Our Specific Focus

LVN Blood Withdrawl and Phlebotomy Certification Course

- Presented in collaboration with the ACN
- Designed for the licensed LVN working in Los Angeles County DHS.
- Program is state approved
- ✓ Upon successful completion of the 5 week program, the LVN will be able to apply for IV certification as part of their licensure through the state.
- ✓ Scheduled for June 2018

Nursing Attendant Enrichment Program

- Target Audience: Nursing Attendants (NA)/Certified Nursing Attendants (CNA)
- Courses are approved for Continuing Education Units (CEU) credit for re-certification
- Goal is to present 24 hours of training each year to be available for all Nursing Attendants county-wide at no cost.
- These CEU's can be used towards recertification.
- The plan is to start offering the CNA education on a monthly basis in September 2018. All classes will be held centrally at the College of Nursing and Allied Health -Room TBA

Future Focus

Certified Medical Assistants

- Recertification is required every 5 years which may be accomplished by either retesting or by the CEU method
- ✓ 60 credits within 5 years (30 Basic, 15 Administrative, 15 Clinical
- All training must be within the scope of practice for a CMA
- Must have proof of CPR certification
- Plan is for collaboration with ACN and Hospital-based Medical Homes.
