**APPROVAL TO FURTHER IMPLEMENT THE MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES ACT –
COMMUNITY SERVICES AND SUPPORTS PLAN THROUGH THE
TRANSFORMATION OF SERVICES BY CONTRACT AGENCIES
(SUPERVISORIAL DISTRICT 1)
(3 VOTES)**

SUBJECT:

Request approval to amend agreements with two contract agencies reflecting their transformation and/or expansion of services to further implement the Mental Health Services Act – Community Services and Supports Plan.

IT IS RECOMMENDED THAT YOUR BOARD:

1. Approve and authorize the Director of Mental Health, or his designee, to prepare, sign, and execute an Amendment, substantially similar to Attachment I, to the existing Department of Mental Health (DMH) Legal Entity (LE) Agreement No. MH120319 with ASC Treatment Group dba The Anne Sippi Clinic (ASC). This agency has been given the opportunity to transform core mental health services to Institutions for Mental Diseases (IMD) Step-down services, a component of the Mental Health Services Act (MHSA) Community Services and Supports (CSS) Plan in the amount of \$31,000, effective upon Board approval through June 30, 2009. The Maximum Contract Amount (MCA) will remain unchanged. This Amendment is fully funded by MHSA funds.
2. Approve and authorize the Director of Mental Health, or his designee, to prepare, sign, and execute an Amendment, substantially similar to Attachment II, to the existing DMH LE Agreement No. MH120353 with Gateways Hospital and Mental Health Center (Gateways Hospital) for the provision of a Wellness Center effective upon Board approval through June 30, 2009. This Amendment

increases the MCA for Fiscal Year (FY) 2008-09 by \$136,000 from \$15,867,300 to \$16,003,300. This Amendment is fully funded by MHSA funds.

3. Delegate authority to the Director of Mental Health, or his designee, to prepare, sign, and execute future amendments to these agreements and establish as a new MCA the aggregate of the original agreements and all amendments, provided that: 1) the County's total payments to each contractor under their respective Agreements for FY 2008-09 will not exceed an increase of 20 percent from the applicable Board-approved MCAs; 2) any such increase will be used to provide additional services or reflect program changes; 3) your Board has appropriated sufficient funds for all changes; 4) approval of the Chief Executive Office (CEO) and County Counsel, or designees, is obtained prior to any such amendment; 5) the parties may, by written amendment, reduce programs or services and revise the applicable MCA; and 6) the Director of Mental Health will notify your Board of Agreement changes in writing within 30 days after execution of each Amendment.

PURPOSE/JUSTIFICATION OF RECOMMENDED ACTIONS

Board approval of the requested actions will allow ASC to transform services traditionally funded by County General Funds (CGF) into an IMD Step-down Program funded by MHSA CSS Plan. ASC serves mentally ill clients, including both Lanterman-Petris-Short (LPS) mental health conservatees and voluntary clients 18 years and older, who require intensive support to maintain stable community placement. Transformation of ASC services to an IMD Step-down program will enable ASC to provide recovery-based supportive mental health services to its clients and minimize operational costs for clients transitioning from higher levels of care to the community.

The recommended actions would add funding to the Gateways Hospital Agreement for implementation of a Wellness Center in keeping with the MHSA CSS Plan approved by your Board on October 11, 2005. Funding for the Wellness Center, which was provided to replace a vocational workshop program that was funded through CGF until FY 2007-08, was inadvertently omitted from the FY 2008-09 Agreement with Gateways Hospital. Gateways Hospital's Wellness Center will serve clients who have demonstrated and expressed a desire to take the next step of self-directed responsibility in advanced stages of recovery. To further reintegrate those clients into the community, Gateways Hospital's Wellness Center will promote both recovery and sustained wellness through an emphasis on proactive behavior, preventative strategies, and self-responsibility.

In addition, upon Board approval the Director of Mental Health will have authority to enter into future amendments to the Agreements to adjust services as necessary, subject to prior approval by the CEO and County Counsel, or designees, and notification to your Board.

Implementation of Strategic Plan Goals

The recommended actions are consistent with County Strategic Plan Goal 4, Health and Mental Health.

