## INTEGRATING INCARCERATED WOMEN INTO SOCIETY

This training addresses issues and treatment concerns relevant to justice-involved female consumers and their re-entry into the community. The training will begin with key statistics and move into understandings of current jail findings, gender specific findings of female incarcerated individuals, evidence based and best practices (Trauma Informed Care, Gender Responsive Approach, Harm Reduction, Stages of Change, Motivational Interviewing, and Strength-Based Case Management) and Understanding Re-entry and Recidivism. Participants will learn strategies for initial contact engagement as well as review important resources. Issues such as parenting (i.e. child rejecting the incarcerated parent), employment and housing barriers will also be discussed.

**TARGET AUDIENCE: AB109 Program staff, Men's & Women's Community Reintegration Program staff, Mental Health Court Linkage Program Staff.**

OBJECTIVES:

**As a result of attending this training, participants should be able to:**

- 1) Identify potential barriers common to community re-entry for justice involved women.
- 2) Identify resources to assist these consumers upon release.
- 3) Discuss why it is important to address community reentry issues during the initial contact and to provide a nonjudgmental approach to effectively and respectfully engage consumers in treatment.
- 4) Outline strategies for addressing the challenges that present in re-entry specific to parenting, employment, etc.
- 5) Describe how cultural awareness and humility influences clinicians' application of Trauma Informed Care.
- 6) Discuss Harm Reduction, Motivational Interviewing, and Strength Based Case Management.
