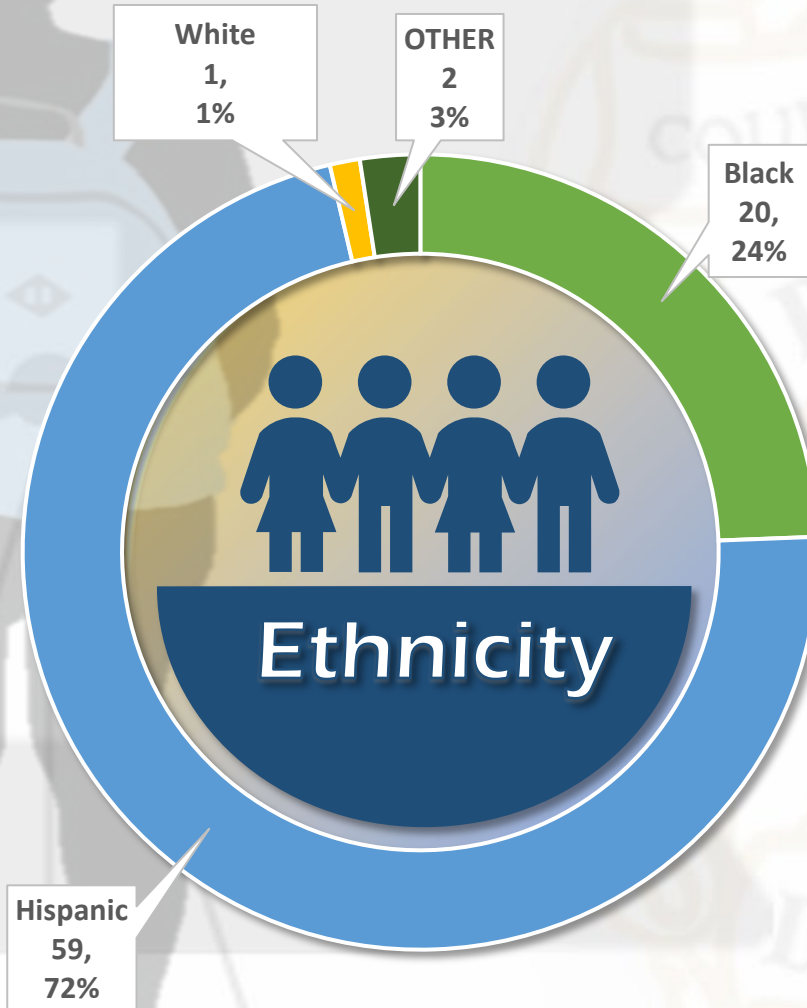

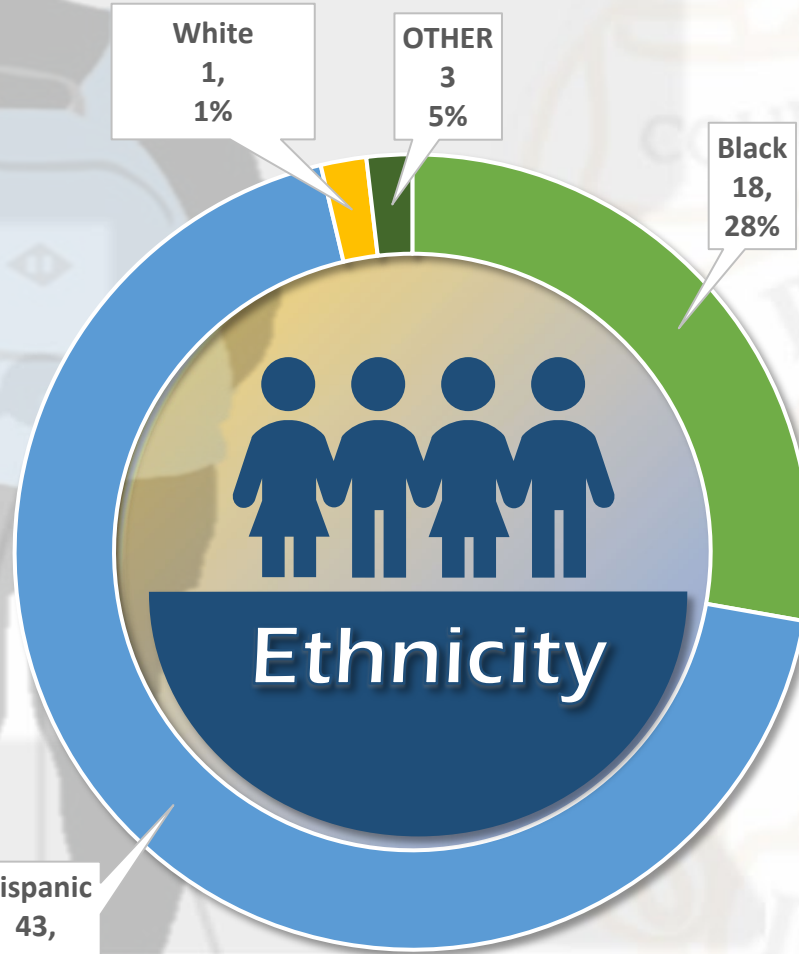

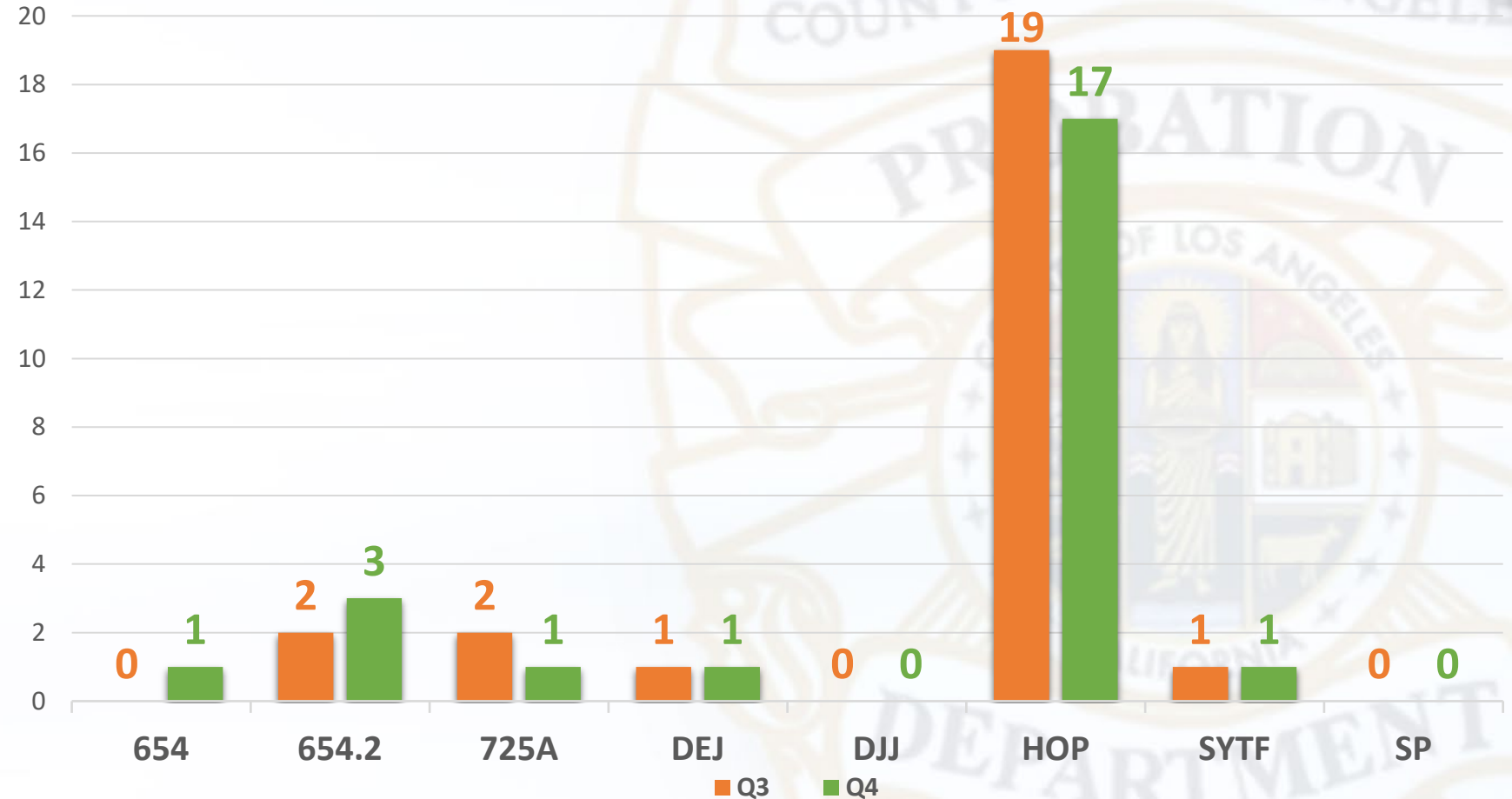

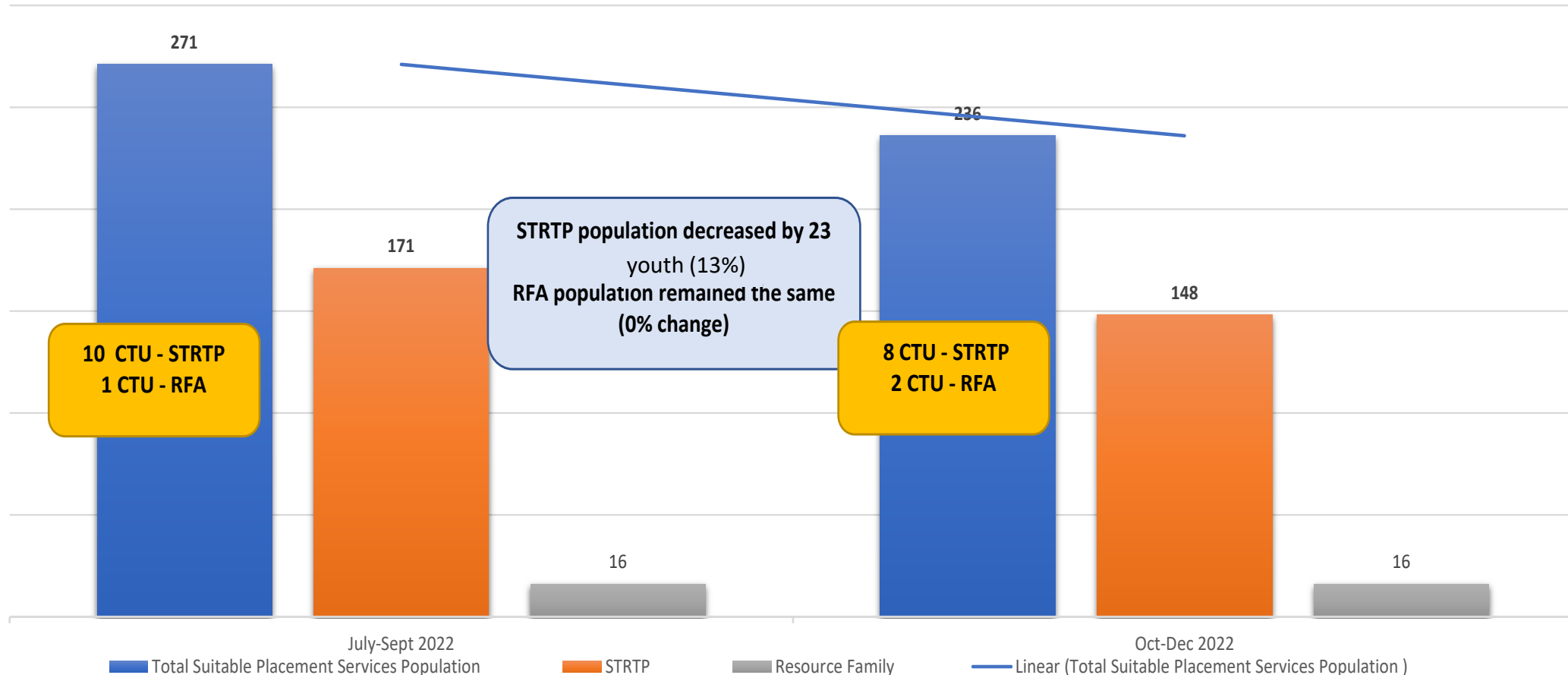