FISCAL IMPACT/FINANCING

DMH will use unspent FY 2007-08 MHSA CSS Plan funds available from implementation delays in the directly operated and LE contract agency CSS programs to fund these Amendments. The MCA of ASC will remain unchanged and the MCA of the Gateways Hospital will increase from \$15,867,300 to \$16,003,300.

The recommended action for ASC will decrease net County cost by \$31,000 to help mitigate the shortfall in Vehicle License Fees (VLF) in FY 2008-09. The recommended action for Gateways Hospital is fully funded with MHSA funds and does not increase net County cost.

FACTS AND PROVISIONS/LEGAL REQUIREMENTS

On June 17, 2008, your Board authorized DMH to allow 62 of DMH's contract agencies the opportunity to provide MHSA services through transformation to new and/or expanded MHSA programs for FY 2008-09 due to adverse budgetary circumstances that required the reduction of core programs funded through CGF. To further mitigate the ongoing CGF budget shortfall due to the reductions in sales tax realignment and VLF resulting from the economic downturn, DMH offered its contract agencies the opportunity to transform additional core mental health programs to the new recovery and wellness-based system of care funded by MHSA. In response, 29 DMH LE contract agencies have requested and been granted the opportunity to transform additional services into new and/or expanded MHSA funded services and/or programs. All of the 29 agencies, with the exception of ASC, were part of the original 62 agencies included in the June 17, 2008, Board action; therefore, the other 28 agencies are not included in this request.

Due to DMH's budget shortfalls for FYs 2007-08 and 2008-09, DMH has been streamlining expenditures and undertaking budget reductions. At the same time DMH has been notified that it will receive additional MHSA CSS Plan service dollars in

FY 2009-10, which will provide ongoing funding for these programs. Therefore, approval of the recommended actions will allow DMH and its network of contract agencies the opportunity to transform and deliver new MHSA recovery and wellness-based services and mitigate the impact of the budget shortfall on the agencies and their clients due to the economic downturn.

IMD Step-down Programs are designed to provide recovery-based intensive and supportive services in community housing. ASC will serve persons being discharged from IMDs, acute psychiatric inpatient units or intensive residential facilities, or those who are at risk of being placed in these higher levels of care. Staffing consists of a multi-disciplinary team of mental health workers and specialized programming provided 7 days per week and 24-hour per day emergency capacity. Services include medication support, individual and group treatment, crisis intervention, and targeted case management.

The focus of the Gateways Hospital's Wellness Center is the underserved population of adults with serious mental illness who have committed criminal offenses due to their mental illness. These clients are adult men and women between the ages of 18 and 59 of diverse ethnicities with severe and persistent mental illness which compromises their ability to develop and utilize daily living skills and which has impaired their functioning within society. They are frequently under-employed, under-educated, under-socialized, and psychiatrically untreated or under-treated. The Gateways Hospital's Wellness Center will focus on the provision of peer guided support and linkages to available resources, guided by the individual's needs. The Gateways Hospital's Wellness Center will provide psychiatric supervision of medication regimes; provide clients the opportunity to learn about maintaining healthy relationships, participate in socialization activities, and provide education in life skills, plus education and information on the stabilization of bio-psychosocial influences on their lives.

The Amendment formats have been approved as to form by County Counsel. The CEO has reviewed the proposed actions. Clinical and administrative staff of DMH will administer and supervise the agreements, evaluate programs to ensure that quality services are being provided to clients, and ensure that the LE Agreement provisions and DMH policies are being followed.

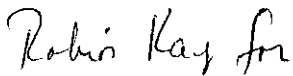

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IMPACT ON CURRENT SERVICES

AMENDMENT NO. 2

THIS AMENDMENT is made and entered into this 1st day of April, 2009, by and between the COUNTY OF LOS ANGELES (hereafter "County") and ASC Treatment Group dba The Anne Sippi clinic (hereafter "Contractor").

