**APPROVAL OF REQUEST FOR APPROPRIATION ADJUSTMENT FOR  
SHORT-DOYLE/MEDI-CAL SETTLEMENT PAYMENTS TO CONTRACT PROVIDERS  
FOR FISCAL YEARS 2000-2001 AND 2002-2003 SERVICES  
AND  
APPROVAL TO AMEND 13 DEPARTMENT OF MENTAL HEALTH LEGAL ENTITY  
AGREEMENTS WITH CONTRACT PROVIDERS FOR FISCAL YEAR 2002-2003  
(ALL SUPERVISORIAL DISTRICTS)  
(4 VOTES)**

**IT IS RECOMMENDED THAT YOUR BOARD:**

1. Approve the Request for Appropriation Adjustment for Fiscal Year (FY) 2006-2007 in the amount of \$7,272,000 (Attachment I). The appropriation increase will be fully funded with prior year revenue from Short-Doyle/Medi-Cal (SD/MC) Federal Financial Participation (FFP) in the amount of \$3,813,000 held in the FFP Trust Account and Early and Periodic Screening, Diagnosis, and Treatment (EPSDT) State General Funds (SGF) in the amount of \$3,459,000 held in Advances Payable. The increase in appropriation will allow the Department of Mental Health (DMH) to make the following reimbursements:
  - a. FY 2000-2001 State Audited Cost Report Settlements in the amount of \$619,000 to 32 contract providers listed on Attachment II.
  - b. FY 2002-2003 State SD/MC Reconciliation Settlement in the amount of \$6,653,000 to a total of 50 providers which include 48 contract providers and two (2) Department of Health Services (DHS) Hospitals listed on Attachment III.

2. Approve and authorize the Director of Mental Health or his designee to prepare, sign, and execute Amendments to 13 DMH Legal Entity Agreements (LE Agreements), listed in Attachment IV and substantially similar in format to Attachment V, in order to make SD/MC Settlement Payments for FY 2002-2003 to contract providers whose payments will exceed their Maximum Contract Amount (MCA).

### **PURPOSE/JUSTIFICATION OF RECOMMENDED ACTIONS**

The purpose of this request is for approval of an appropriation adjustment increasing FY 2006-2007 Services and Supplies (S&S) appropriation by \$7,272,000. This is a routine Board action regularly requested of your Board to reimburse contract providers at the end of the County and State SD/MC Reconciliation and EPSDT Settlement, State Audited Cost Report Settlement, and Final Cost Report Settlement processes. This appropriation adjustment will enable DMH to make the FY 2000-2001 State Audited Cost Report Settlement and FY 2002-2003 SD/MC Reconciliation Settlement payments to DHS Hospitals and contract providers as required by Federal law and the DMH LE Agreement. Subsequent steps in the State's audit and appeals processes may occur at future dates with potential adjustments to these contract provider claims.

As per the LE Agreement with mental health contract providers, if the post-contract audit conducted by County, State, and/or Federal personnel determines that the County's liability is more than the amount paid by the County to the contract provider, the County will reimburse contract providers the remaining amounts due. DMH's action to collect from or reimburse contract providers is the result of the State fulfilling its responsibilities for the management and oversight of the Federal Medicaid program, which is called Medi-Cal in California. DMH, in its capacity, acts as the fiscal intermediary. As a result, DMH will collect from or reimburse contract providers.

Board approval of the recommended appropriation adjustment will enable DMH to address underpayment to the contract providers and authorize the appropriate payment to settle accounts with them under their LE Agreements for FY 2000-2001 and FY 2002-2003.

Further, DMH requests authority to amend its LE Agreements with 13 contract providers for FY 2002-2003, in order to pay contract providers FFP and EPSDT-SGF amount(s) in excess of their MCA. Reimbursement for FFP and EPSDT-SGF shall be one hundred percent of the program funds that are paid by County to Contractor solely in County's capacity as the fiscal intermediary. FFP and EPSDT services shall be paid as applicable on the basis of fifty percent EPSDT Title XIX services FFP funds and fifty

percent State matching general funds for EPSDT and only when such EPSDT services exceed the individual Contractor's EPSDT baseline as identified in Paragraph 4 (FINANCIAL PROVISIONS), Subparagraph A (3) (EPSDT).

**Implementation of Strategic Plan Goals**

The recommended Board action is consistent with the principles of Countywide Strategic Plan Organizational Goal No. 4, "Fiscal Responsibility." Board approval of this request will enable DMH to pay amounts owed to DHS Hospitals and contract providers that resulted from post-contract reconciliation, audit, and appeals processes conducted by the County and/or State.

**FISCAL IMPACT/FINANCING**

There is no increase in net County cost.

