**PROCEDURES**

- 1 Have training in Basic Life Support with documentation by certification, mandatory to operate in the Fine Needle Aspiration Clinic
- 2 Observe and participate in FNA procedures in the FNA Clinic under direct supervision; ultrasound, CT, bronchoscopy and endoscopy suites, and on the wards under direct supervision.
- 3 Be competent to perform an FNA of a palpable mass, including preparation and staining of smears made during the FNA procedure, to judge when satisfactory or diagnostic samples have been obtained during the FNA procedure.
- 4 Determine when special fixatives are needed for selected samples during the FNA procedure.
- 5 Be competent to instruct other physicians including radiologists in the appropriate technique for obtaining an adequate specimen.
- 6 Be competent to determine when adequate material has been obtained during the FNA procedure.
- 7 Be competent to decide when special stains or procedures including immunostains, flow cytometry, microbiologic cultures and molecular studies are necessary.
- 8 Be competent to work-up of the patient prior to the FNA procedure in the following manner: The fellow reviews the clinical referral note.  
 The fellow examines the patient appropriately prior to aspiration.  
 The fellow investigates the electronic record for additional case history, radiology findings and laboratory results.  
 The fellow asks the patient appropriate questions.
- 9 Advises the patient of appropriate FNA biopsy after-care.
- 10 Interprets exfoliative cervical and vaginal cytology preparations.
- 11 Interprets non-gynecological exfoliative cytology specimens.
