**REQUEST AUTHORIZATION TO RETROACTIVELY AMEND PEDIATRIC AND  
FAMILY MEDICAL CENTER'S AGREEMENT FOR FISCAL YEAR 2006-07  
(SUPERVISORIAL DISTRICT 1)  
(3 VOTES)**

**SUBJECT**

Request approval to amend, retroactively, the Department of Mental Health's Legal Entity Contract with Pediatric and Family Medical Center dba Eisner Pediatric and Family Medical Center to increase the maximum contract amount by \$9,784 for fiscal year 2006-07.

**IT IS RECOMMENDED THAT YOUR BOARD:**

Approve and instruct the Director of Mental Health, or his designee, to sign and execute three copies of Amendment No. 4 (substantially similar to Attachment) to Contract No. MH120117 with Pediatric and Family Medical Center dba Eisner Pediatric and Family Medical Center (Eisner) for fiscal year (FY) 2006-07. The Amendment will be effective May 20, 2008, and will increase the maximum contract amount (MCA) for Eisner for FY 2006-07 by \$9,784 from \$720,000 to \$729,784 and will be funded by federal financial participation (FFP) Medi-Cal revenue of \$4,892, Early and Periodic Screening, Diagnosis, and Treatment (EPSDT) State general funds (SGF) of \$4,176 and matching County general funds (CGF) of \$716.

**PURPOSE/JUSTIFICATION OF RECOMMENDED ACTIONS**

The Department of Mental Health (DMH) pays contractors for services provided to Short-Doyle/Medi-Cal (SD/MC) eligible clients based on approved claims from the State. All claims submitted by DMH to the State are accompanied by a DMH certification on a standard State form representing the claims are medically necessary services to Medi-Cal beneficiaries. The certification also states that the County has sufficient funds to pay the local match.

Under normal circumstances, the Department, upon reaching the contract maximum for any contract provider, would wait until the cost settlement process to make additional payments either within its delegated authority and/or through a Board approved amendment.

However, the State notified the Department on May 29, 2008, that if, by Monday, June 2, 2008 the Department was unable to certify that it had actually paid all claims that had been processed and approved by the State for FY 2006-07, the State would be unable to release any additional monies to the County for that fiscal year until: 1) the full certification could be made; and 2) the State's FY 2008-09 budget was adopted.

At the time, the State was holding approximately \$96.6 million in federal funds due to the County related to FY 2006-07 claims, resulting in a loss of interest to the County of approximately \$8,500 per day based on the treasury pool rates at the time.

In order to meet the State's deadline, DMH made payments to providers for all the FY 2006-07 SD/MC approvals up to the existing MCA in their legal entity (LE) Agreements. To make additional payments beyond the MCA, DMH amended the LE Agreements, where necessary, to increase the MCA up to the 20 percent increase allowed under delegated authority from your Board. The last Board approved MCA of \$600,000 for Eisner was increased by 20 percent to \$720,000 via an Amendment. However, in order to meet the State's requirements for certification of the full amount adjudicated, the Department determined that it was in the best interest of the County to pay Eisner the full \$129,784 for services rendered, and to file a letter with your Board at the earliest possible date to request retroactive approval of the attached amendment to increase the MCA by \$9,784 to \$729,784.

### **Retroactive Contracts Review Committee**

On June 25, 2008, DMH presented this proposed action to the Retroactive Contracts Review Committee. The Committee agreed that given the circumstances, DMH's decision to move forward with payment prior to Board approval was appropriate. However, the Committee expressed three primary concerns: 1) that the State process forced the Department into an "all or nothing" scenario; 2) how the Department intends to prevent future instances of contractors exceeding their contract maximums; and 3) that the State has not been timely in reimbursing the County federal funds owed.

DMH does not expect a similar instance to occur in the future since, on a go-forward basis, the Department will have additional options available to it to remedy the situation and/or to obtain Board approval prior to making any payment. In order to facilitate this process, DMH is reviewing alternative methods for approving and authorizing payments to contractors that would help ensure that contractors stay within their maximum contract amounts. The payment, settlement and auditing of SD/MC claims is a multi-year process and, therefore, requires a significant amount of analysis to determine the potential impact on both contractors and the County throughout the various stages of the process depending on a variety of factors. A revised payment process will be included in the revised LE agreement format to be brought before your Board for approval later this year. The revised contract language should resolve any future potential exposure related to either of the first two concerns of the Committee. In order to address the third concern, DMH, the Chief Executive Office (CEO) and County Counsel will review any potential legislative or legal solutions to ensure that federal funds are reimbursed to the County in a timely fashion.

### **Implementation of Strategic Plan Goals**

The recommended Board action supports Goal 4, Fiscal Responsibility, of the County Strategic Plan.

### **FISCAL IMPACT/FINANCING**

There is no impact on net County cost. The amendment in the amount of \$9,784 was fully funded with FFP Medi-Cal revenue totaling \$4,892, EPSDT SGF totaling \$4,176, and CGF totaling \$716 from appropriation contained within the Department's FY 2007-08 Final Adopted Budget.

By paying Eisner in advance of Board approval, the Department avoided a delay in the County's receipt of the federal funds. The State was able to process approximately \$61 million of the \$96.6 million owed to the County for FY 2006-07 before the deadline. The receipt of these funds avoided the loss of interest revenue to the County which, based on current treasury pool rates, is estimated at between \$483,000 and \$645,000 depending upon when the State budget is approved.