The appropriation adjustment of \$7,272,000 is fully funded with prior year SD/MC FFP in the amount of \$3,813,000 held in the FFP trust account and EPSDT-SGF in the amount of \$3,459,000 held in Advances Payable. This appropriation adjustment will enable DMH to reimburse contract providers and DHS Hospitals as indicated in Attachments II and III, and as shown in the following summary:

The FY 2000-2001 State Audited Cost Report Settlement has identified 32 contract providers with FFP Medi-Cal services in the amount of \$619,000. In FY 2000-2001, FFP Medi-Cal funding was not part of the MCA. The FFP Medi-Cal funding was pass-through from the State to DMH. DMH, in its capacity as fiscal intermediary, has received pass-through payments from the State, and in turn, is required to disburse such payments to the contract providers.

The FY 2002-2003 State SD/MC Reconciliation Settlement identified 48 contract providers and two (2) DHS Hospitals with Incurred But Not Reported (IBNR) FFP

Medi-Cal and EPSDT-SGF services in the amount of \$6,653,000. The FY 2002-2003 FFP Medi-Cal and EPSDT-SGF funding was included in the contract providers' MCAs, and will require contract amendments for 13 providers to incorporate the increase for services provided and not included in their contract Financial Summary. The recommended action will increase the MCA by \$3,146,659. The remaining FY 2002-2003, \$3,506,341 amount due is within the providers' MCAs and requires no increase in the MCAs. The overall \$6,653,000 represents disbursements that are federally required to be disbursed to the various contract providers rendering Medi-Cal eligible services to Medi-Cal beneficiaries. The County, in complying with various Federal and State statutes, must disburse the Federal and State funds to the contract providers. The County cannot legally use the funds for any purpose other than reimbursing the rendering Medi-Cal service providers.

#### **FACTS AND PROVISIONS/LEGAL REQUIREMENTS**

This is a routine Board action regularly requested of your Board to reimburse contract providers at the end of the County and State SD/MC Reconciliation and EPSDT Settlement, State Audited Cost Report Settlement, and Final Cost Report Settlement processes. The reconciliation, audit, and final settlement processes lead to underpayment and overpayment determinations.

Medi-Cal dates of service in one (1) fiscal year can be claimed/processed by the State for up to 15 months after the close of the fiscal year in which the services were delivered. In this instance, either mental health service providers did not submit their actual claims to the State or the State did not perform the claim adjudication process until the close of the fiscal year, resulting in IBNR services. IBNR services make it difficult to determine the exact amount of Medi-Cal revenues to report at each County year-end closing because accounting measurability is lacking. As the County operates on a July to June accounting cycle, and Medi-Cal actual cost/approvals for contract providers are not totally known during this time cycle because of IBNR claims, there is the need for budget action in subsequent fiscal year(s) to make prior year Medi-Cal payments. One (1) alternative would be to use current fiscal year appropriation for prior fiscal year Medi-Cal approved service expenditures. While this was done in prior years to maintain more timely payments to contract providers, for accounting purposes the County Auditor-Controller has recommended that DMH match the Medi-Cal revenues to the fiscal year in which the Medi-Cal services were delivered. This practice of requesting, on an as needed and measurable basis, additional appropriation for the prior fiscal year's Medi-Cal services will result in the Auditor-Controller's desired accounting outcome.

If the contract providers have been underpaid, they are reimbursed the appropriate amounts. For FY 2000-2001 only, the LE Agreement requires, if the post-contract audit and the County audit settlement conducted by County, State, and/or Federal personnel determines that the County's liability is more than the amount paid to a service provider for the fiscal year, that the difference be paid by the County to the service provider. Thus, there is no requirement for contract amendments. In FY 2000-2001 FFP Medi-Cal funding was not part of the MCA. The FFP Medi-Cal funding was pass-through from the State to DMH. DMH, in its capacity as fiscal intermediary, has received pass-through payments of Federal funding from the State, and in turn, is required to disburse such payments to 32 contract providers.

For FY 2002-2003 the LE Agreement with the mental health contract providers states that County pays any EPSDT-SGF local matching funds in excess of the EPSDT baseline as identified in Paragraph 4 (FINANCIAL PROVISIONS), Subparagraph A (3) of the Legal Entity Agreement. The FFP Medi-Cal and EPSDT-SGF funding was part of the MCAs in FY 2002-2003. DMH, in its capacity as fiscal intermediary, has received pass-through payments from the State, and in turn, is required to disburse such payments to 48 providers and two (2) DHS Hospitals. To the extent permitted by Federal law, County will pay pass-through funding only if sufficient local funds are available and identifiable within the MCA, backed by the Financial Summary or an increase in State funding for EPSDT services in order to achieve the maximum Federal reimbursement possible for Mental Health services. Thus, it requires that there be contract amendments for 13 of the 50 contract providers who exceeded their FY 2002-2003 FFP MCA, and have EPSDT matching dollars.

