ECUTIVE OFFICER

APPROVAL OF AMENDMENTS TO DEPARTMENT OF MENTAL HEALTH LEGAL ENTITY AGREEMENTS WITH MENTAL HEALTH SERVICE PROVIDERS TO PROVIDE SUPPORTIVE AND THERAPEUTIC OPTIONS PROGRAM FUNDS FOR FISCAL YEAR 2002-2003 (ALL SUPERVISORIAL DISTRICTS) (3 VOTES)

IT IS RECOMMENDED THAT YOUR BOARD:

- 1. Approve and instruct the Director of Mental Health, or his designee, to prepare. sign, and execute contract amendments, substantially similar to Attachment I, to the Department of Mental Health (DMH) Legal Entity Agreements (Agreements) for Fiscal Year (FY) 2002-2003 to separate out from the Supportive and Therapeutic Options Program (STOP) State General Funds (SGF), a STOP County General Fund (CGF) match totaling \$320,000 (Attachment II). The \$320,000 will fill a gap between the \$1,618,000 received in SGF and the \$1,938,000 actually expended by the providers. These amendments will permit a \$320,000 shift of funds from SGF to CGF match and will allow DMH to reimburse thirty (30) providers listed on Attachment II, 100 percent or \$1,938,000 of STOP SGF and CGF for eligible STOP services provided in FY 2002-2003. There is no increase in the Maximum Contract Amounts (MCAs) for FY 2002-2003.
- 2. Delegate authority to the Director of Mental Health, or his designee, to prepare, sign, and execute future amendments to the Agreements and establish as a new MCA the aggregate of the original contract and all amendments through and including these amendments provided that: 1) the County's total payments to Contractor under the Agreement for each fiscal year shall not exceed a change of 20 percent from the applicable revised MCA; 2) any increase shall be used to

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provide additional services or to reflect program and/or policy changes; 3) the Board of Supervisors has appropriated sufficient funds for all changes; 4) approval of County Counsel and the Chief Administrative Officer or his designee are obtained prior to any such Amendment; 5) the parties may, by written amendment, mutually agree to reduce programs or services without reference to the 20 percent limitation; and 6) the Director of Mental Health shall notify the Board of Supervisors of Agreement changes in writing within thirty (30) days after execution of each Amendment.

PURPOSE /JUSTIFICATION OF RECOMMENDED ACTION

From the inception of the STOP program, the State, through the Department of Children and Family Services (DCFS), contracted with the County at 70 percent SGF with a required 30 percent local CGF match. In prior Board letters when DMH began to contract out for STOP services, DMH did not address this mandated local CGF match requirement. Therefore, when it came time to pay providers, DMH was unable to pay them 100 percent for the provision of STOP services using SGF received from the State through DCFS. For FY 2002-2003, DMH received from the State a total of \$1,618,000 in STOP SGF for the program. The \$1,618,000 was paid to providers under the County Agreement's terms and conditions. Providers submitted claims totaling \$1,938,000. Therefore, DMH needs the difference between the \$1,938,000 in provider claims and \$1,618,000 in STOP SGF or \$320,000 of CGF to cover the balance of the local match requirement for providers. Approval of this Board letter will allow DMH to disburse \$320,000 of CGF to thirty (30) providers listed on Attachment II to fully reimburse STOP services rendered in FY 2002-2003.

Implementation of Strategic Plan Goals

The recommended Board action is consistent with the County's Programmatic Goals: Goal Four, "Fiscal Responsibility"; Goal Five, "Children and Families Well-Being"; Goal Six, "Community Services"; and Goal Seven, "Health and Mental Health". Board approval of this request will enable DMH to fully reimburse providers who delivered mental health services to the STOP targeted population in FY 2002-2003.

FISCAL IMPACT/FINANCING

There is no increase in net County cost for FY 2002-2003.

Through the amendment process to shift \$320,000 from SGF to CGF, DMH requests approval to disburse the \$320,000 to thirty (30) providers listed on Attachment II for their

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eligible STOP services rendered in FY 2002-2003. This will enable DMH to fully reimburse the thirty (30) providers for their STOP service claims.

The \$320,000 in requested payments will be fully funded from the Accounts Payable (AP) established for providers in FY 2002-2003. The APs were funded with CGF at the time of the FY 2002-2003 close. Accordingly, there is no impact on net County cost in FY 2003-2004 for this action, nor request for an appropriation adjustment since DMH will utilize the AP established for providers that was funded by CGF at the close of FY 2002-2003.

FACTS AND PROVISIONS/LEGAL REQUIREMENTS

On October 2001, your Board approved contract amendments enabling DMH to add STOP funds to twenty (20) providers. Such STOP funds were part of the Juvenile Justice Program expansion and were to be used for the STOP target population, i.e., children and youth at risk of out-of-home placement and those preparing to exit, or who are in the process of exiting, an out-of-home placement. In FY 2002-2003, DMH expanded the STOP program and entered into agreements with thirty (30) providers (Attachment II).

Since inception of the STOP program, the State has required a 30 percent local CGF match for STOP funding. Since DMH did not address this 30 percent match requirement when contracting out most of the STOP allocations in FYs 2001-2002 and 2002-2003, DMH was unable to pay providers 100 percent for their STOP services using SGF received from the State through DCFS. For FY 2001-2002, DMH paid providers the 70 percent of SGF, and only if such providers had enough of their own CGF to cover the 30 percent match.

According to the existing Agreements for FY 2002-2003, DMH has a legal obligation to pay providers \$1,938,000 for 100 percent of STOP services rendered. DMH received a total of \$1,618,000 in STOP funds for the program (a combination of \$261,000 from DMH directly-operated and \$1,357,000 from contract providers' STOP claims). Like the State, DMH views the required local match at a total program level; for the DMH STOP program, this means both DMH directly-operated and contract providers can generate the required match. For providers, the 30 percent match totals \$581,000; since DMH is using \$261,000 of STOP funds received for DMH directly-operated providers to cover part of the match, DMH needs only the gap of \$320,000 for providers to cover the STOP funding shortfall for providers. Approval of this Board letter will allow DMH to disburse \$320,000 of CGF, thereby fully reimbursing providers for 100 percent of STOP services.

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CONTRACTING PROCESS

DMH will amend thirty (30) Agreements for FY 2002-2003 (Attachment II) to separate out CGF from SGF to ensure that providers receive 100 percent reimbursement for STOP services rendered in FY 2002-2003.

IMPACT ON CURRENT SERVICES

There will be no impact on current services, as these providers have delivered mental health services to the STOP target population.

CONCLUSION

- Contractor shall provide services in accordance with the Contractor's Fiscal Year 2002-2003 Negotiation Package for this Agreement and any addenda thereto approved in writing by Director.
- 3. Except as provided in this Amendment, all other terms and conditions of the Agreement shall remain in full force and effect.
