Subject: 2018 Annual Campus Safety and Security Report

The College is committed to providing a safe environment for students and employees.

The Annual Security Report is published in compliance with the "Jeanne Clery Disclosure of Campus Security Policy and Campus Crime Statistics Act of 1990". The Clery Act was formerly known as the Crime Awareness and Campus Security Act of 1990 and is named in memory of a university student, Jeanne Clery, who was raped and murdered in 1986. This Act requires colleges and universities receiving federal financial aid to publish an annual report disclosing campus security policies and three years' worth of selected crime statistics. This Annual Security Report is compiled by the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department.

The Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department (LASD) at the LAC+USC Medical Center is available 24 hours a day throughout the year. LASD is vested with the authority and responsibility to enforce all applicable local, state and federal laws. The deputies are duly sworn peace officers, authorized to carry firearms, and have full authority and duty to conduct criminal investigations, arrest violators and suppress campus crime on the campus and all properties owned and operated by the County of Los Angeles. LASD receive reports of incidents occurring on campus and are responsible for investigating all campus crime.

LASD prepared this report by gathering crime statistics from local and/or state law enforcement agencies combined with statistics collected by campus security authorities. The law requires the reporting of violent crime, burglary, and motor vehicle theft, as well as a summary of arrests and referrals for liquor law, drug abuse and weapon violations. The geographic area for this 2018 annual report is the College campus buildings, parking lots 14 and 10 and the surrounding streets that include Griffin Ave, Mission Road, Sichel St. and the railroad tracks.

Upon completion of the annual security report, the crime statistics are submitted to the U.S. Department of Education.

The Los Angeles County College of Nursing and Allied Health (College) is required to distribute the following information to all current and potential students and employees.

1. Employees and students should report crimes or safety concerns to the Sheriff's Department of LAC+USC Medical Center at **323.409-3333** or by using the "emergency" telephones located in the parking areas and on the grounds of the Medical Center.
 - You may also report a crime or safety concern to College Administration at 323.409-5911. Ask for the Director of the Office of Educational Services.
 - All crimes and suspicious activities should be reported immediately.
2. LASD will make timely reports to the College on crimes considered a serious or continuing threat to students or employees, which are reported to them. The warning will be issued through any appropriate means, including email, posted fliers, or emergency notifications.
3. The College will inform students and staff about potential safety risks, serious or continuing threats, and/or emergencies. The information will be issued through any appropriate means, including email, posted fliers, or emergency notifications.
4. Students and employees are to wear their County ID badge whenever on campus in compliance with County policy.
5. The College complies with all County of Los Angeles policies and procedures:
 - To maintain a campus free of unlawful manufacture, distribution, dispensing, possession or use of controlled substances, such as, marijuana, heroin, cocaine, amphetamines, and alcohol. Health risks associated with the abuse of controlled substances include malnutrition, damage to various organs, hangovers, blackouts, general fatigue, impaired learning, dependency, disability and death. Both drugs and alcohol may be damaging to the development of an unborn fetus. Personal problems include diminished self-esteem, depression, alienation from reality, and suicide. Social problems include alienation from and abuse of family members, chronic conflict with authority, and loss of friends, academic standing, and/or co- and extra-curricular opportunities.  - related to sexual harassment and assault:
Sexual harassment includes unwelcome sexual advances, requests for sexual favors, and other verbal or physical conduct of a sexual nature when submission to such conduct is made whether explicitly or implicitly a term or condition of an individual's grade, employment or employment decisions, or when such conduct interferes with student achievement or job performance. All students and employees complete Sexual Harassment Prevention Training. Students and staff are encouraged to report incidents and/or seek assistance from the Provost and/or Dean, Student Services. 6. Safety policies and procedures for bomb threats, the disaster plan, earthquakes, fire regulations, bomb threats, earthquakes, active shooter and sexual assault are in the student handbook provided to each student during new student orientation and to employees during new employee orientation. The policies are also found in the College catalog posted on the College Internet site and on the College Intranet (Team Services) for employees.
7. A manual has been prepared and is located in the Administration Building, Rm. 123 for employees and students to review policies and procedures regarding Campus Security.