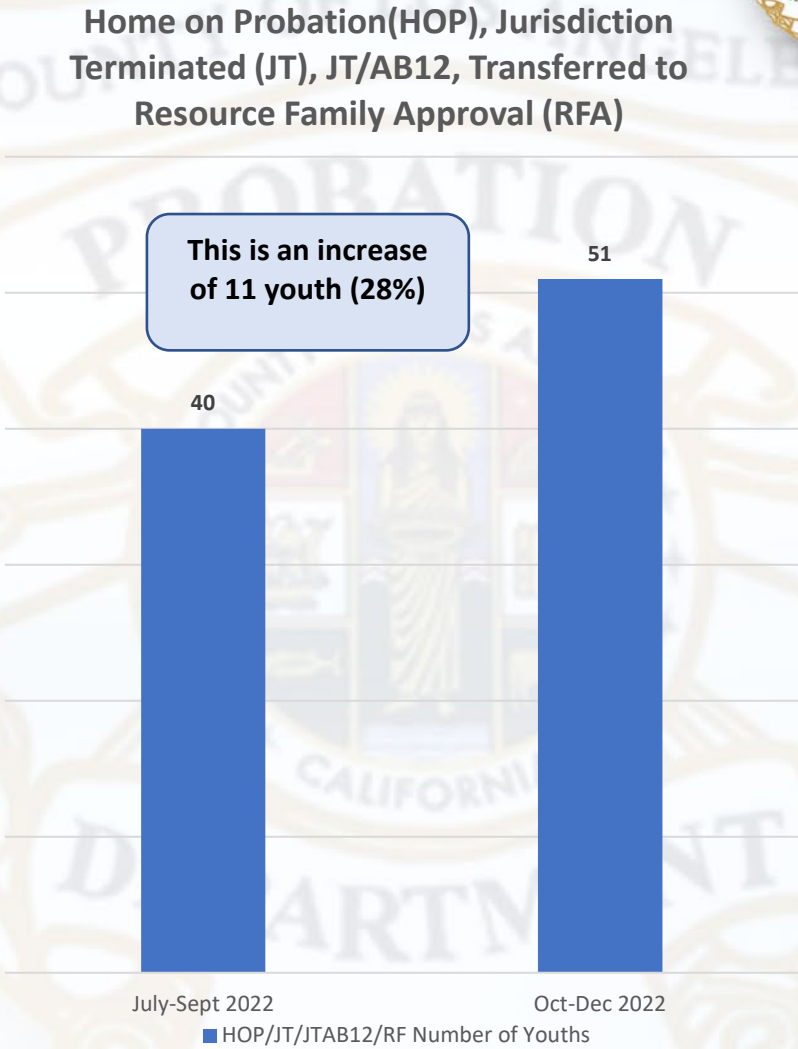
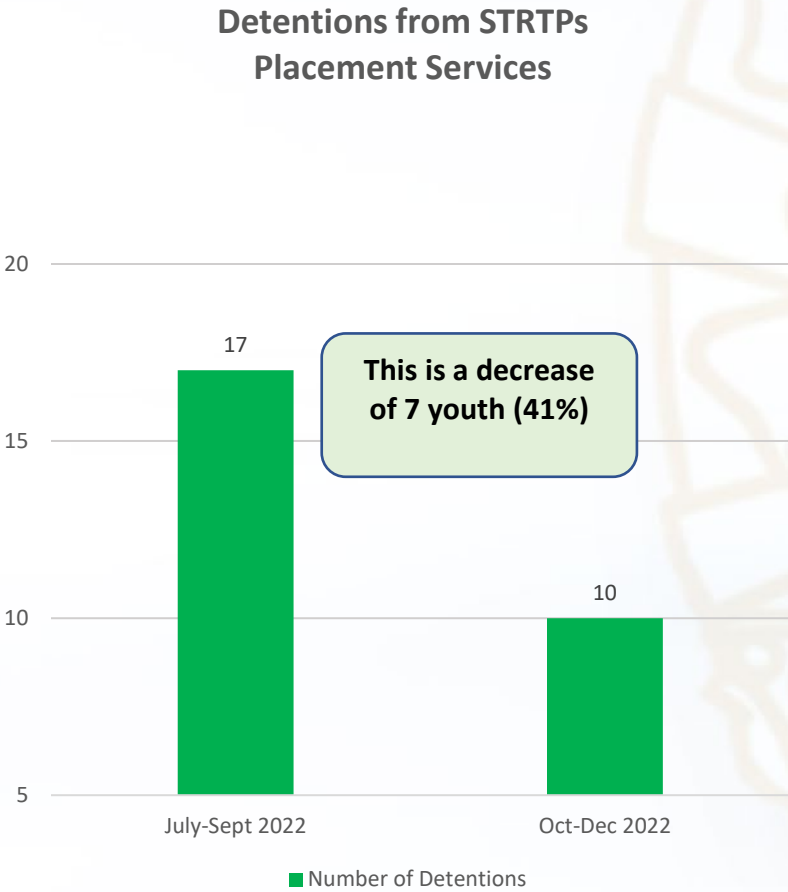
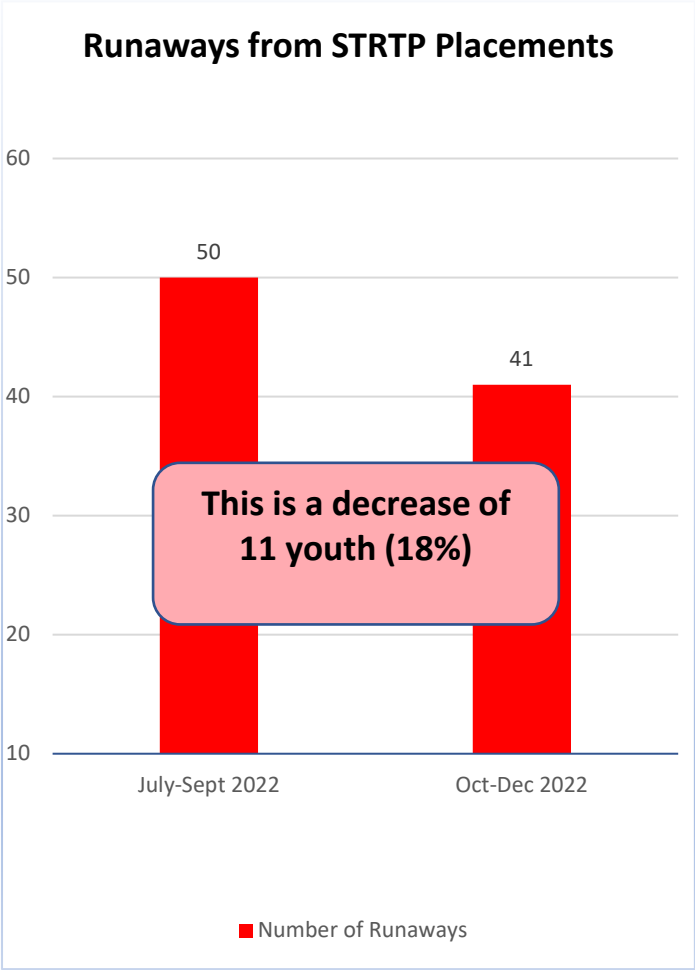
Population Data Per Unique Youth for Each Quarter

