RECOMMENDATIONS REGARDING 2020-21 GRANT AWARDS FOR CULTURAL SERVICES (ALL DISTRICTS) (3 VOTES)

SUBJECT

The County, through the Los Angeles County Department of Arts and Culture, provides grants to nonprofit arts organizations to deliver a wide variety of cultural services to County residents and to support arts and culture throughout the region. Grants to nonprofit organizations in artistic disciplines such as visual arts, media arts, literary arts, film, music, and performing arts provide concerts, theatre productions, exhibitions, arts education programs and core operations that increase access to the arts and quality of life for residents throughout the County.

IT IS RECOMMENDED THAT YOUR BOARD:

- 1. Approve grants to 214 nonprofit arts organizations at a cost of \$4,113,000 for the Fiscal Year 2020-21 Organizational Grant Program (OGP), as such grants help to meet the needs of constituents by fostering excellence, diversity, vitality, understanding and accessibility of the arts in Los Angeles County.
- 2. Instruct the Department of Arts and Culture Director to prepare, sign and execute contracts and approve expenditures necessary to implement the 2020-2021 OGP after County Counsel approves as to form.
- 3. Delegate authority to the Department of Arts and Culture to reallocate forfeited grant awards, not to exceed \$100,000 in aggregate, to existing Board-approved grantee organizations and instruct the Department of Arts and Culture Director to amend these contracts accordingly.
- 4. Find that the proposed actions are exempt from California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) for the reasons stated in the Board Letter and the record.

PURPOSE/JUSTIFICATION OF RECOMMENDED ACTION

The purpose of this recommended action is to disburse grant funds allocated by your Board. This is the annual implementation of the Organizational Grant Program (OGP). All organizations apply for two years of consecutive funding and all award amounts are for two years. The number of recommended grantees in 2020-21 is 214.

Organizational Grant Program 1/Small Budget Organizations

This category provides support for nonprofit arts organizations with budgets up to \$199,999 and two years of producing history. OGP 1 grant funds will be disbursed to 103 nonprofit arts organizations (see BOS Attachments Pg. 1-8) at a cost of \$1,010,800.

Organizational Grant Program 2/Mid-Size Budget Organizations

This category provides support for nonprofit arts organizations with budgets between \$200,000 and \$999,999. OGP 2 grant funds will be disbursed to 70 nonprofit arts organizations (see BOS Attachments Pg. 9-14) at a cost of \$1,373,500.

Organizational Grant Program 3/Larger Mid-Size Budget Organizations

This category provides support for nonprofit arts organizations with budgets between \$1,000,000 and \$14,999,999. OGP 3 grant funds will be disbursed to 36 nonprofit arts organizations (see BOS Attachments Pg. 15-18) at a cost of \$1,330,200.

Organizational Grant Program 4/Large Budget Organizations

This category provides support for nonprofit arts organizations with budgets over \$15 million to ensure accessibility. Grants must be used for programs that increase access to cultural services for County residents. OGP 4 grant funds will be disbursed to 5 nonprofit arts organizations (see BOS Attachments Pg. 19) at a cost of \$398,500.

Grant amounts are awarded utilizing the formula adopted by the Arts Commission. A total of \$11,362,614 in Fiscal Year 2020-21 grant funding requests were received. With this formula, to fit the total available funding of \$4,113,000, all awards across all OGP categories were reduced to 41% of the fundable request amount (score multiplied by total request). Scores are determined by evaluating the organization's artistic quality and accomplishments, quality of standards-based K-12 arts education services (if applicable), services to community/audience, evaluation methodology, and fiscal and administrative competence.

Since funding is over two years, organizations that receive grants apply every other year. For your information, also attached is a list of 213 grants that were made last year in Fiscal Year 2019-20 (BOS Attachments Pg. 20-27) to provide you with a full perspective of all arts and cultural organizations that are supported through this program. A total of \$4,518,000 was allocated in Fiscal Year 2019-20 for 213 grants as follows: 113 organizations received funding in the OGP 1/Small Budget category, 71 organizations received funding in the OGP 2/Mid-Size Budget category, 25 organizations received funding in the OGP 4/Large Budget category.

