- 2) Demonstrate increased knowledge and skills of Armenian terms associated with conducting evidenced based interventions such as cognitive behavioral therapy.
- 3) Identify ways to communicate cross-culturally with community members and others across diverse settings and situations.
- 4) Examine useful Armenian terminology when working or collaborating with families, governmental institutions/partners and health professionals.
- 5) Identify Armenian terminology to use in assessment, development of a treatment plan and related interventions and referral for services.
- 6) Utilize appropriate Armenian terminology when discussing consent for services, hospitalization and reporting laws.
