COVID-19 – Vaccine Requirement

- The clinics will need to submit a Certification of Compliance to let us know where they are in terms of compliance with the Ordinance. If all their staff are vaccinated, we only need one Certification submitted.
- If a clinic approves a covered employees' request for exemption, they will need to identify the staff on the Certification of Compliance and submit a new Certification of Compliance each week to confirm that the employees have been tested weekly for COVID-19 & received a negative result.

Mental Health Prevention Project

- Changes to the DHS/DMH Mental Health Prevention Project.
- Thanks to CPs that participated in the workgroup.
- Updated <u>Provider Information Notice</u>:
 - Report due 15th each month
 - Screening process optional PHQ-2 (positive go to PHQ-9)
 - Follow guidelines on medical record documentation
- Goal is to get accurate documentation and screening.
- DMH will go over more details at CCALAC roundtables.
- Focus: Increase uptake of stress management, grief & loss and trauma-informed care.



Quality Incentive Project

- Goal: Get MHLA participants back to in-person care.
- What: Pay CPs percentage of MGF based on increases in the visit rate.
- Source: Surplus from last year.
- Notices went out in October with how much you can earn, what your baseline visit rate was.
- Some clinics have already started doing outreach.



ERU/ One-e-App

- One-e-App eligibility system sunsetting.
- Alluma is replacing it with One-x-Connection.
- CPs may take part in testing of the new materials.
- More info to come re: timing, training, new materials.
- Remote enrollment:
 - Continuing post-pandemic.
 - Watch for changes to the form.







- Check the <u>formulary</u> and send patients to pharmacies in the network. It is up-to-date.
- DHS Central Pharmacy.
- Updates on Medication for Assisted Treatment (PIN <u>here</u>):
 - MHLA participants can get MAT at any pharmacy.
 - SAPC providers can prescribe too.
 - Several already on the formulary, recently added Narcan nasal spray added.
 - DHS Central Pharmacy (mail-order) cannot be used for these meds.

Audits

- Remote audits are continuing, except for pre-sites.
- Clinics are doing well no liquidated damages.
- For Medical Record Reviews (MRR): Most frequent deficiencies are for lack of documentation of foot exam/podiatry referral; TB screening; immunizations; diabetic retinal scan/ophthalmology referrals; seasonal flu vaccine.
- Guidance for Improved Outcomes on the MRR –April.