IMPLEMENTATION OF STRATEGIC PLAN GOALS

The recommended actions support Countywide Strategic Plan Goal II: Foster Vibrant and Resilient Communities, as arts and cultural resources support healthy and vibrant communities and the proposed organization's contracts will help to meet the needs of constituents by providing direct access and

increased opportunities for quality arts activities and programming that is often free or low cost throughout Los Angeles County.

FISCAL IMPACT/FINANCING

The \$4,113,000 in Net County Cost for this program is included in the Department of Arts and Culture FY2020-21 Adopted budget.

FACTS AND PROVISIONS/LEGAL REQUIREMENTS

The Department of Arts and Culture utilized peer panels grouped by artistic discipline to review and score all applications and to make recommendations to the Arts Commission. The Arts Commission reviewed these scores and allocations at their meeting on July 13, 2020, and voted to approve the funding recommendations for submission to your Board for approval.

Upon notification of a forfeited FY 2020-21 OGP grant award, the Department of Arts and Culture will reallocate the forfeited funds to existing Board-approved grantee organizations. The reallocation will be approved by the Arts Commission.

For Fiscal Year 2019-20, forfeited funds totaling \$13,200 from two of the 213 organizations awarded grants through the OGP were reallocated to Board-approved grantee organizations. Consistent with prior re-allocations made by the Arts Commission, the grant dollars were reallocated to organizations in the same OGP category across all five supervisorial districts (BOS Attachments Pg. 28).

The County is authorized to contract with any firm or corporation for artistic services for the residents of Los Angeles County pursuant to Government Code sections 25562 and 26227. The contractor (grantee) will be governed by the policy and guideline requirements of the Department of Arts and Culture. Grantees are defined as nonprofit 501(c)(3) organizations with missions to provide arts services for the benefit of the public.

ENVIRONMENTAL DOCUMENTATION

The recommended actions are exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to sections 15301, 15304(e), 15322, and 15323 of the CEQA Guidelines. The OGP programs 1) utilize existing facilities making either minor or negligible alterations to the environment; 2) make minor alterations to land having negligible or no permanent effects on the environment; 3) involve educational or training programs with no physical outdoor alterations to the environment; or 4) consist of normal operations of facilities for public gatherings. In addition, based on the proposed projects records, they will comply with all applicable regulations, and they are not in a sensitive environment, and there are no cumulative impacts, unusual circumstances, damage to scenic highways, listing on hazardous waste site lists compiled pursuant to Government Code section 65962.5, or indications that they may cause a substantial adverse change in the significance of a historical resource that would make any of the exemption inapplicable.

CONTRACTING PROCESS

The County will pay the contractor (grantee), in consideration of services to be performed and fulfillment of matching requirements, a specific grant award sum (see BOS Attachments Pg. 1-19).

IMPACT ON CURRENT SERVICES (OR PROJECTS)

This program ensures that a wide variety of diverse cultural services will continue to reach County residents. These services will positively impact residents, neighborhoods and communities by providing direct access and increased opportunities for quality arts activities and programming that is often free or low cost. The proposed grantee organizations are located throughout LA County with offices in 56 of the County's 88 municipalities with programs and services provided in all five supervisorial districts.

RECOMMENDATIONS REGARDING 2020-21 AWARDS FOR COMMUNITY IMPACT ARTS GRANTS (ALL DISTRICTS) (3 VOTES)

<u>SUBJECT</u>

The County of Los Angeles (County), through the Los Angeles County Department of Arts and Culture, invests in diverse communities through the Community Impact Arts Grant. In this fifth year of awards, the program provides arts programming grants to advance the organizational missions and values of County nonprofits, municipalities and institutions of higher learning and enables these organizations to deliver a wide variety of cultural services to County residents that support arts and culture throughout the region. Grants to organizations providing mental health, disability, environmental, homeless, immigrant rights, youth and veteran services broaden the contexts in which arts are accessed for County residents who may not receive arts programming through traditional outlets, offering the opportunity to experience a range of artistic disciplines including, but not limited to, visual and media arts, performance, dance and music.