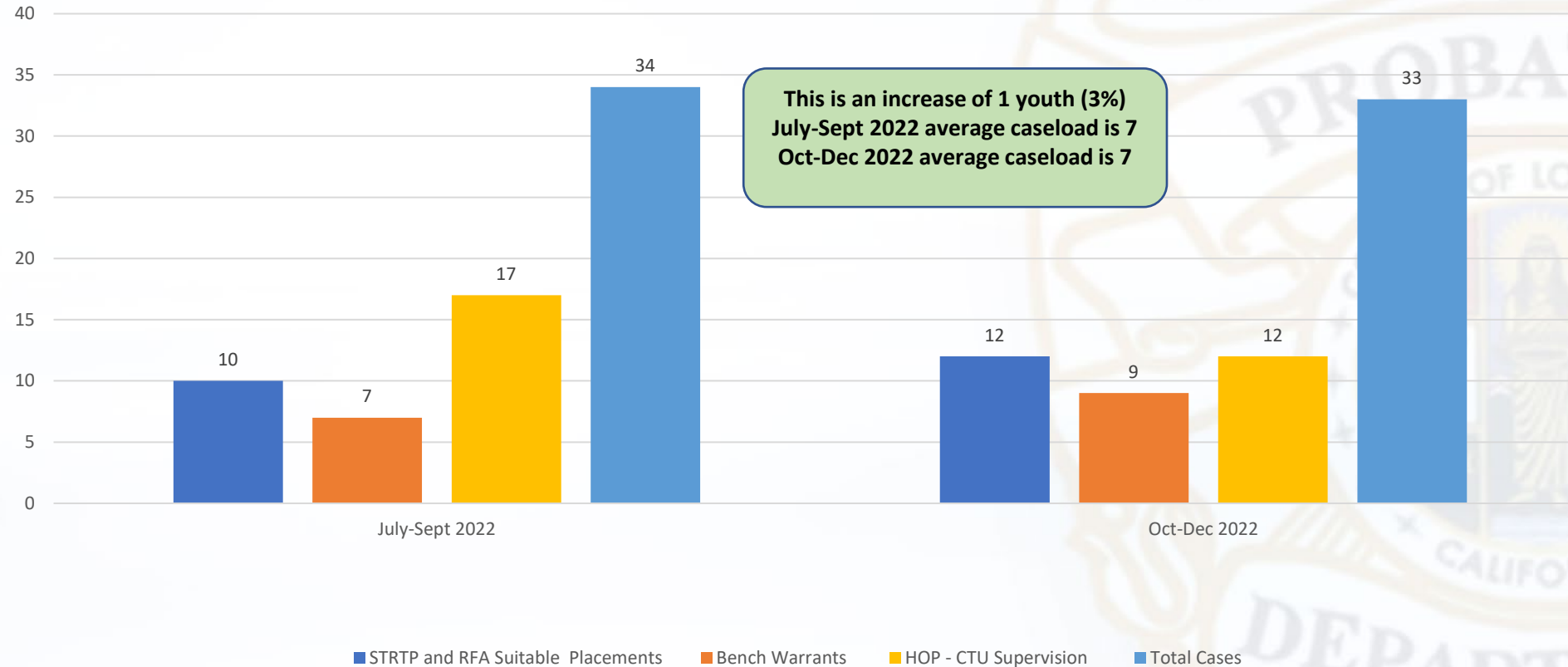

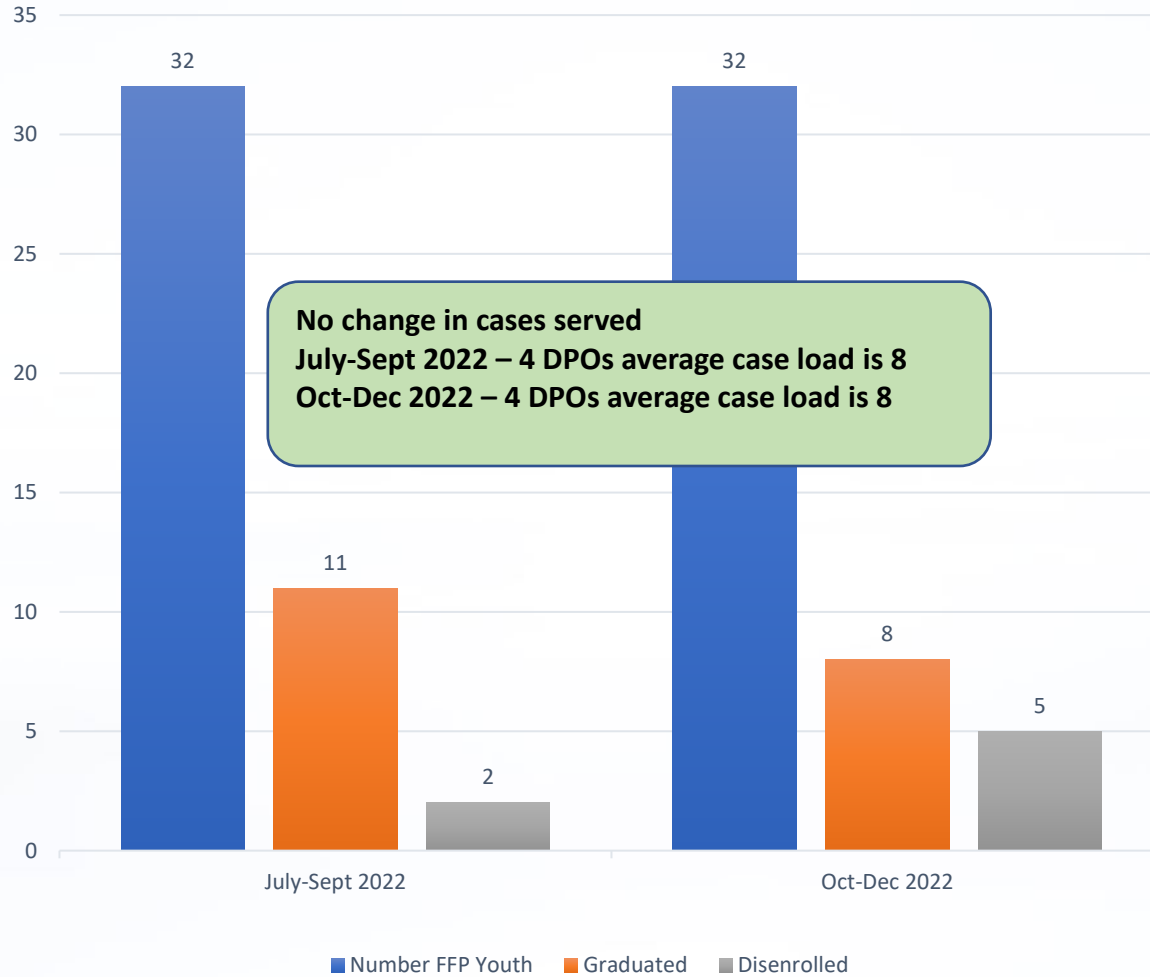

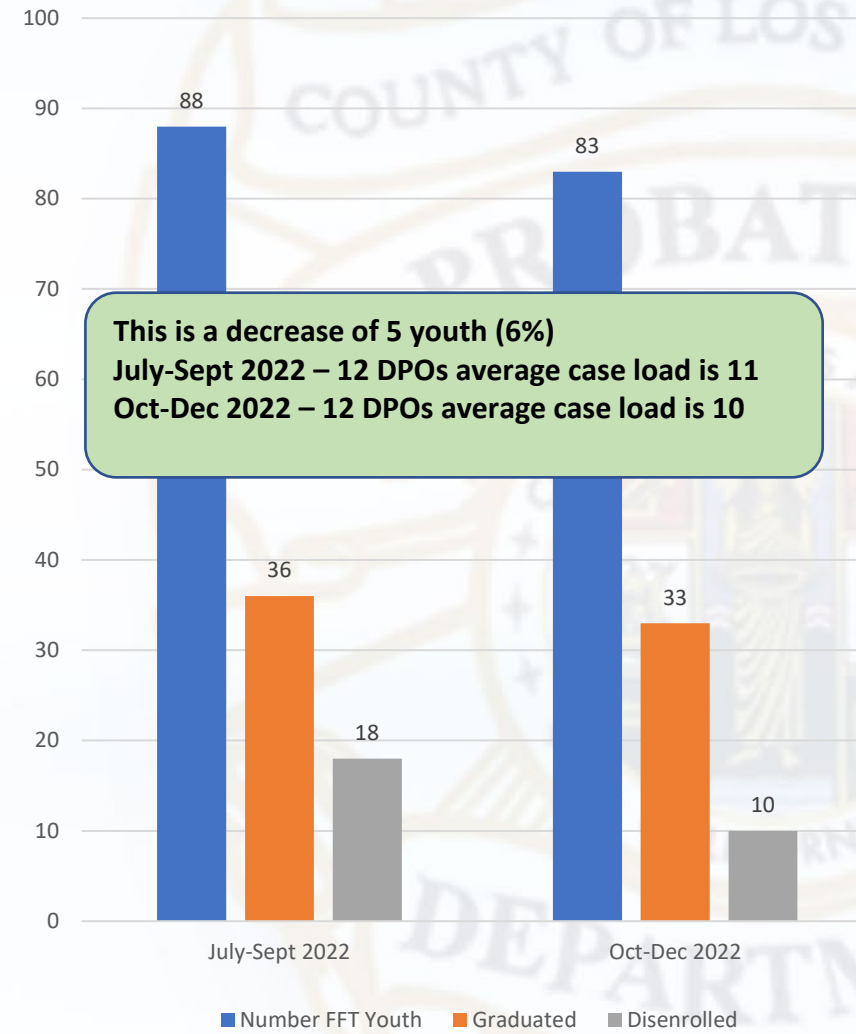

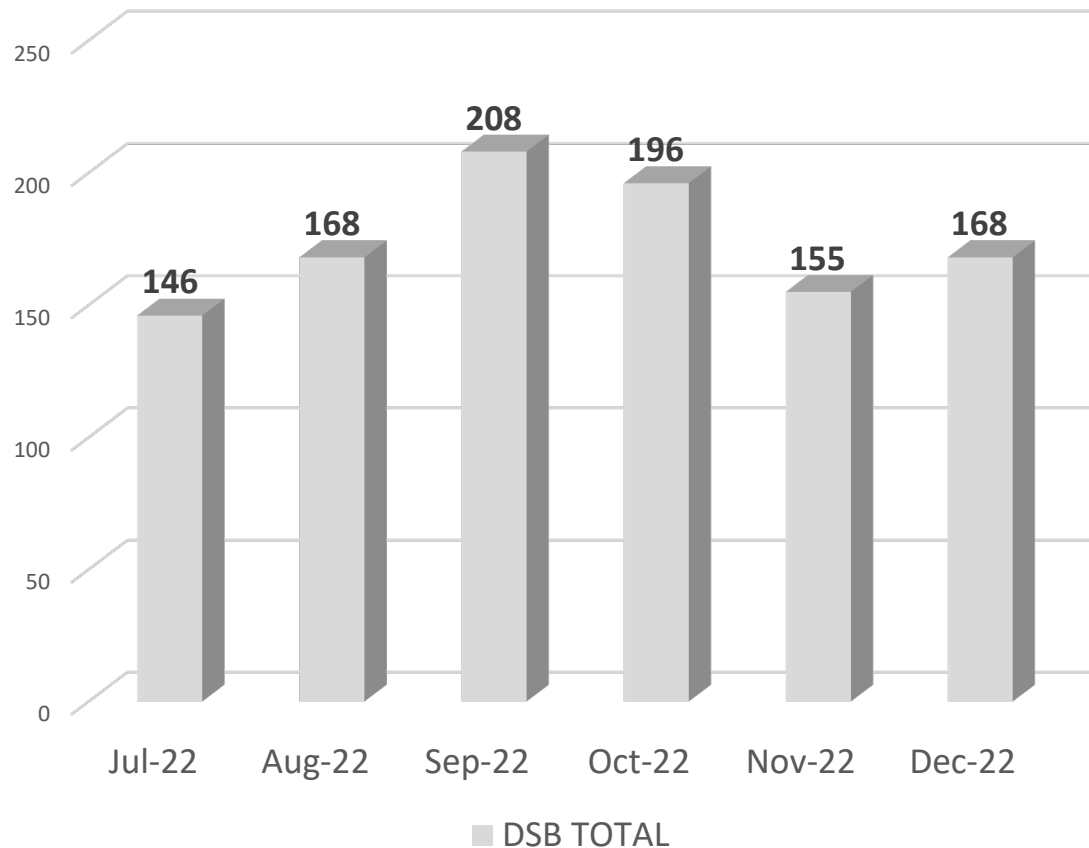

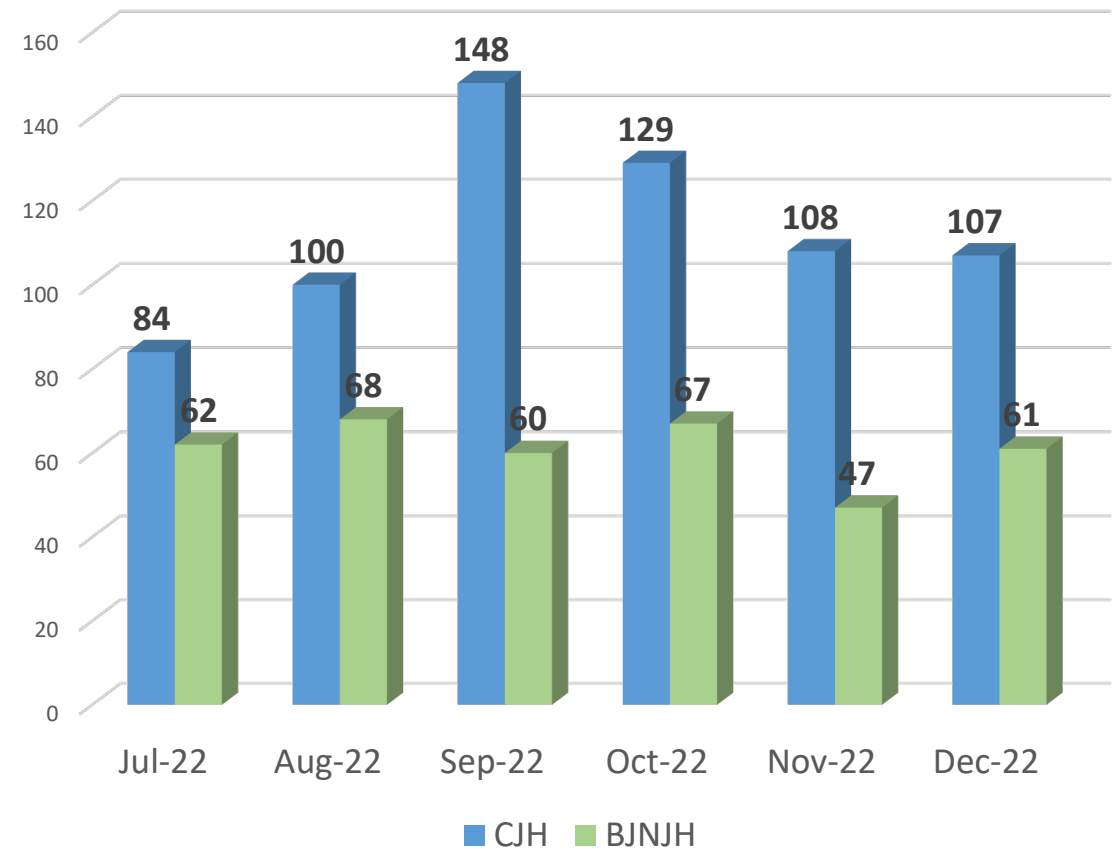

Youth on Staff Assaults PER100 by Hall

