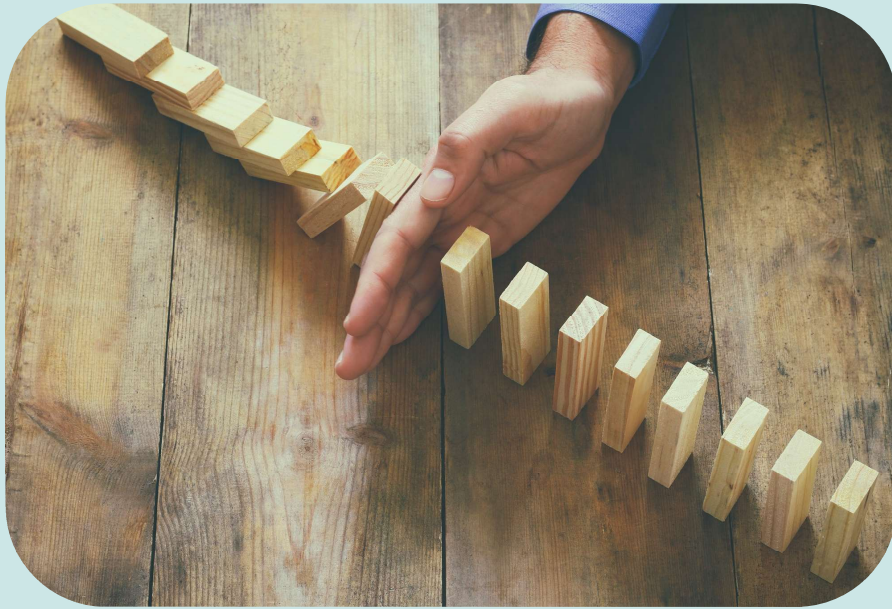

This one-day training conference offers mental health professionals and students/trainees, consumers and their family members an opportunity to acquire knowledge and skills in Prevention and Innovative Treatment Approaches for at-risk populations in the Asian and Asian-American community. As a result of this training, participants will be better able to employ prevention strategies and intervene with innovative culturally competent approaches for several Asian subgroups. No pre-requisite is required. Each participant requesting CME/CE credits is required to fill out a program evaluation form.

Specifically, the conference will enable participants to apply the following clinical skills: (1) Recognize early onset psychosis and the role of stigma, family, community, and culture in help seeking and recovery and examine treatment opportunities to leverage Western interventions with Eastern wisdom; (2) Identify the role of humanism in culturally informed care of API refugees; (3) Increase understanding of the suicide risks and mental health concerns of API college students and apply examples of culturally responsive clinical interventions and of suicide prevention efforts; (4) Explain and demonstrate mental health benefits from dementia prevention strategies; (5) Formulate treatment plans unique to women's specific mental health needs across the stages of the reproductive life cycle and with respect to psychosocial and cultural aspects of women's mental health.