WHEREAS, County and Contractor have entered into a written Agreement, dated December 2, 2008, identified as County Agreement No. MH120319, and any subsequent amendment (hereafter collectively "Agreement"); and

WHEREAS, for Fiscal Year (FY) 2008-09 only, County and Contractor intend to amend Agreement described hereunder; and

WHEREAS, for FY 2008-09 only, County and Contractor intend to amend Agreement to decrease non-Early and Periodic Screening, Diagnosis, and Treatment (non-EPSDT) CGF match funds in the amount of \$31,000; and

WHEREAS, as the Department moves from its traditional core mental health programs to a new recovery and wellness-based system of care, Contractor shall be given an opportunity to deliver transformed services as part of the Mental Health Services Act (MHSA) Community Services and Support Plan (CSS Plan) ; and

WHEREAS, for FY 2008-09 only, County and Contractor intend to amend Agreement to enable Contractor to "transform" a portion of its curtailed outpatient services and resources to MHSA - CSS Plan services using unspent FY 2008-09 MHSA - CSS Plan funds. This will require Contractor to transform those general outpatient

services previously funded with non-MHSA and/or other State and/or County funds to new MHSA CSS - Plan programs and will require Contractor staff to provide services prescribed and approved under the MHSA - CSS Plan; and

WHEREAS, for FY 2008-09 only, County and Contractor intend and agree that Contractor's transformation of a portion of its curtailed outpatient services and resources to MHSA CSS Plan services for FY 2008-09, does not guarantee to Contractor continued funding for such services after FY 2008-09; and

WHEREAS, for FY 2008-09 only, County and contractor intend to amend Agreement to add the following Provisional Rate under Cost Reimbursement for Supportive Services (Client Supportive Services – Mode 60, Service Function Code 64/70-79), under Provider Number 7589; and

IMD STEP-DOWN:

WHEREAS, for FY 2008-09 only, County and Contractor intend to amend Agreement to add MHSA Adult Institution for Mental Diseases (IMD) Step-down non-EPSDT Medi-Cal match funds in the amount of \$31,000; and

AVAILABILITY OF MHSA FUNDS:

WHEREAS, for FY 2008-09 only, County and Contractor intend to amend Agreement to add Paragraph V. (1) under Financial Exhibit A (FINANCIAL PROVISIONS), Attachment II, to include whereby in the event MHSA funds are not made available by the State to pay MHSA claims or if the State denies any or all of the MHSA claims submitted by County on behalf of Contractor, County is not responsible for any substantive payment obligation; and

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REDUCTION/REALLOCATION OF MHSA FUNDS:

WHEREAS, notwithstanding the provisions set forth in Financial Exhibit A (FINANCIAL PROVISIONS), Attachment II, Paragraph U (Delegated Authority) of this Agreement, County shall evaluate Contractor utilization of MHSA funding allocated under this Agreement and shall adjust and reallocate amounts to any one or a combination of the following: 1) another Legal Entity contractor, 2) DMH directly operated clinics, and/or 3) the County DMH reserve of unallocated funding for MHSA services. Amounts to be reduced and reallocated will be based on County's projected underutilization of such MHSA funds; and

WHEREAS, County will perform its utilization review after the initial MHSA amendments are executed and annually thereafter, or as deemed necessary by County based on County's review of utilization of such MHSA funds under this Agreement. Notification of such actions to Contractor will follow timeframes prescribed in Financial Exhibit A (FINANCIAL PROVISIONS), Attachment II, Paragraph U (Delegated Authority); and

WHEREAS, for FY 2008-09 only, \$31,000 of MHSA funds will be transformed to new program in FY 2008-09 under the MHSA - CSS Plan; and

WHEREAS, for FY 2008-09 only, the total Maximum Contract Amount (MCA) of \$1,369,800 will remain unchanged.

NOW, THEREFORE, County and Contractor agree that Agreement shall be amended only as follows:

1. Paragraph 3 (DESCRIPTION OF SERVICES/ACTIVITIES), shall be deleted in its entirety and the following substituted therefore:

"3. DESCRIPTION OF SERVICES/ACTIVITIES: Contractor shall provide mental health services in the form as identified on the Financial Summary(ies) and Service Exhibit(s) and in the Program Description of Contractor's Negotiation Package for this Agreement as approved in writing by Director or his designee, including any addenda thereto as approved in writing by Director or his designee. Services provided by Contractor shall be the same regardless of the patient's/client's ability to pay or source of payment.