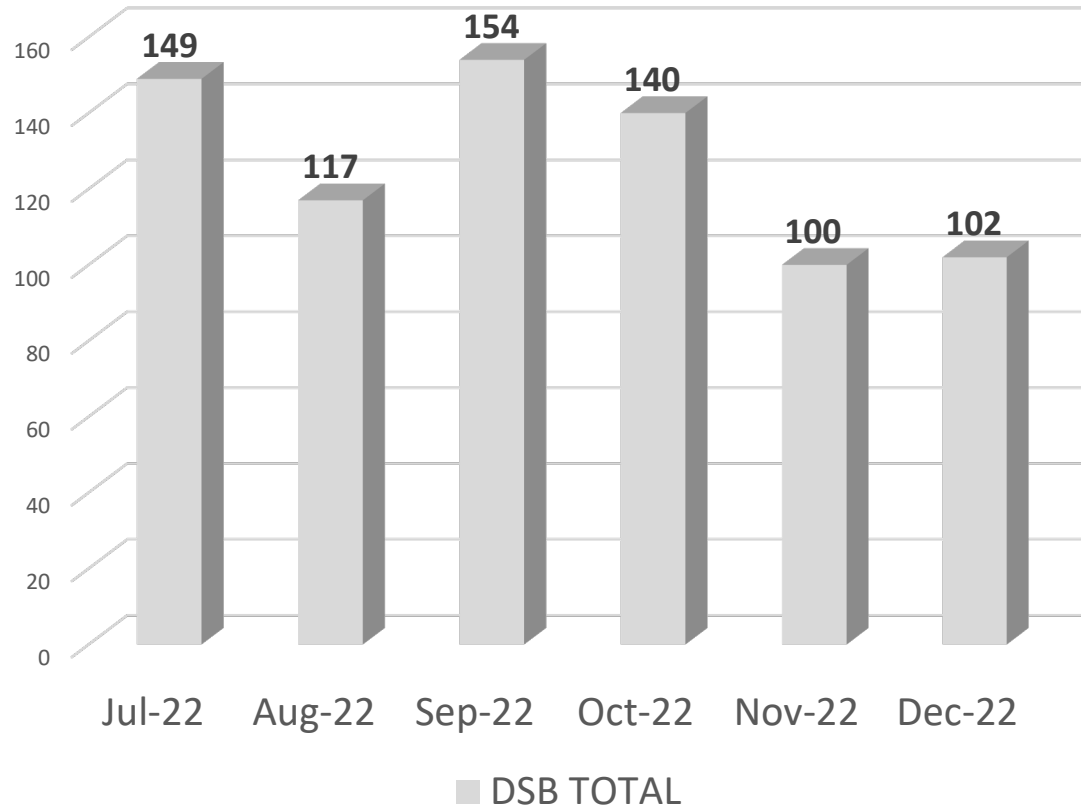

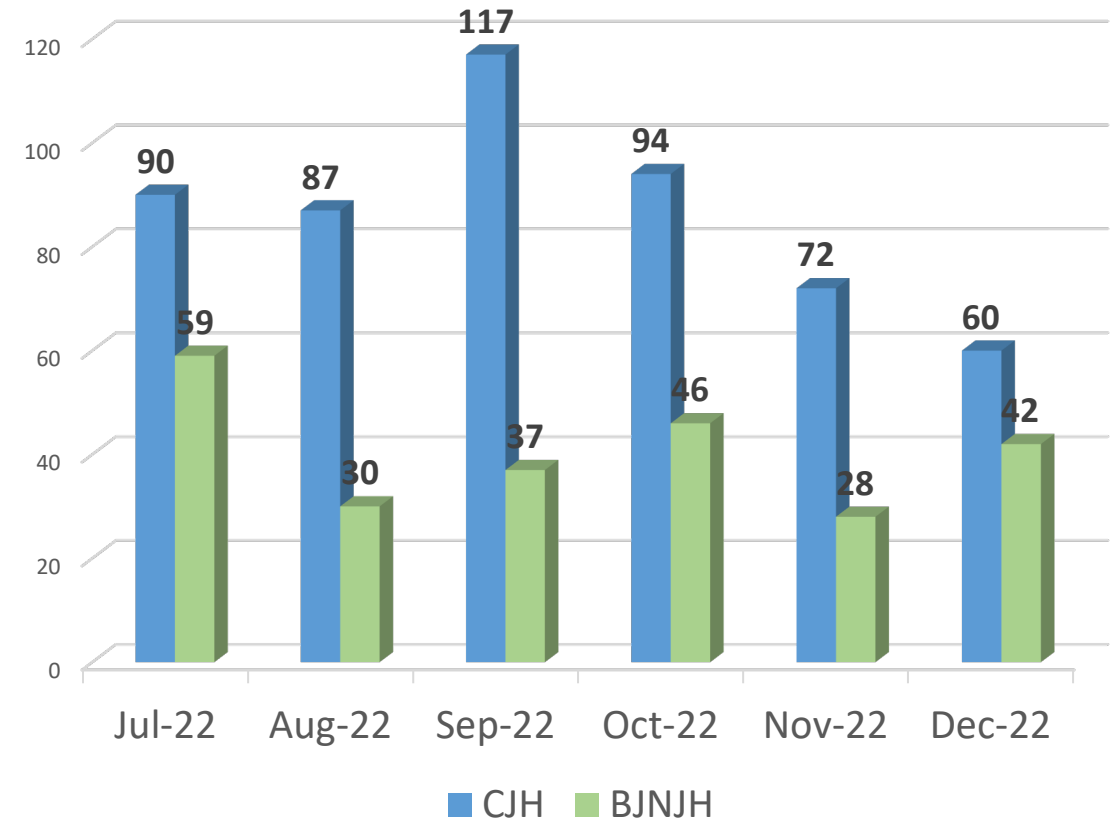

Safe Crisis Management for Each Hall

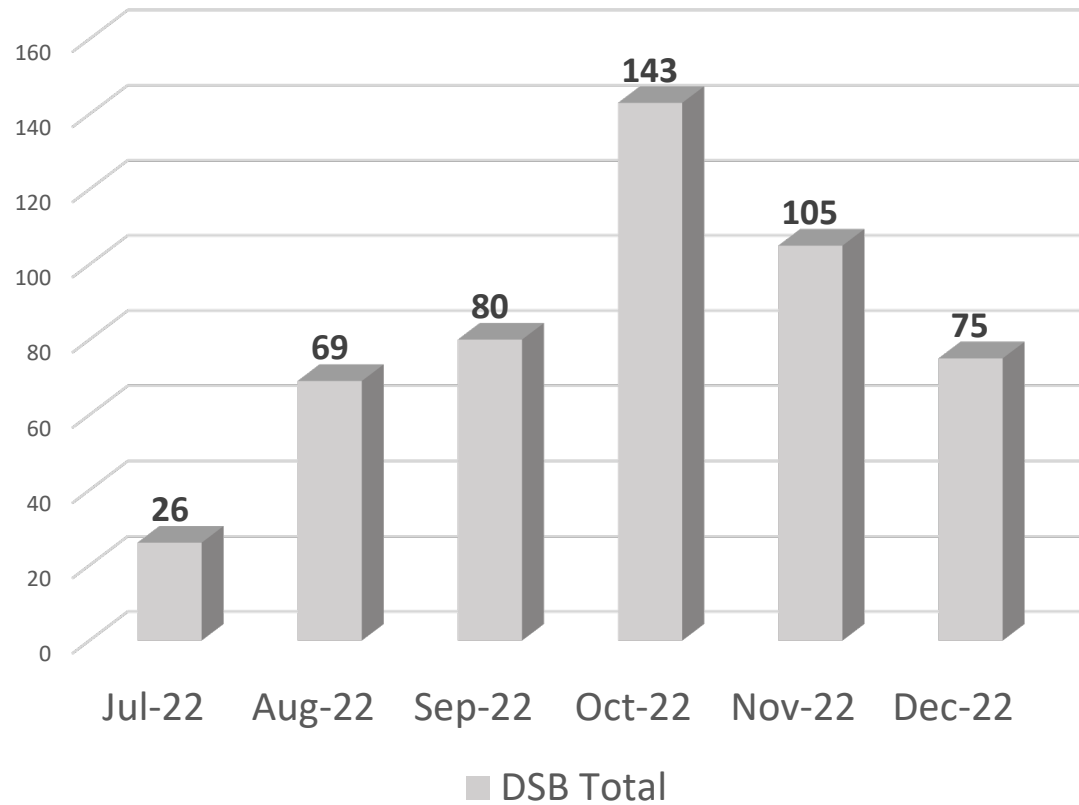

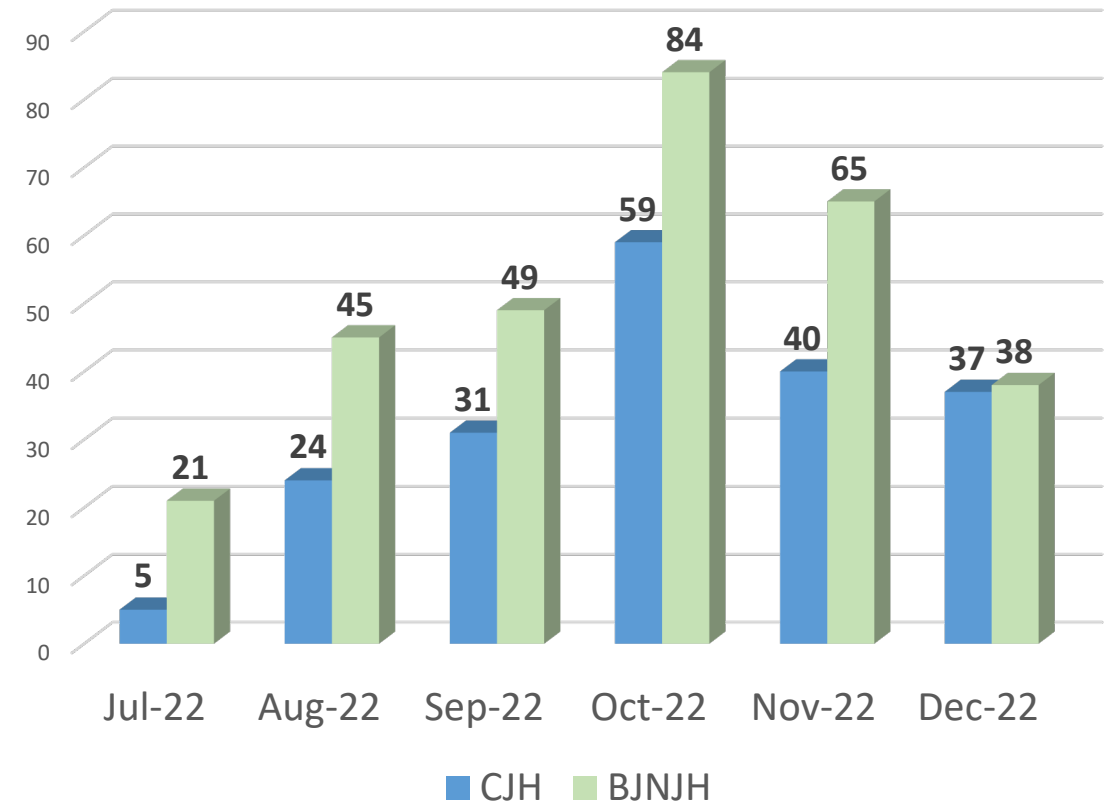

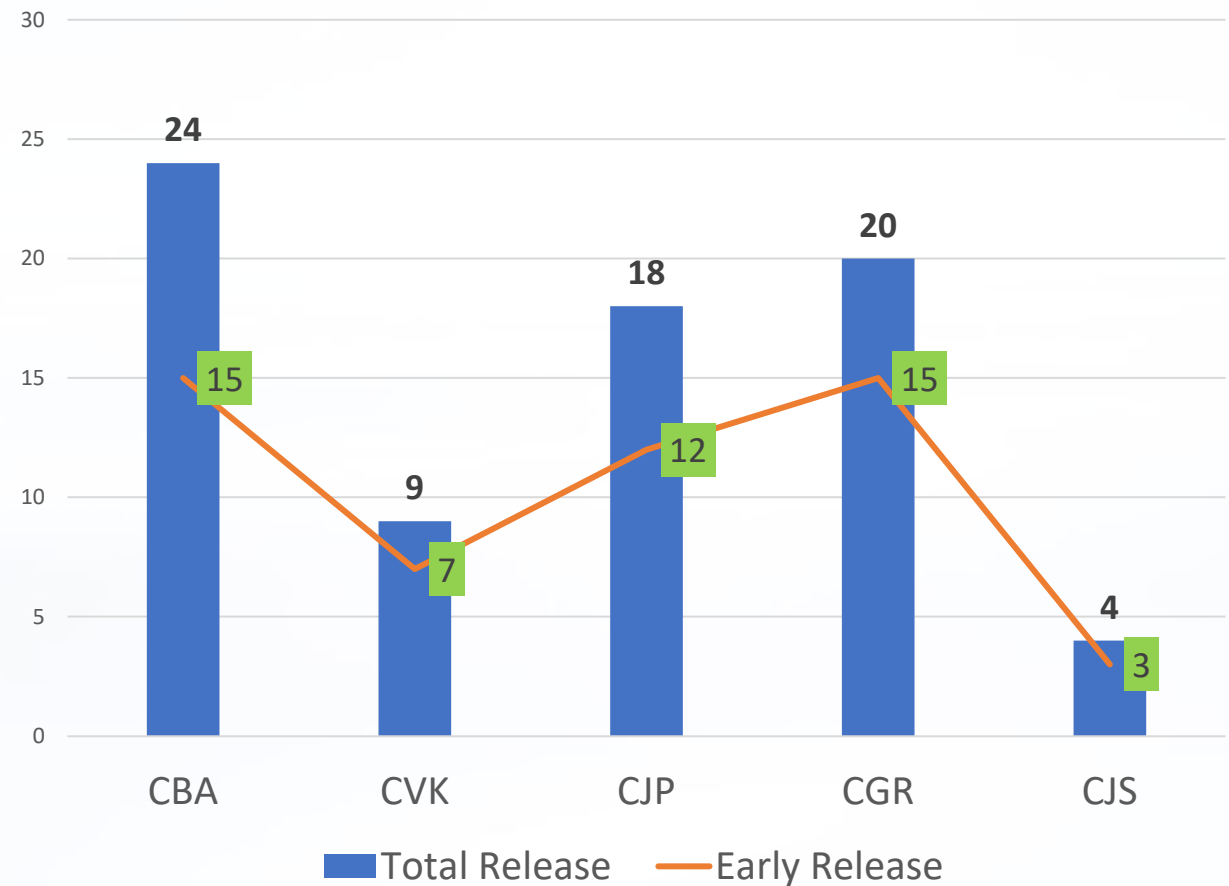