IT IS RECOMMENDED THAT YOUR BOARD:

- Find that the proposed projects are exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act, for the reasons stated in this Board letter and in the records of the projects.
- 2. Approve the Community Impact Arts Grant (CIAG) program grants to 64 nonprofit organizations at a total cost of \$750,000 for the Fiscal Year 2020-21, as approved by the Arts Commission.
- 3. Find that the expenditure of said funds is necessary to meet the social needs of the County and the programs funded thereby will serve a public purpose.
- 4. Delegate authority to the Department of Arts and Culture Director, or her designee, to prepare, execute, and amend, as necessary, contracts, approved as to form by County Counsel, to implement the 2020-21 CIAG program.
- 5. Delegate authority to the Director of Arts and Culture, or her designee, to reallocate forfeited grant awards, not to exceed \$50,000, to existing Board-approved grantee organizations and instruct the Director of Arts and Culture, or her designee, to amend these contracts accordingly.

PURPOSE/JUSTIFICATION OF RECOMMENDED ACTION

Approval of the recommended actions will find that these projects are exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act and allow the Los Angeles County Department of Arts and Culture (Department of Arts and Culture) to disburse the \$750,000 grant funds allocated by your Board. Sixty-seven eligible organizations applied for project funding totaling \$1,278,025 in requests. All award amounts recommended as part of this action are for one year.

The Department of Arts and Culture submitted an annual report and analysis detailing the impact of the program to the Board of Supervisors in June of 2019 that included information on grants, projects and grantees, including locations and demographics. The Department of Arts and Culture's analysis of those served through CIAG in comparison to those served through the Organizational Grant Program (OGP) determined that while diverse constituent populations are served through both programs the CIAG program reaches distinct populations and equity needs of the County.

The Department of Arts and Culture has found that CIAG grants are serving a wide variety of populations and communities underserved by the arts as measured by specific populations, race and ethnicity, and poverty rates. Moreover, the constituencies reached through CIAG and OGP are distinct. Compared to OGP grantees, CIAG grantees serve more diverse communities in terms of race and ethnicity and significantly more communities where more than a quarter of the population earns less than the federal poverty level. Additionally, each program reaches a large number of communities living in zip codes not reached by the other program. Foster youth, homeless individuals, currently or formerly incarcerated individuals, individuals with disabilities, and low-income individuals are all being served by a larger share of CIAG grantees, and many CIAG organizations are located in areas identified by the Portrait of LA County as "struggling" or "precarious" as evidenced by the level of disparities there.

The Board's investment in the CIAG program ensures that a wide variety of cultural services reach County residents in ways that are distinct and complementary to the services provided by OGP grantees. Additionally, the program supports the meaningful role of arts and culture in social service and social justice organizations in our most underserved areas. Overall, the findings show that CIAG is achieving a critical goal set out by the Board of Supervisors to expand the ways we serve and invest in our communities particularly those that have been historically and systemically marginalized.

FISCAL IMPACT/FINANCING

The \$750,000 for the CIAG program is included in the Department of Arts and Culture's FY 2020-21 final adopted budget. The contracts will be executed in FY 2020-21 and grant disbursement will occur on a reimbursement basis in FY 2020-21.

IMPLEMENTATION OF STRATEGIC PLAN GOALS

The recommended actions support Countywide Strategic Plan Goal II: Foster Vibrant and Resilient Communities, as the proposed organizations' contracts will help to meet the needs of constituents by advancing their access to arts, culture, and creativity in Los Angeles County.

FACTS AND PROVISIONS/LEGAL REQUIREMENTS

The Department of Arts and Culture utilized peer panels organized by nonprofit sectors to review and score all applications and to make recommendations to the Arts Commissioners. The Arts Commission reviewed these scores and allocations at their meeting on May 18, 2020, and voted to approve the funding recommendations for submission to your Board for approval.