Contractor shall be responsible for delivering services to new clients to the extent that funding is provided by County. Where Contractor determines that services to new clients can no longer be delivered, Contractor shall provide 30 calendar days prior notice to County. Contractor shall also thereafter make referrals of new clients to County or other appropriate agencies.

Contractor shall not be required to provide the notice in the preceding paragraph when County reduces funding to Contractor, either at the beginning or during the fiscal year. In addition, when County cuts the funding for a particular program provided by Contractor, Contractor shall not be responsible for continuing services for those clients linked to that funding. Contractor shall also thereafter make referrals of those clients to County or other appropriate agencies.

Contractor may provide activities claimable as Title XIX Medi-Cal Administrative Activities pursuant to WIC Section 14132.44. The administrative activities which may be claimable as Title XIX Medi-Cal Administrative Activities are shown on the Financial Summary and are described in the policies and procedures

provided by SDMH and/or SDHS.

Contractor may provide mental health services claimable as Early and Periodic Screening, Diagnosis, and Treatment (EPSDT) services.

If, during Contractor's provision of services under this Agreement, there is any need for substantial deviation from the services as described in Contractor's Negotiation Package for this Agreement, as approved in writing by Director or his designee, including any addenda thereto as approved in writing by Director or his designee, then Contractor shall submit a written request to Director or his designee for written approval before any such substantial deviation may occur. A 30% variance of actual services from those projected and shown by Contractor in the Negotiation Package will be considered a substantial deviation in service delivery. The following language applies only to *Contractors found eligible to provide mental health services claimable under the Mental Health Services Act (MHSA)*: Contractor has been found to be eligible to provide mental health services claimable as MHSA services. Contractor has demonstrated experience and training in its specialized field and has submitted to the County a Statement of Qualifications (SOQ) in response to County's RFSQ for the provision of such services, and Contractor has met the minimum qualifications listed in the RFSQ and has been selected for recommendation for placement on a MHSA Master Agreement eligibility list. Placement on the Master Agreement eligibility list does not guarantee that Contractor will be selected to provide mental health services claimable as MHSA services. In order to provide mental health services claimable as MHSA services, a provider must have been selected to provide MHSA services

pursuant to a Request for Services and/or through transformation to a new or expanded MHSA program(s).”

2. Financial Exhibit A (FINANCIAL PROVISIONS), Attachment II, Paragraph D (Billing and Payment Procedures and Limitations), Subparagraph 5 (a) (Special Claiming Conditions – Mental Health Services Act) shall be deleted in its entirety and the following substituted therefor:

“(5) Special Claiming Conditions:

(a) Mental Health Services Act (MHSA): The execution of Amendments issued under the MHSA Request for Statement of Qualifications (RFSQ) does not guarantee a Contractor any amount of funding. Contractor shall not be entitled to any payment of MHSA funds by County under this Agreement except pursuant to validly executed and satisfactorily performed Work Orders or Amendments completed in accordance with County issued MHSA Request for Services (RFS) that includes a specific and detailed Statement(s) of Work and/or through transformation to a new or expanded MHSA program(s).. Nothing herein is intended nor shall be construed as creating any exclusive arrangement with Contractor. This Agreement shall not restrict County from acquiring similar, equal or like MHSA goods and/or services from other entities or sources.”

3. Financial Exhibit A (FINANCIAL PROVISIONS), Attachment II, Paragraphs B (Reimbursement for Initial Period) shall be deleted in its entirety and the following substituted therefore:

“B. REIMBURSEMENT FOR INITIAL PERIOD: The Maximum Contract Amount for the Initial Period of this Agreement as described in Paragraph 1(TERM) shall not

exceed ONE MILLION THREE HUNDRED SIXTY-NINE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$1,369,800) and shall consist of County, State, and/or Federal funds as shown on the Financial Summary.”