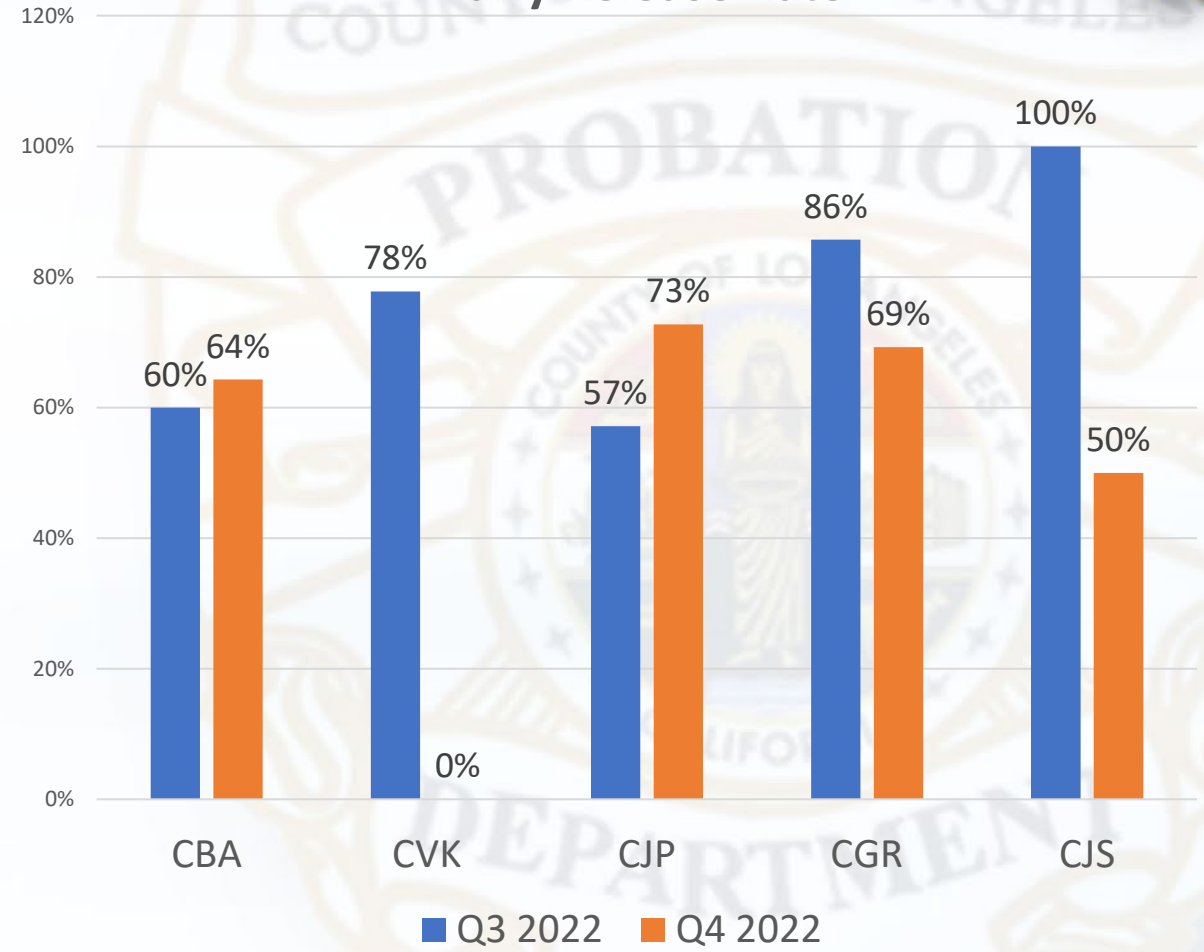

Early Release Rate



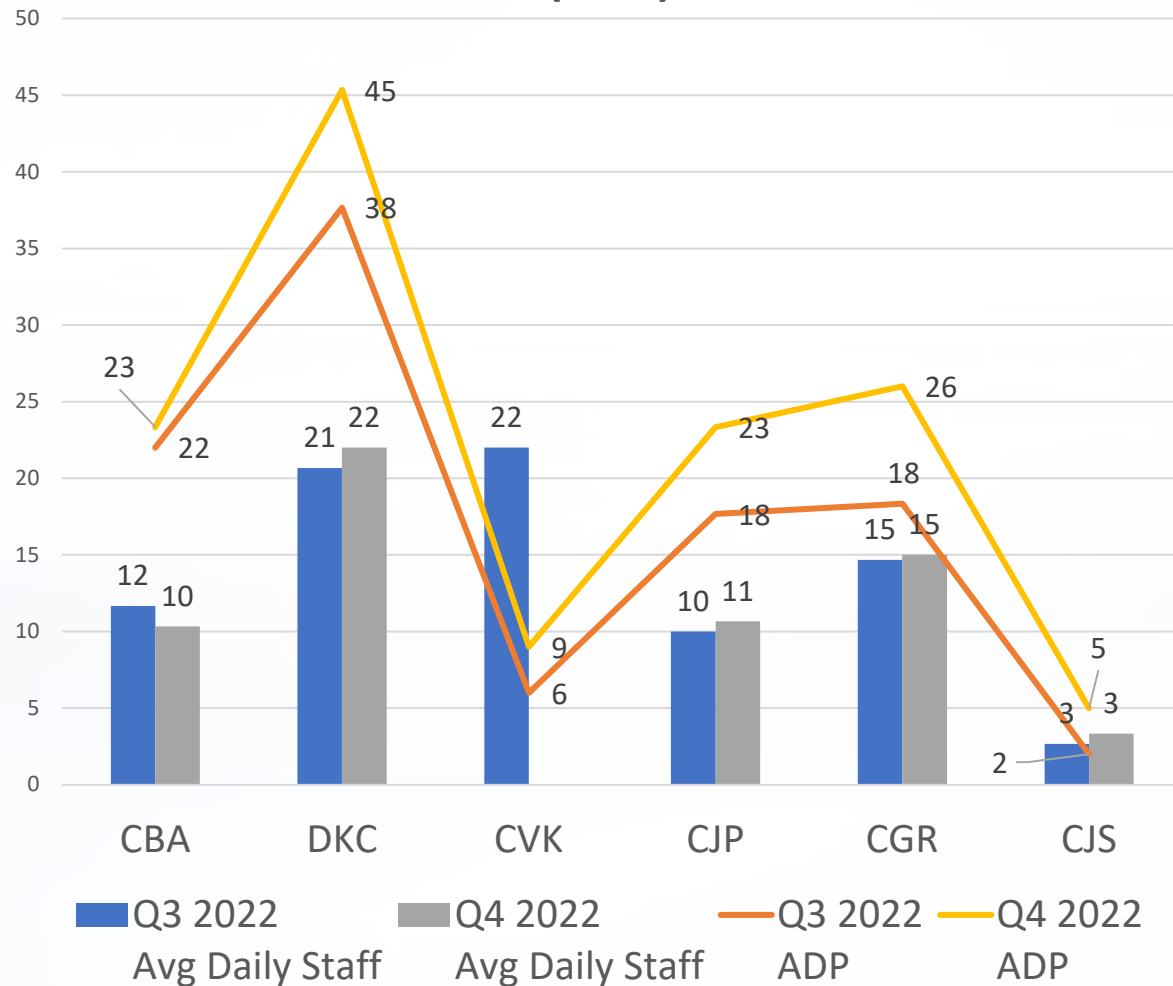

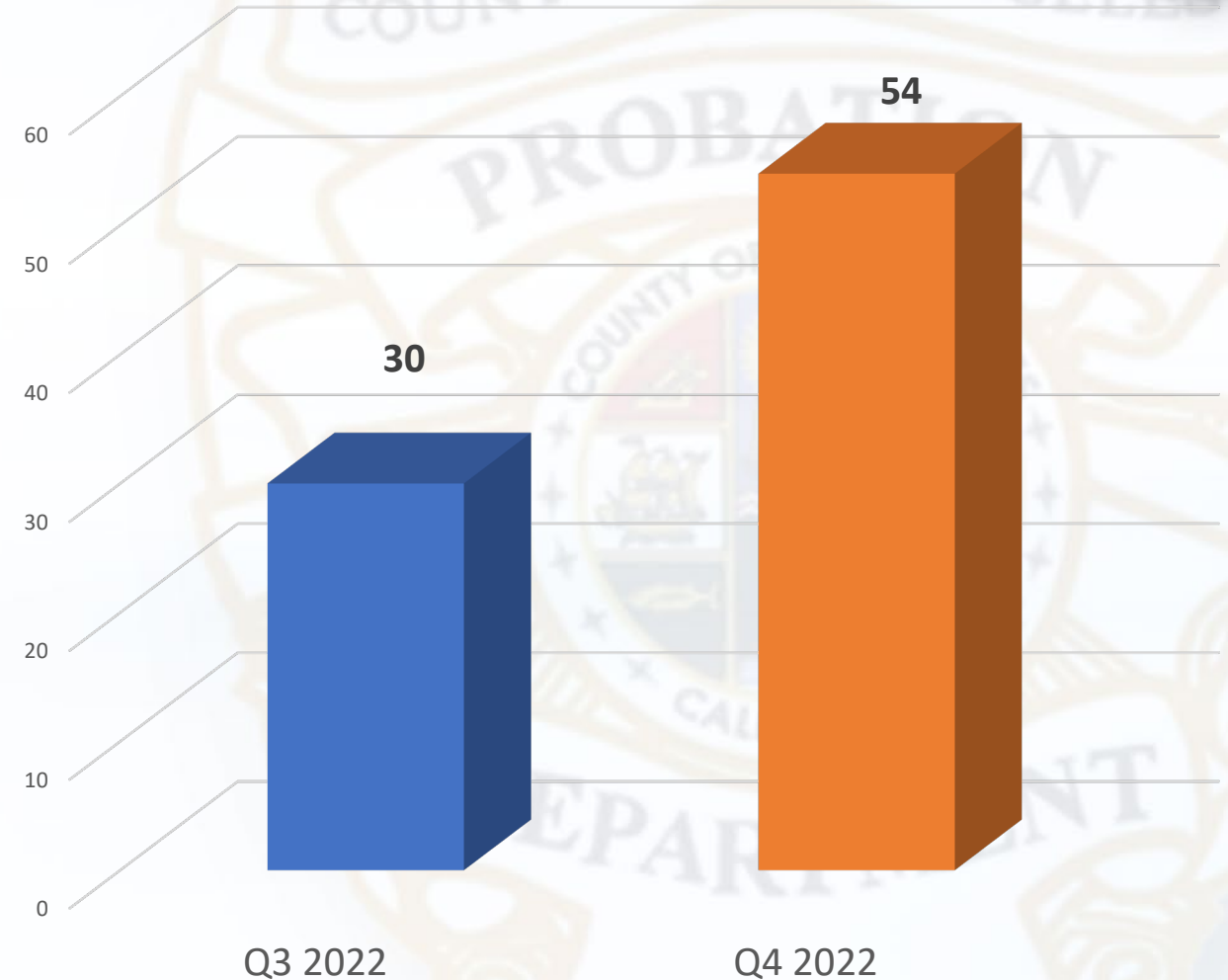

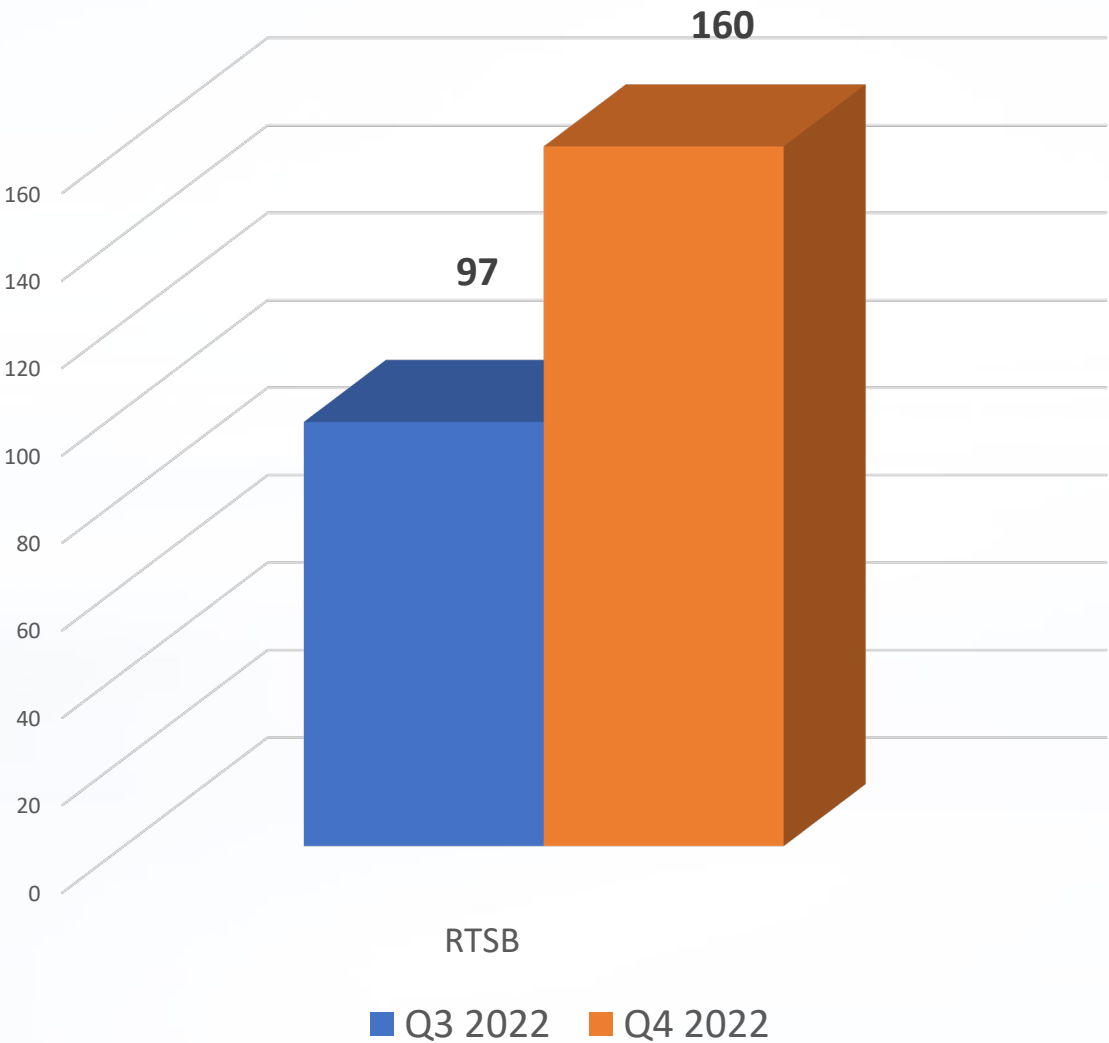

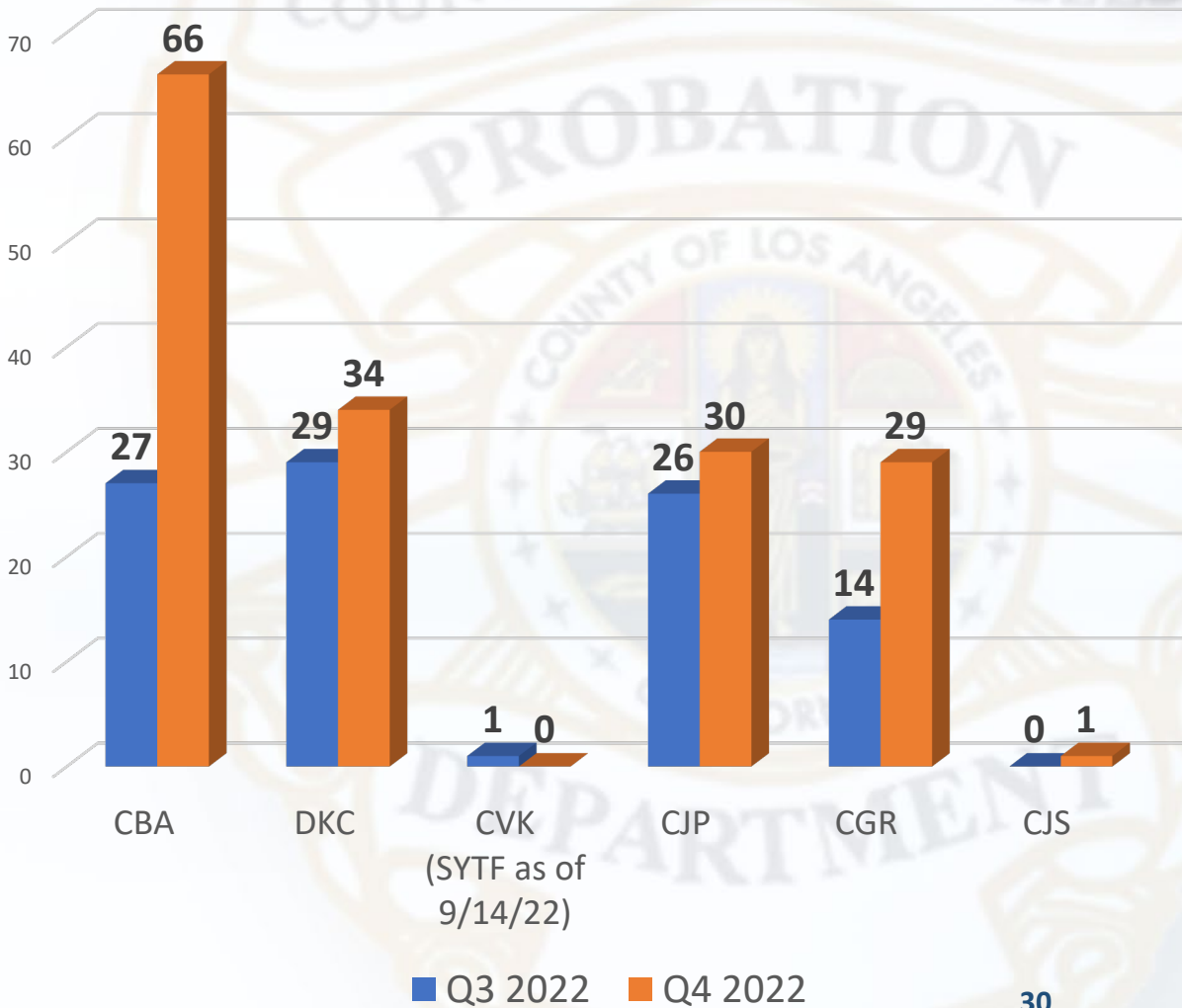

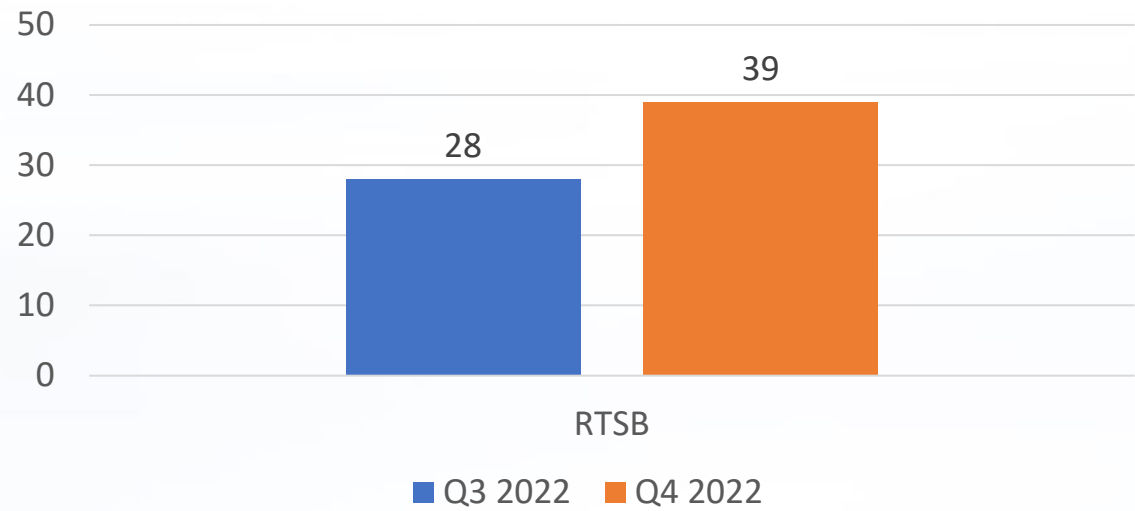

Direct	Intentionally struck by the youth

Incidental	Unintentionally struck or injured by youth during a restraint or a fight
	Youth pushed past the staff attempting to block their path

Assault or battery on a Peace Officer (Section 241(B) and 243(B) and (C) of the California Penal Code) can result in 12-months of confinement time. Also, if the Peace Officer is injured, the offender may be confined for up to 3 years and possibly referred to the Department of Juvenile Justice.