Grant amounts are awarded utilizing a formula adopted by the Department of Arts and Culture that factors in panel scores. Scores are determined by evaluating the proposed program's artistic merit, services to community, evaluation methodology and fiscal and administrative competence. Applicants were able to request \$5,000 to \$20,000 for projects. Given available funding, organizations that scored 70 or higher out of a maximum possible score of 100 points, will receive an average of approximately 71% of their request amounts.

Upon notification of a forfeited FY 2020-21 CIAG grant award, the Department of Arts and Culture will reallocate the forfeited funds to existing Board-approved grantee organizations. The reallocation will be approved by the Arts Commission.

For the Fiscal Year 2019-20, forfeited funds totaling \$13,900 from one of the fifty-eight organizations awarded grants through the CIAG program were reallocated to Board-approved grantee organizations. Consistent with prior reallocations made for the Organizational Grant Program by the Arts Commission, the grant dollars were reallocated to each supervisorial district's highest scoring organization. (BOS Attachments Pg. 9).

The County is authorized to contract with any firm or corporation for artistic services for the residents of Los Angeles County pursuant to Government Code sections 25562 and 26227. The contractor (grantee) will be governed by the policy and guideline requirements of the Department of Arts and Culture. Grantees are defined as nonprofit 501(c)(3) organizations with missions to provide arts services for the benefit of the public.

ENVIRONMENTAL DOCUMENTATION

The recommended actions are exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to sections 15301, 15304(e), 15322, and 15323 of the CEQA Guidelines. The CIAG programs 1) utilize existing facilities making either minor or negligible alterations to the environment; 2) make minor alterations to land having negligible or no permanent effects on the environment; 3) involve educational or training programs with no physical outdoor alterations to the environment; or 4) consist of normal operations of facilities for public gatherings. In addition, based on the proposed projects records, they will comply with all applicable regulations, and they are not in a sensitive environment, and there are no cumulative impacts, unusual circumstances, damage to scenic highways, listing on hazardous waste site lists compiled pursuant to Government Code section 65962.5, or indications that they may cause a substantial adverse change in the significance of a historical resource that would make any of the exemption inapplicable.

CONTRACTING PROCESS

The County will pay the contractor (grantee), in consideration of services to be performed and fulfillment of matching requirements, a specific grant award sum (see BOS Attachments Pg. 1-5).

IMPACT ON CURRENT SERVICES (OR PROJECTS)

The Community Impact Arts Grant program expands the County's services to reach diverse constituents and recognizes the value of the arts as a vital tool for cross-sector and civic problem solving across a range of issue areas and supports arts programming taking place at nonprofit social service, social justice, health organizations and municipal departments as part of their larger missions to provide services to individuals and communities. This program ensures that a wide variety of cultural services will continue to reach County residents and positively impact them through increased opportunities for arts activities in various contexts, such as mental health, homelessness, youth and social justice. The proposed grantee organizations are located throughout LA County with programs and services provided in all five supervisorial districts.

ACCEPTANCE OF AN ART DONATION OF A FLETCHER BENTON SCULPTURE TO THE NORWALK LIBRARY (FOURTH DISTRICT) (3 VOTES)

SUBJECT

Recommend the acceptance of the proposed Fletcher Benton *Folded Circle Ring Interlocking S* sculpture donation into the County of Los Angeles Civic Art Collection, to be installed at the entrance of the Norwalk Library in the Fourth Supervisorial District.

IT IS RECOMMENDED THAT THE BOARD:

1. Authorize the Director of Arts and Culture (Director), or her designee, and the Director LA County Library to accept with thanks and appreciation the donation of a sculpture titled *Folded Circle Ring Interlocking S*, valued at \$325,000, from Mr. Burke to the County of Los Angeles Civic Art Collection to be displayed at the Norwalk Library.

