Seeking Safety is an evidence-based treatment for trauma and or substance abuse focusing on coping skills and psychoeducation and provides early intervention strategies. SS is manual-driven and can be delivered by both licensed and non-licensed trained professionals and provides a flexible curriculum. Included in the discussion is the following: (a) overview of trauma and substance abuse and; (b) implementation of Seeking Safety. Assessment tools and community resources are also covered. By the end of the training, participants will be able to implement Seeking Safety in their settings.