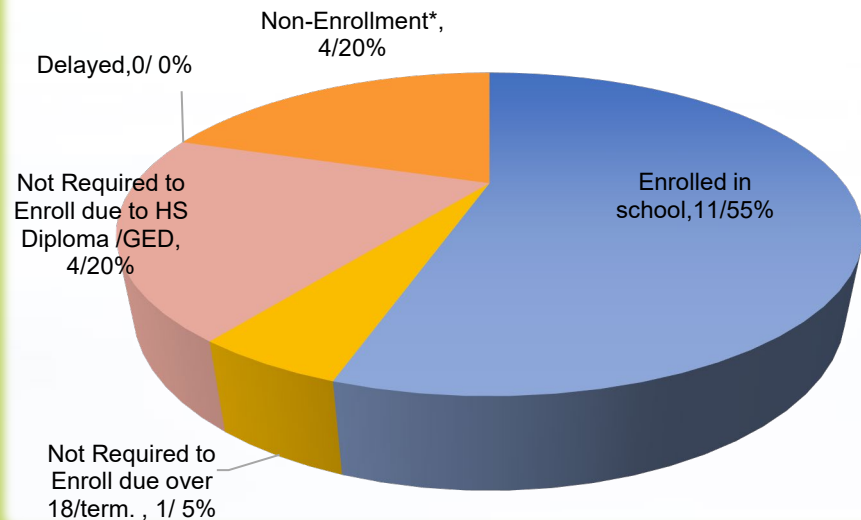

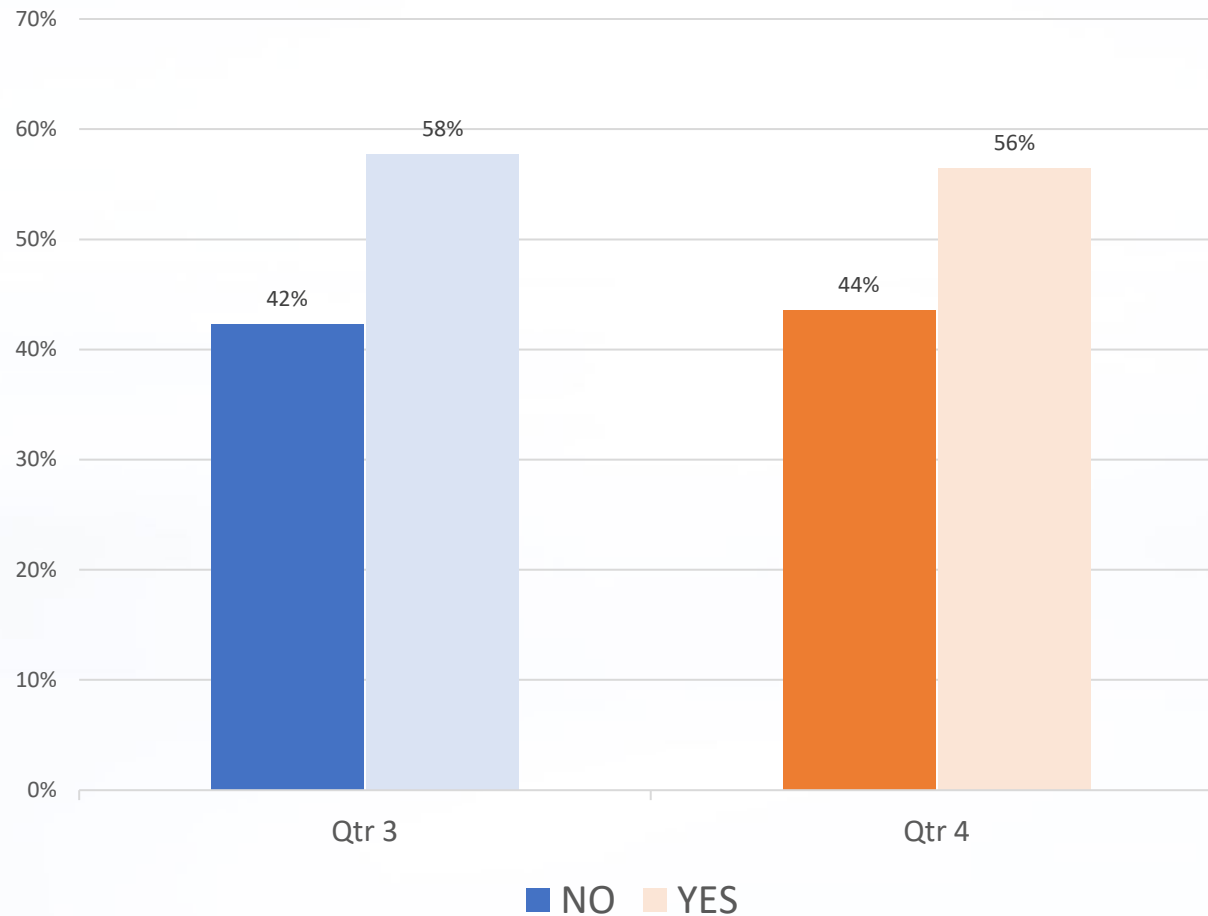

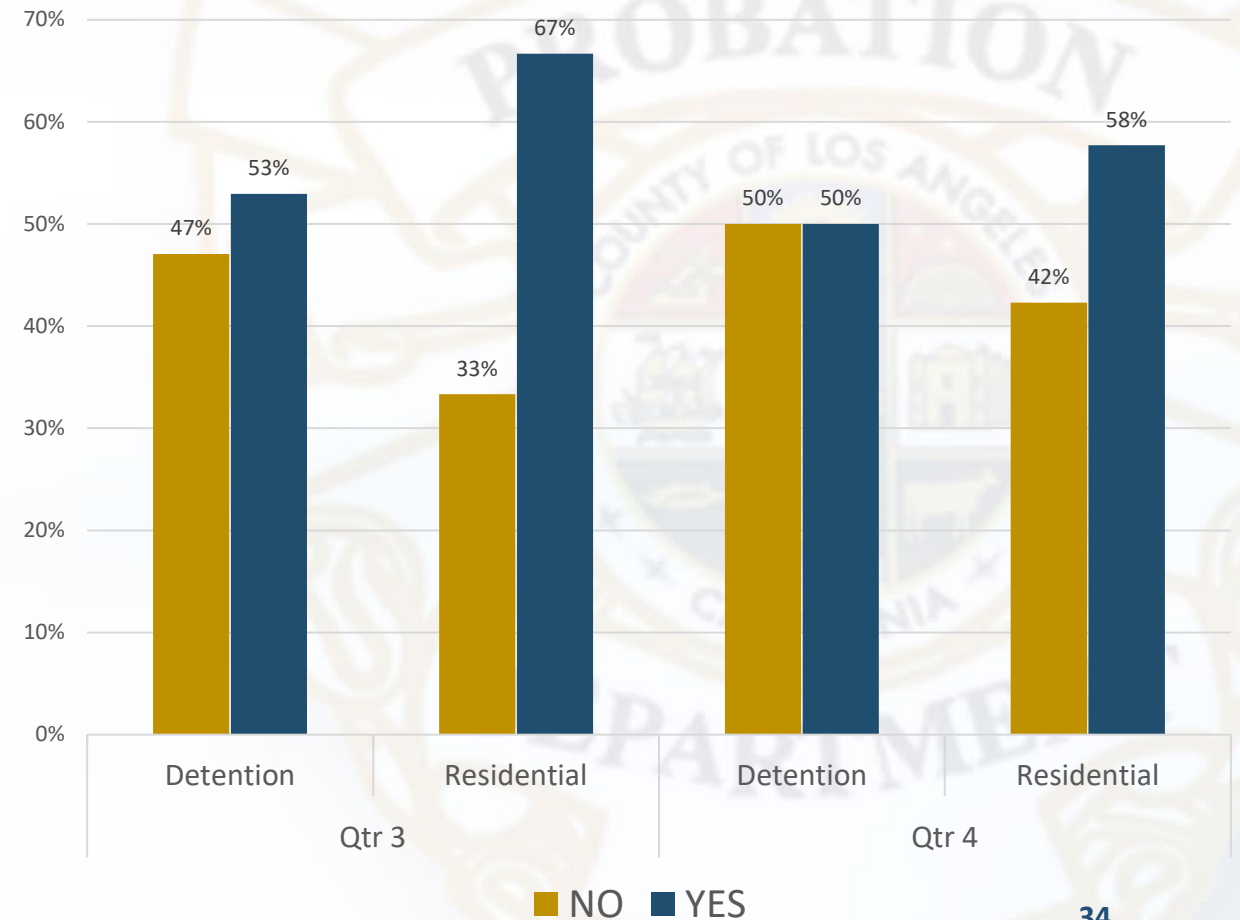

Percentage of Youth Considered Clinical on Entry by Quarter and Bureau

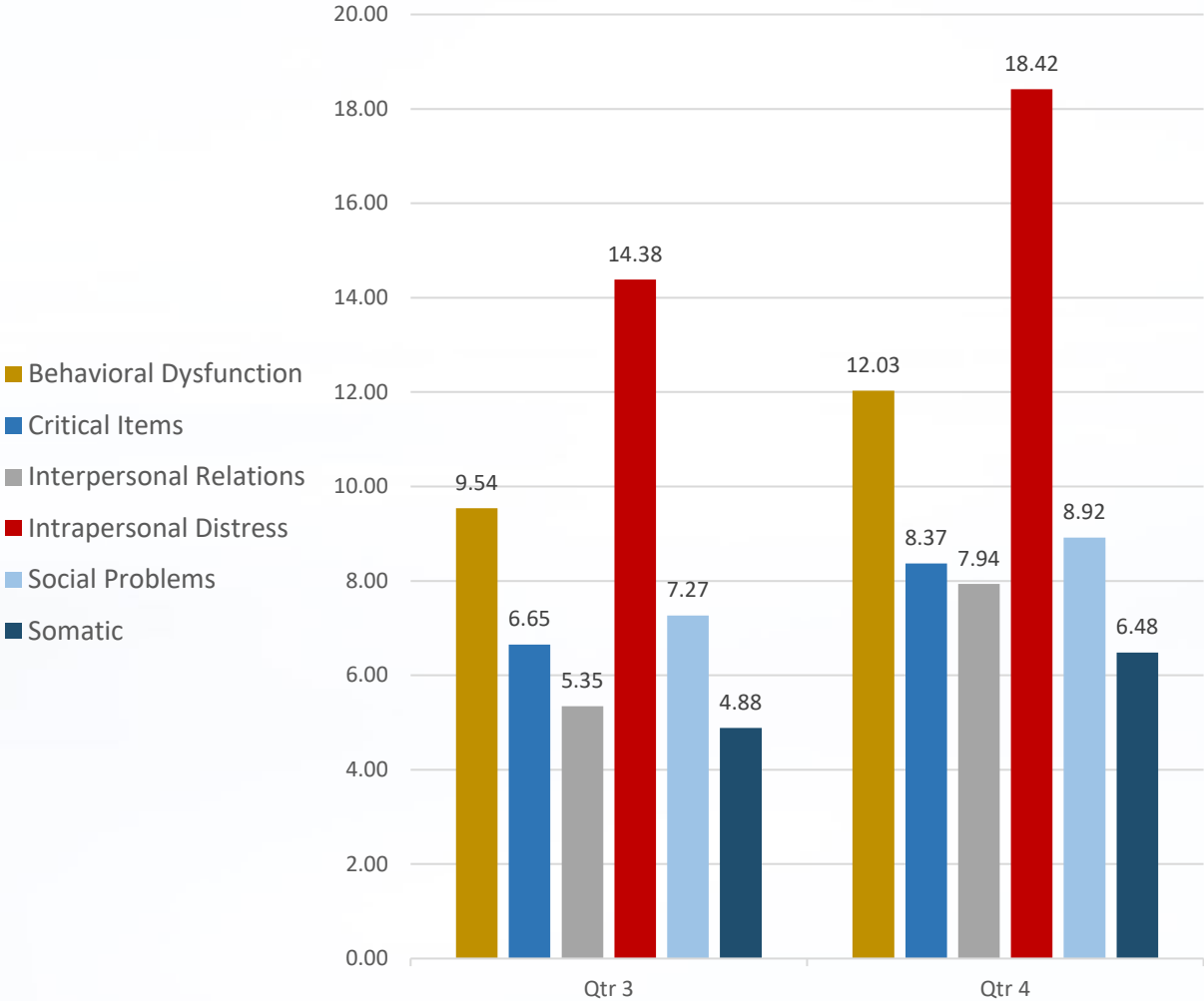