2. Instruct the Executive Officer, Board of Supervisors to prepare and send a letter of appreciation (Attachment I) to Mr. Kevin Burke for his generous donation to LA County.

PURPOSE/JUSTIFICATION OF RECOMMENDED ACTION

The Folded Circle Ring Interlocking S sculpture by artist Fletcher Benton is being offered as a donation by the private collector, Mr. Kevin Burke. In November of 2018, Arts and Culture staff and an art conservator traveled to the studio to assess the sculpture. It was found to be in good condition. The donor would like to give the sculpture to Los Angeles County and has expressed a preference for it to be placed in a setting where the sculpture can be enjoyed by the public. The sculpture is currently in storage in Gardena, CA.

ACCEPTANCE OF AN ART DONATION OF A FLETCHER BENTON SCULPTURE TO THE NORWALK LIBRARY

August 4, 2020

Proposed Location

Arts and Culture staff, in consultation with Public Library, looked at two possible locations in the Fourth Supervisorial District: Sorensen Library and Norwalk Library. After conducting site visits, Norwalk Library was identified as the ideal location for installation. Arts and Culture recommends placing the artwork on the left side of the entrance of the Library for several reasons: visitor visibility, close to the library entrance, away from tree foliage, the area is well lit, and the sculpture can be viewed from all vantage points.

Norwalk Library is home to three tiled artworks in the Civic Art Collection, "Children's Picture Book," "Historic Map," and "Modern Map of California" by Ben Mayer. The artworks are in fair and stable condition and have been at the library since 1969. Norwalk Library is also currently going through a refurbishment project with a substantial completion in December 2020, at which time the new donation would be revealed.

IMPLEMENTATION OF STRATEGIC PLAN GOALS

The recommended actions support Goal 1, Operational Effectiveness/Fiscal Sustainability, of the County's Strategic Plan.

FISCAL IMPACT/FINANCING

The County cost for preparing and installing the sculpture is estimated at \$27,000. Mr. Burke has agreed to cover the costs of fine art transportation and installation. County costs will include engineering, concrete footing, installation oversight, and plaque. The County costs will be paid using the Civic Art Allocation from the Norwalk Library Refurbishment Project in accordance with the Board's Civic Arts Policy adopted on December 7, 2004 and amended on August 11, 2015.

FACTS AND PROVISIONS/LEGAL REQUIREMENTS

In 2004, the Board approved the Civic Art Policy for the County, which authorized the former Arts Commission (now Department of Arts and Culture) to establish procedures to implement the Civic Art Policy. Under the Civic Arts Procedures adopted by the Arts Commission in 2015, there are procedures for the review and acceptance of gifts of art. The Los Angeles County Arts Commissioners reviewed the donation on May 18, 2020 and recommend approval by the Board. Once the Board approves the donation, the artwork will be accessioned into the County's Civic Art Collection. Acceptance of the donation of the art is consistent with Government Code Section 25355.

About the Artist

Born on February 25, 1931 in Jackson, Ohio, Fletcher Benton is an American sculptor and painter widely known for his abstract, large scale steel geometric sculptures. He received a bachelor's in fine arts degree from Miami University, Ohio, in 1956 and later went on to teach for several institutions including California College of the Arts and Crafts, San Francisco Art Institute and California State University, San Jose.

Benton started as a sign painter but is best known for his kinetic art that he began after transitioning to working in bronze and steel, creating large scale sculptures with moving parts. Benton's work is often characterized as "New Constructivism," in the style of folded squares and circles. During the 1970s Benton was celebrated for his "Alphabet series" works comprised of twenty-six large scale steel sculptures.

Benton has had solo exhibitions all around America, Europe and Korea. Benton's work is included in the collections of the Metropolitan Museum of Art, Whitney Museum of American Art, San Francisco Museum of Modern Art, and the Hirschhorn Museum and Sculpture Garden in Washington, D.C. Fletcher Benton passed away last summer, June 26, 2019.

About the Donor

Kevin Burke is a retired life insurance salesman from Manhattan Beach. Burke is a native Angelino and avid art collector.
