## REQUEST APPROVAL TO AMEND 29 LEGAL ENTITY AGREEMENTS TO ADD CALIFORNIA WORK OPPORTUNITY AND RESPONSIBILITY TO KIDS FUNDING FOR MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES FOR REMAINING SIX MONTHS OF FISCAL YEAR 2011-12 (ALL SUPERVISORIAL DISTRICTS) (3 VOTES)

## **SUBJECT**

Request approval to amend 29 existing Legal Entity Agreements to add California Work Opportunity and Responsibility to Kids funding to continue mental health services without interruption on a month-to-month basis for the remaining six months of Fiscal Year 2011-12 (January 1, 2012, through June 30, 2012).

# IT IS RECOMMENDED THAT YOUR BOARD:

1. Approve and authorize the Director of Mental Health (Director), or his designee, to prepare, sign, and execute amendments, substantially similar in format to Attachment A, to add California Work Opportunity and Responsibility to Kids (CalWORKs) funding to 29 Legal Entity (LE) Agreements with existing Department of Mental Health CalWORKs contractors. The added funding will allow these contract providers, listed in Attachment B, to continue providing CalWORKs mental health services on a month-to-month basis for the last six months of Fiscal Year (FY) 2011-12, beginning January 1, 2012 through June 30, 2012.

2. Delegate authority to the Director, or his designee, to prepare, sign, and execute future amendments for the purpose of CalWORKs services to these LE Agreements and establish as a new Maximum Contract Amount (MCA), the aggregate of the original agreement and all

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amendments and to further amend these LE Agreements as necessary, including providing time extensions if funding is available provided that: 1) any such increase will be used to provide additional services or to reflect program or Board policy changes; 2) your Board has appropriated sufficient funds for all changes; 3) approval of County Counsel, or designee, is obtained prior to any such amendments; 4) County and contract providers may, by written amendment, reduce programs or services without reference to the 20 percent limitation and revise the applicable MCA; and 5) the Director notifies your Board and the Chief Executive Officer (CEO) in writing within 30 days after execution of each amendment.

3. Delegate authority to the Director, or his designee, to extend the CalWORKs funding on a monthto-month basis, for up to a three-month period, from July 1, 2012, through September 30, 2012, via contract amendment, should the protest appeals process require additional time to be finalized.

## PURPOSE/JUSTIFICATION OF RECOMMENDED ACTION

Board approval will enable DMH to add CalWORKs funding to LE Agreements with existing contractors to avoid interruption in CalWORKs services. DMH issued a Request for Proposal (RFP) to select service providers, which will be recommended for a CalWORKs award. The recommended awardees have not been selected as five (5) proposers requested a Proposed Contractor Selection Review (PCSR). The proposed amendments will allow current DMH contract providers to provide uninterrupted CalWORKs mental health services and time to complete the PCSR and any subsequent Protest. Finalization of negotiations with selected proposers is pending the conclusion of the PCSR.

The additional month-to-month funding extension period from July 1, 2012, through September 30, 2012, is being requested in the event that the protest appeals require additional time to be worked through to finalization.

## **Implementation of Strategic Plan Goals**

The recommended actions support the County's Strategic Plan Goal 4, Health and Mental Health.

# FISCAL IMPACT/FINANCING

The CalWORKs funding to be allocated to 29 existing LE contractors is \$6,550,700, fully funded through an Intrafund Transfer from the Department of Public Social Services (DPSS). Funding is included in DMH's Fiscal Year 2011-12 Final Adopted Budget. Funding for future fiscal years will be requested in the annual budget process. The disbursement of funds to the 29 existing LE contractors will be based upon submitted claims for mental health services provided to CalWORKs recipients.

There is no net County cost associated with the recommended actions.

# FACTS AND PROVISIONS/LEGAL REQUIREMENTS

The request for the CalWORKs allocation will allow DMH time to address the appeals and complete its contract negotiation process for the RFP. Current contract providers of CalWORKs services will be able to continue providing the necessary services without interruption, and the Department will

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meet the State requirements regarding the allocation of CalWORKs funding within Los Angeles County. The CalWORKs funding will not be included when computing the 20 percent increase allowed over the last applicable Board-approved MCA.