In the event contract providers have been overpaid, they are required by the LE Agreement to pay back the amounts to the County. The repayment method could be by cash payment or in the form of offsets against current year's monthly claims for reimbursement.

The State has recently completed its FY 2000-2001 State Audited Cost Report Settlement and the FY 2002-2003 SD/MC Reconciliation, EPSDT settlement process. Based on the mental health contract providers' submission of certified, true, and accurate reimbursement claims, the County will collect \$912,819 for FY 2000-2001 State Audited Cost Report Settlement and \$7,378,144 for FY 2002-2003, a total of \$8,290,963 from contract providers, who have been overpaid. Collection efforts have already begun as per the contract terms for FY 2000-2001 and will begin for the FY 2002-2003 SD/MC Reconciliation, EPSDT settlement to contract providers upon filing of this action with the Board's Executive Office.

This Board action will enable the Department to fulfill its obligation to reimburse \$7,272,000 to 82 contract providers including DHS.

The proposed actions have been reviewed and approved by County Counsel, the Chief Administrative Office, and the Auditor-Controller.

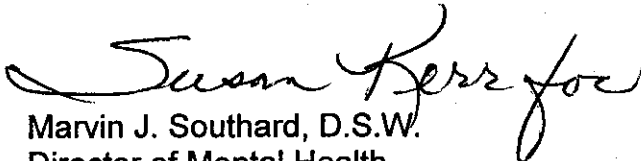

THIS AMENDMENT is made and entered into this \_\_\_\_\_ day of \_\_\_\_\_, 2006, by and between the COUNTY OF LOS ANGELES (hereafter "County") and \_\_\_\_\_ (hereafter "Contractor").

WHEREAS, County and Contractor have entered into a written Agreement, dated October 1, 2002, identified as County Agreement No. DMH-\_\_\_\_\_, and any subsequent amendments (hereafter collectively "Agreement"); and

WHEREAS, for Fiscal Year (FY) 2002-2003 only, County and Contractor intend to amend Agreement only as described hereunder; and

WHEREAS, Contractor rendered and billed the EPSDT Title XIX Medi-Cal program for eligible services rendered to EPSDT Medi-Cal beneficiaries in FY 2002-2003, and the State adjudicated and approved these billable EPSDT services; and

WHEREAS, reimbursement for FFP and EPSDT-SGF shall be one hundred percent of the program funds that are paid by County to Contractor solely in County's capacity as the fiscal intermediary. FFP and EPSDT services shall be paid as applicable on the basis of fifty percent EPSDT Title XIX services FFP funds and fifty percent State matching general funds for EPSDT and only when such EPSDT services exceed the individual Contractor's EPSDT baseline; and

WHEREAS, DMH intends to amend Agreement with Contractor for FY 2002-2003, in order to pay Contractor FFP amounts in excess of its Maximum Contract Amount (MCA); and

WHEREAS, for Fiscal Year 2002-2003, County and Contractor intend to amend Agreement to revise the MCA by adding SD/MC EPSDT-SGF in the amount of \$\_\_\_\_\_ and FFP in the amount of \$\_\_\_\_\_; and **(if applicable)**

WHEREAS, for Fiscal Year 2002-2003, the MCA will be increased by \$\_\_\_\_\_ with a revised MCA of \$\_\_\_\_\_.

NOW, THEREFORE, County and Contractor agree that Agreement shall be amended only as follows:

1. Paragraph 4 (FINANCIAL PROVISIONS), Subparagraph B (Reimbursement For Initial Period) shall be deleted in its entirety and the following substituted therefor:

"B. Reimbursement For Initial Period: The Maximum Contract Amount for the Initial Period of this Agreement as described in Paragraph 1 (TERM) shall not exceed \_\_\_\_\_ DOLLARS (\$\_\_\_\_\_) and shall consist of County, State, and/or Federal (excluding Medicare Partial Hospitalization services) funds as shown in the applicable Financial Exhibit column(s) which are identified on the Financial Summary. This Maximum Contract Amount includes Cash Flow Advance which is repayable through cash and/or appropriate SFC units and/or actual and allowable costs as authorized by other provisions of this Agreement. Notwithstanding any other provision of this Agreement, in no

event shall County pay Contractor more than this Maximum Contract

3. Contractor shall provide services in accordance with the Contractor’s Fiscal Year 2002-2003 Negotiation Package for this Agreement and any addenda thereto approved in writing by Director.
4. Except as provided in this Amendment, all other terms and conditions of the Agreement shall remain in full force and effect.
