MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES OVERSIGHT & ACCOUNTABILITY COMMISSION HOLDS COMMUNITY FORUM

Public discussion to focus on impact and progress of the Mental Health Services Act (Prop 63)

WHAT: The Mental Health Services Oversight and Accountability Commission (MHSOAC), the statewide

entity that oversees the implementation of the Mental Health Services Act (MHSA), will be holding

its community forum to discuss the impact and progress of MHSA.
