#### LAHSA RELEASES RESULTS OF 2023 HOMELESS COUNT



The 2023 Greater Los Angeles Homeless Count results were released, showing a 9% rise in homelessness on any given night in Los Angeles County to an estimated 75,518 people and a 10% rise in the City of Los Angeles to an estimated 46,260 people. While this year's increases are slightly lower than previous year-over-year increases in the homeless count, they continue a steady growth trend of people experiencing homelessness in the annual Point-in-Time Count (PIT Count). #### THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA COULD HELP YOU PAY YOUR BILLS



The Low-Income Household Water Assistance Program (LIHWAP) is a limited term program that provides financial assistance to help eligible income-qualified households struggling to pay their **residential water and sewer bills.** 

LIHWAP can help you with a one-time benefit:

- Up to \$15,000 to pay overdue bills which accrued during any timeframe.
   There is no date restriction for when the overdue amount occurred; or
- . From \$200 to \$316 to pay current bills.

988 CRISIS LIFELINE WEBINAR: WHAT TO KNOW ABOUT THE NATIONAL HOTLINE

LADWP HAS MANY PROGRAMS TO LEVEL OUT YOUR BILLS



Cool LA is designed to help LADWP customers better manage the impacts of extreme heat caused by climate change, especially older adults, income-qualified families, and those living in underserved communities where hot weather has an especially significant impact. Cool LA includes increased rebates on various types of cooling units to help LADWP customers overcome the health risks associated with extreme heat.

In addition, a new monthly payment program – Level Pay – is available to help customers smooth out their electric bills across twelve (12) monthly payments.

Some Cool LA offerings require customers to be current participants in one of the following programs: EZ-SAVE, Senior Citizen/Disability Lifeline Rate, Physician Certified Allowance Discount, and Life-Support Equipment Discount.
