BEACH CLEANING SCHEDULE

Restroom Cleaning

- ◆ Seven days per week
 - Four times per day (summer)
 - Two times per day (winter)

Marina del Rey Harbor (Water)

- ◆ Seven days per week, 365 days per year

Beach Raking

- ◆ Seven days per week, 365 days per year

Emptying Trash Cans

- ◆ Seven days per week, 365 days per year

Beach Sanitizing

- ◆ Seven days per week, 365 days per year

Beach Accessways

- ◆ Seven days per week, 365 days per year

PARKING LOT CLEANING

Parking lots are mechanically cleaned five days per week in the summer, three days per week in the winter, and manually detail-cleaned seven days per week.

BIKE PATH CLEANING

The entire bike path is cleaned three times per week in the summer and two times per week in the winter by L.A. County Department of Public Works.

SENSITIVE HABITATS ON L.A. COUNTY BEACHES


- ◆ California Least Tern (at Venice Beach)

SAND BERMS

Sand berm construction takes place at Hermosa, Isidora Dockweiler, Venice, and Zuma beaches from November to December. Berms are then removed from February 15 to 28.
