Dear Interim Provost/CEO Collier:

The Accrediting Commission for Community and Junior Colleges, Western Association of Schools and Colleges, at its meeting June 4-6, 2014, reviewed the Follow-Up Report submitted by Los Angeles County College of Nursing and Allied Health. The Follow-Up Report was certified by college leadership, including members of the governing board. The College provided evidence that it addressed Recommendation 5 (Technology) and meets the associated Standards (II.C.1.a, b, and c; III.C.1.b, c, d; and III.C.2). The College also reported on Recommendations 1 and 2 to increase effectiveness in planning, decision-making, and communication.

The Follow-Up Report submitted in March 2014 will become part of the accreditation history of the College. The Commission requires that you give the Follow-Up Report and this letter appropriate dissemination to your College staff and to those who were signatories of the Report. This group should include campus leadership and the Board of Trustees.

The Commission also requires that the Follow-Up Report and this Commission action letter be made available to students and the public by placing a copy on the College website. *Please note that in response to public interest in disclosure, the Commission now requires institutions to post accreditation information on a page no farther than one click from the institution's home page.*

Institutions are expected to meet Eligibility Requirements, Accreditation Standards, and Commission policies at all times during the six-year review cycle. Los Angeles County College of Nursing and Allied Health must demonstrate to the Commission at the time of the next regularly scheduled report that the recent changes implemented to resolve deficiencies and meet Standards have been sustained.

Los Angeles County College of Nursing and Allied Health will submit a Midterm Report in **spring 2016**.¹