### **FACTS AND PROVISIONS/LEGAL REQUIREMENTS**

In February 2008, the State DMH and Department of Health Care Services advised DMH of their belief that their approved certification did not meet the federal requirements for a Certified Public Expense (CPE) necessary to claim FFP funds, and that an actual cash disbursement to the provider was necessary prior to certification of the expenditure. The State wanted the County to pay providers prior to submission of their claims to the State for approval, however, that was not consistent with the existing County agreements. To resolve this issue, the State and County negotiated a bifurcated process in which an initial certification is made by DMH at the time claims are submitted for adjudication, followed by a second certification after payments to providers have been made.

However, the State also is requiring that the amount in this second certification exactly match the amounts of adjudicated claims and refused to release any additional payment to DMH for any providers' services, until a certification of payment to all providers is made. As previously mentioned, the State notified the Department of this requirement in May 2008 and then informed the Department on May 29, 2008, that if the Department was unable to certify all expenditures by Monday, June 2, 2008 the State would be unable to release any additional monies to the County until after the passage of the State's FY 2008-09 budget.

Eisner is located at 1500 South Olive Street, Los Angeles, California 90015, in Supervisorial District 1, Mental Health Service Area 4. Eisner is a private, non-profit health center dedicated to providing high quality medical and dental care, mental health services, children's day care and early intervention programs to residents on the southern-most edge of downtown Los Angeles. Eisner serves the Downtown Corridor, parts of Central and South Central Los Angeles, Skid Row and a portion of Pico Union. Eisner provides outpatient services including Targeted Case Management, mental health services, and medication support to improve the mental health of children, adolescents, and transitional age youth, increase family relationships, and reduce behavioral characteristics of the clients that adversely affect educational performance.

The proposed Amendment has been reviewed by CEO and County Counsel.

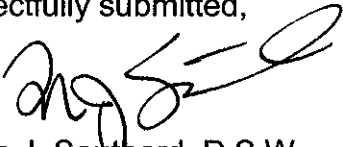
**IMPACT ON CURRENT SERVICES**

AMENDMENT NO. 4

THIS AMENDMENT is made and entered into this \_\_ day of \_\_\_\_, 2008, by and between the COUNTY OF LOS ANGELES (hereafter "County") and Pediatric & Family Medical Center dba Eisner Pediatric & Family Medical Center (hereafter "Contractor").

WHEREAS, County and Contractor have entered into a written Agreement, dated June 27, 2006, identified as County Agreement No. MH120117, and any subsequent amendments (hereafter collectively "Agreement"); and

WHEREAS, for Fiscal Year (FY) 2006-07 only, County and Contractor intend to amend Agreement only as described hereunder; and

WHEREAS, for FY 2006-07 only, County and Contractor intend to amend Agreement to increase the Maximum Contract Amount (MCA) to enable County to make additional payments to Contractor for FY 2006-07; and

WHEREAS, for FY 2006-07 only, County and Contractor intend to amend Agreement to increase Early and Periodic Screening, Diagnosis, and Treatment (EPSDT) - County General Funds (CGF) by \$716, increase EPSDT - State General Funds (SGF) by \$4,176 and increase EPSDT-Federal Financial Participation (FFP) funds by \$4,892; and

WHEREAS, for FY 2006-07 only, the MCA will increase by \$9,784 with a revised MCA of \$729,784.

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NOW, THEREFORE, County and Contractor agree that Agreement shall be amended only as follows:

1. Paragraph 4 (FINANCIAL PROVISIONS), Subparagraph C (Reimbursement For Initial Period) shall be deleted in its entirety and the following substituted therefor:
  - B. Reimbursement For Initial Period: The Maximum Contract Amount for the Initial Period of this Agreement as described in Paragraph 1 (TERM) shall not exceed SEVEN HUNDRED TWENTY-NINE THOUSAND SEVEN HUNDRED EIGHTY-FOUR DOLLARS (\$729,784) and shall consist of County, State, and/or Federal funds as shown on the Financial Summary. This Maximum Contract Amount includes Cash Flow Advance which is repayable through cash and/or appropriate Service Function Code (SFC) units and/or actual and allowable costs as authorized by other provisions of this Agreement. Notwithstanding any other provision of this Agreement, in no event shall County pay Contractor more than this Maximum Contract Amount for Contractor's performance hereunder during the Initial Period. Furthermore, Contractor shall inform County when up to 75 percent (75%) of the Maximum Contract Amount has been incurred. Contractor shall send such notice to those persons and addresses which are set forth in Paragraph 61 (NOTICES)."
2. The Financial Summary - 3 (Attachment II) for Fiscal Year 2006-07 only shall be deleted in its entirety and replaced with The Financial Summary - 4 (Attachment II) for Fiscal Year 2006-07 only, attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference. All references in Agreement to The Financial Summary - 3 for Fiscal

Year 2006-07 shall be deemed amended to state "Financial Summary - 4 for Fiscal Year 2006-07."

3. Contractor shall provide services in accordance with Contractor's Fiscal Year 2004-05 Negotiation Package for this Agreement and any addenda thereto approved in writing by director.
4. Except as provided in this Amendment, all other terms and conditions of the Agreement shall remain in full force and effect.

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IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the Board of Supervisors of the County of Los Angeles has caused this Amendment to be subscribed by County's Director of Mental Health or his designee, and Contractor has caused this Amendment to be subscribed in its behalf by its duly authorized officer, the day, month, and year first above written.
