APPROVAL TO EXCEED INCIDENTAL EXPENSE LIMITS AND DELEGATED AUTHORITY TO ENTER INTO AGREEMENT(S) FOR THE USE OF FACILITY SPACE IN FISCAL YEARS 2017-18 AND 2018-19 (ALL SUPERVISORIAL DISTRICTS) (3 VOTES)

SUBJECT

The County of Los Angeles Department of Mental Health is seeking advanced Board approval to exceed the total annual incidental expense limit for Fiscal Years 2017-18 and 2018-19 to cover the costs of official meetings, conferences, and events that support our mission, and promote the health, wellness, and recovery of Los Angeles County residents.

IT IS RECOMMENDED THAT YOUR BOARD:

- 1. Approve and authorize the Director of Mental Health (Director), or his designee, to exceed the Department of Mental Health's (DMH) total incidental expenses for Fiscal Years (FY) 2017-18 and 2018-19 to procure catering services and incur other expenses for meetings, conferences, and events (i.e. trainings, symposiums, forums, focus groups, staff recognition, etc.) related to the conduct of County business up to a cumulative total of approximately \$225,000 per year, provided that DMH gives written notification to your Board and the Chief Executive Office (CEO) within ten (10) working days prior to the date of any event that exceeds \$10,000.
- 2. Delegate authority to the Director, or his designee, to enter into Agreement(s) for the use of various facility space(s) for meetings, conferences, and events, with the approval of County Counsel, provided that DMH gives written notification to your Board and the Chief Executive Office (CEO) within ten (10) working days prior to the date of any event.

PURPOSE/JUSTIFICATION OF RECOMMENDED ACTION

The purpose of the recommended actions is to provide DMH with the necessary spending authority to meet the anticipated level of incidental expenses associated with various meetings, conferences, and events that promote DMH's mission and enhance service delivery or service access to the community as follows:

Departmental Meetings and Events

DMH coordinates a variety of meetings and trainings that advance your Board's priorities, as well as the Department's mission in support of the 5,000 person workforce. This includes approximately \$35,000 in incidental expenses to fund employee recognition events, strategic planning meetings, and trainings.

Commission Meetings and Events

DMH incurs approximately \$15,000 in incidental expenses in support of the Los Angeles County Mental Health Commission (MHC). In addition to its monthly meetings and annual retreat, the MHC also hosts an Annual Volunteer and Program Recognition Awards Banquet. This is the sole opportunity for the Commission to recognize and honor outstanding members of the mental health community and the exceptional efforts and achievements of mental health programs that have provided innovative services to one or more communities within the Los Angeles County area.

Various Mental Health Conferences and Events

DMH hosts a variety of recurring, annual conferences and events (Attachment I)that aim to empower participants and facilitate collaboration with mental health experts, health care professionals, and community leaders. These events seek to combat stigma surrounding mental health issues, improve access to diverse populations seeking help, and enable successful reintegration in to the community. DMH is anticipating roughly \$175,000 in incidental expenses to support these needs.

Over the last three fiscal years, DMH spent an average of \$194,000 in catering services and incidental expenses, which were partially offset by approximately \$46,000 in conference/event fees collected from attendees. As such, DMH estimates that it will require approximately \$225,000 per year to procure catering services and incur other incidental expenses for FYs 2017-18 and 2018-19. To the extent that conference/event fees are collected from attendees, these funds will be used to offset the total cost of catering services and other incidental expenses.

Approval of the recommended actions will enable DMH to focus on the planning and execution of various meetings, conferences, and events throughout the County that enhance the quality of public service.

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Implementation of Strategic Plan Goals

These recommendations support the County's Strategic Plan Goal I, "Make Investments That Transform Lives," and Strategic Plan Goal II, "Foster Vibrant and Resilient Communities."

FISCAL IMPACT/FINANCING

Sufficient funds are available in DMH's approved budget for FY 2017-18 to procure catering services and incur other expenses for meetings, conferences, and events incidental to the conduct of County business. Funding for FY 2018-19 will be requested through the budget process.

To the extent that MHSA funds are used to pay for catering services and other incidental expenses, all expenses must be made in accordance with Los Angeles County's approved MHSA Three-Year Plan.

There is no net County cost impact associated with these actions.

FACTS AND PROVISIONS/LEGAL REQUIREMENTS

Incidental expenses may include food and beverage purchases and other costs directly associated with County business, including official functions and meetings.

Pursuant to Section 5.40.097 of County Code, and Section 4.9 of the County Fiscal Manual, departments are permitted to purchase food and beverages for official functions authorized by the Director up to \$500 per occurrence with a maximum of \$5,000 per year. Any expenditure over \$500 per occurrence must be approved in advance by the Chair of the Board of Supervisors. When total annual incidental expenses, or expenses for a single event, exceed \$5,000, the Board must approve such expenses in advance through a Board Agenda Item.

DMH anticipates incurring incidental expenses beyond \$500 per event, and will spend more than \$5,000 annually in food and beverage purchases in FYs 2017-18 and 2018-19. As such, DMH is requesting that your Board approve such expenses in advance, not to exceed a cumulative, annual total of approximately \$225,000, provided that DMH gives written notification to your Board within ten (10) working days prior to the date of any event that exceeds \$10,000.

IMPACT ON CURRENT SERVICES

Approval of the recommended action will enable DMH to continue to pay for incidental expenses associated with departmental meetings, conferences, and events that support Mental Health planning needs; improve public engagement; facilitate inter-departmental interaction; and enhance service delivery in order to promote the health, wellness, and recovery of mentally ill individuals.
