Park community and those involved in the tragic shooting event that took place on the evening of Saturday, January 21, 2023. It is devastating to learn of the senseless violence that took the lives of 11 innocent people and injured 9 others. We grieve with the families and those who are working diligently to support the victims in this time of need. ## FEBRUARY 7TH IS BLACK HIV/AIDS AWARENESS DAY



Do you know your status? According to the 2021 Los Angeles Department of Public Health HIV Surveillance Annual report, 9 out of 10 individuals living with HIV in Los Angeles County (LAC) are male.


Despite Black males making up 4% of the LAC population, they are disproportionately impacted by HIV and makeup 17% of individuals living with HIV. The National HIV Behavioral Surveillance (NHBS) has shown, among survey participants, which is utilized to gather data to obtain a representative sample of the county, HIV prevalence has consistently been highest among Black men who have had sex with men, at 36%, between 2004 and 2017 within LAC.

Additionally, 36% of Black Heterosexual women and 31% of Black Heterosexual men residents of LAC have tested positive for HIV in the last 12 months. Within the Transgender (TG) community, HIV prevalence was highest among Black TG women at 52%. Knowing your status is part of self-care for you and your partner!

If you or a loved one have difficulty leaving the home to get vaccinated against COVID-19, you can request in-home vaccination by calling 2-1-1 or the Los Angeles County Department of Public Health Vaccine Call Center at 833-540-0473 (8am-8:30pm; 7 days a week).

Residents can also fill out the <u>online request form</u> (multiple language options available) or visit <u>ph.lacounty.gov/vaxathome</u> for more information. Referrals from caregivers, loved ones, organizations, agencies, providers (among others) are welcome. All doses are available for eligible individuals ages 6 months and older at no cost.

An ongoing research collaboration involving the University of Southern California, the California Institute of Technology, and Rancho Los Amigos helped to develop brain-controlled prosthetic

devices like robotic limbs to enable injury-caused paralyzed individuals to become more functionally independent.

Parents Investing in Relationship Success (PAIRS) coaches individuals and couples to strengthen existing or future relationships in both English and Spanish. Participants are eligible to receive a \$50 gift card per couple, \$30 per individual and may enroll in free financial literacy and parenting classes. Evening, Saturday and virtual classes and case management are available.
