# 2017 Summer Use License Workshop Questions and Answers

#### 1. Is the minimum location bid fee part of the gross receipts?

- Yes, operators granted a permit will pay either their minimum bid amount annually OR 15 percent of gross receipts, whichever amount is higher.

#### 2. Who are the review panel members?

 To the extent possible, panel members typically include individuals knowledgeable about the type of activity being evaluated and/or familiar with the competitive selection process. Panel members could include personnel from municipal agencies in other jurisdictions, non-beach recreational camp operators, Beach Commissioners, retired Department personnel, etc.

## 3. Can we pay gross receipts upfront and final actual gross receipts at the end?

- Yes.

### 4. Is the competitive bid good for one year?

- No, the use license will be issued for an initial three-year term, with a two-year option period based on mutual consent.

### 5. Do we have to pay the bid fee when submitting the application?

- No, the bid fee is required to be paid at a later time if the license is awarded; however, a non-refundable \$250 application fee is due at the time of application submission.

#### 6. Who made decisions on the minimum bid location fee change?

The Department Director.

#### 7. How is the annual license for each location processed?

Non-competitive licenses are processed on a first-come, first-served basis.

#### 8. What is the gross receipts payment schedule?

- <u>First installment:</u> 25% of estimated gross receipts and location bid fee will be due May 1<sup>st</sup>;
- <u>Second installment:</u> 25% of estimated gross receipts will be due no later than ten business days after the commencement of camp;
- <u>Third installment:</u> 50% of estimated gross receipts will be due no later than 10 business days after the last day of camp;

• Any additional payments due, based upon actual gross receipts, must be paid in full within 30 calendar days following the licensed event.

## 9. Does the time at which the application is received (e.g. 7:00 a.m. versus 4:00 p.m.) afford any applicant any type of priority?

- Yes, we are time-stamping each application as it is received. While the applications are not going to be processed on a first-come, first-served basis, as is done with yearly licenses, the stamped time and date will only be utilized if there are two applications that score equally.

# 10. Are we to have our parking and transportation plan approved before we submit our application, or does the plan only need to be approved before commencing operations?

- The parking/transportation plan does not need prior approval; however, it will be evaluated as part of the application.