Through the amendment process, DMH will provide \$6,550,700 in CalWORKs funds to contract providers in order to meet the service capacity that will enable them to expedite implementation of the CalWORKs programs. The amount available for each agency is detailed in Attachment B.

The Amendment format has been approved as to form by County Counsel. The CEO has been advised of the proposed actions. DMH will continue to supervise and monitor contractors' adherences to the LE Agreement's provisions, DMH policies, and performance outcomes.

# **CONTRACTING PROCESS**

On January 11, 2010, DMH issued an RFP to provide CalWORKs mental health supportive services. The issuance of the RFP was in accordance with State requirements regarding the allocation of CalWORKs funding within Los Angeles County. The RFP was distributed to agencies on the Departmental Bidders list, which included minority agencies. Announcements were published in local community and ethnic newspapers as well as DMH's own Internet site.

On February 2, 2010, DMH held a mandatory bidders' conference that was attended by 170 people, representing 106 agencies. DMH received 54 complete proposals by February 23, 2010. There were 31 qualified proposals that would be potential awardees. Seven panels, comprised of individuals representing the Department of Public Health, DPSS, and DMH, met to review and evaluate the proposals' program components on a standard evaluation scale. After notification of the RFP results, 21 debriefings were requested by 15 agencies, some of whom submitted proposals for multiple service areas.

After completing the 21 requested debriefings, four agencies requested PCSRs in five different service areas. To allow for the protest process, your Board approved additional six-month funding extension periods, between July 1, 2011, to December 31, 2011, for existing CalWORKs providers to continue services without interruption. DMH conducted a thorough review of the various issues raised in the five separate PCSRs, and after several months, the PCSR process has recently been completed.

The final award recipients are anticipated to be determined during the requested extension period of January 1, 2012, through June 30, 2012. Should any of the existing 29 LE contract providers not be awarded CalWORKs funds as a result of the RFP process, those contract providers will be given 30 days to transition their existing CalWORKs participants to those successful CalWORKs awardees under contract with DMH. The Department will return to your Board to request authority to award CalWORKs funding contracts to the successful proposers.

# **IMPACT ON CURRENT SERVICES (OR PROJECTS)**

The 29 LE contract providers have existing agreements with DMH, and the addition of CalWORKs funding to these contract service providers is being requested to continue providing services without interruption, pending DMH's completion of the RFP process.

WHEREAS, County and Contractor have entered into a written Agreement, dated \_\_\_\_\_\_, identified as County Agreement No. <u>MH120</u>\_\_\_\_\_, and any subsequent amendments (hereafter collectively "Agreement"); and

WHEREAS, County and Contractor intend to amend Agreement only as described hereunder; and

WHEREAS, County and Contractor intend to amend Agreement to <u>add</u> California Work Opportunity and Responsibility To Kids (CalWORKs) funding to this Agreement in order for Contractor to provide services for up to six additional months, beginning January 1, 2012 and continuing on a month-to month basis through June 30, 2012 to avoid a disruption in services while DMH completes its pending CalWORKs solicitation process intended to identify gualified CalWORKs providers; and

WHEREAS, for FY 2011-12 only, the CalWORKs six-month funding allocation shall not exceed the FY 2011-12 allowable CalWORKs Maximum Program Amount of \$

WHEREAS, for FY 2011-12 only, the Maximum Contract Amount (MCA) shall be increased by \$\_\_\_\_\_, with a revised MCA of \$\_\_\_\_\_.

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NOW, THEREFORE, County and Contractor agree that Agreement shall be amended only as follows:

1. Financial Exhibit A (FINANCIAL PROVISIONS), Attachment II, Paragraph C (Reimbursement for Initial Period) shall be deleted in its entirety and the following substituted therefore:

#### "C. REIMBURSEMENT FOR INITIAL PERIOD

(1) The Maximum Contract Amount for the Initial Period of this Agreement as described in Paragraph 1 (TERM) of the Legal Entity Agreement shall not exceed\_\_\_\_\_

(\$\_\_\_\_\_) and shall consist of Funded Programs as shown on the Financial Summary."

All references in Agreement to Financial Summary for FY 2011-12 shall be deemed amended to state "Financial Summary -\_\_\_\_\_ for FY 2011-12."
- 4. Except as provided in this Amendment, all other terms and conditions of the Agreement shall remain in full force and effect.
