



What are top three domains that you believe the Task Force should prioritize researching in Phase 2? (n=15)








Current model for Service Delivery






Service Delivery Challenges



OBJECTIVE

GUIDING QUESTIONS

- 1. What are some of the County's existing prevention and promotion efforts for these indicators?
- 2. What is the overall enabling environment or County structure(s) for addressing issues within this domain?
- 3. How do these data improve our understanding of the work this Task Force has been charged to undertake?
- 4. How can improving Countywide coordination and collaboration improve our ability to conduct prevention and promotion for these outcomes and address these racial disproportionalities?







Child Maltreatment Allegations Incidents per 1,000 Children (2022)




Child Maltreatment Investigations Incidents per 1,000 Children (2022)






Homeless Population by Race





Countywide Population by Race

















Below 200% Federal Poverty Level





Population and Poverty Estimates of Los Angeles County, 2021





Mean Per Capita Income




By race of householder


Now that we have reviewed outcomes across a few of the domains:

- 5. How would a racial equity lens (i.e., intentionally reducing racial disproportionalities) to prevention & promotion work strengthen the County's approach to each of the domains?











Eviction Rate






% Currently Depressed




% Receiving Counseling from a Mental Health Professional

of adults currently diagnosed with depression





% Taking Medication Prescribed by a Doctor or Psychiatrist for Depression of adults currently diagnosed with depression

Mental Health Provider Map / Directory













High School Graduation Rate



3rd Grade Math Test Scores: Met or Exceeded Standard




3rd Grade English Test Scores: Met or Exceeded Standard





Chronic Absenteeism





Percent of Children Who Are in Any Kind of Childcare









Figure 6. Prevalence of Difficulty Obtaining Care by Age Group and Disability Status





Figure 5. Prevalence of Housing Instability by Race/Ethnicity and Disability Status



Percent of adults who reported being homeless or not having their own place to live/sleep in the past 5 years







Incarceration Rate (Jail) Per 100,000 Population Age 15-64




Ever Arrested and Booked



No Stops by Law Enforcement in Last Three Years






% of Adults who are Obese