4. For FY 2008-09, Financial Exhibit A (FINANCIAL PROVISIONS), Attachment II, Paragraph V (MHSA Funds) shall be added in its entirety:

“V: Mental Health Services Act (MHSA) Funds:

- (1) In the event MHSA funds are not made available by the State to pay MHSA claims or if the State denies any or all of the MHSA claims submitted by County on behalf of Contractor, County is not responsible for any substantive payment obligation and, accordingly, Contractor shall not seek any payment from County and shall indemnify and hold harmless County from any and all liability for payment of any or all of the denied MHSA claims or claims for which MHSA funds are not made available by the State.”
5. Financial Summary for FY 2008-09 shall be deleted in its entirety and replaced with Financial Summary – 2 for FY 2008-09, attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference. All references in Agreement to Financial Summary for FY 2008-09 shall be deemed amended to state “Financial Summary – 2 for FY 2008-09.”
 6. Attachment IV, Service Delivery Site Exhibit, shall be deleted in its entirety and replaced with the revised Attachment IV, Service Delivery Site Exhibit – 2. All references in Agreement to Attachment IV, Service Delivery Site Exhibit shall be deemed amended to state Attachment IV, Service Delivery Site Exhibit – 2.

7. Attachment V, Service Exhibits, shall be deleted in their entirety and replaced with the revised Attachment V, Service Exhibits – 2. All referenced in Agreement to Attachment V, Service Exhibits shall be deemed amended to state Attachment V, Service Exhibits – 2.
8. A Service Exhibit for “Client Supportive Services – Mental Health Services Act Programs” shall be added to this Agreement.
9. Contractor shall provide services in accordance with the Contractor’s FY 2006-07 Negotiation Package for this Agreement and any addenda thereto approved in writing by Director.
10. Except as provided in this Amendment, all other terms and conditions of the Agreement shall remain in full force and effect.

WHEREAS, for FY 2008-09 only, County and Contractor intend to amend Agreement to add MHSA Wellness Centers Non Medi-Cal funds in the amount of \$88,133 and MHSA Wellness Centers Non-EPDST match in the amount of \$36,000; and

WHEREAS, for FY 2008-09 only, County and Contractor intend to amend Agreement to increase Non EPSDT – FFP in the amount of \$36,000; and

WHEREAS, for FY 2008-09 only, County and Contractor intend to amend Agreement to add the following services to Provider Number 6757: Crisis Intervention, Mode 15, Service Function Codes (SFC) 70-79, Mental Health Promotion, Mode 45, SFC 10-19, and Community Client Services, Mode 45, SFC 20-29; and

WHEREAS, for FY 2008-09 only the Maximum Contract Amount (MCA) will increase by \$136,000 with a revised MCA of \$16,003,300; and

NOW, THEREFORE, County and Contractor agree that Agreement shall be amended only as follows:

1. Financial Exhibit A (FINANCIAL PROVISIONS), Attachment II, Paragraph B (Reimbursement For Initial Period) shall be deleted in its entirety and the following substituted therefor:

“B. Reimbursement For Initial Period: The MCA for the Initial Period of this Agreement as described in Paragraph 1 (TERM) shall not exceed SIXTEEN MILLION THREE THOUSAND AND THREE HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$16,003,300) and shall consist of.”

2. Financial Summary – 1 for Fiscal Year 2008-09 shall be deleted in its entirety and replaced with Financial Summary – 3 for Fiscal Year 2008-09, attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference. All references in Agreement to Financial Summary – 1 for Fiscal Year 2008-09 shall be deemed amended to state “Financial Summary – 3 for Fiscal Year 2008-09”.
3. Attachment IV, Service Delivery Site Exhibit, shall be deleted in its entirety and replaced with the revised Attachment IV, Service Delivery Site Exhibit - 3. All

- 4. Contractor shall provide services in accordance with the Contractor's Fiscal Year 2006-07 Negotiation Package for this Agreement and any addenda thereto approved in writing by Director.
- 5. Except as provided in this Amendment, all other terms and conditions of the Agreement shall remain in full force and effect.
