This training is second of five in a series of trainings identified as meeting core trainings for Social Recovery Specialist (SRS) staff who are defined as non-clinical staff that deliver case management related services to our consumers, such as Community Worker, Senior Community Worker, Medical Case Worker I and II, Substance Abuse Counselor and Community Services Counselor. The purpose of this training is to provide legal and ethical considerations relevant to SRSs working in the public mental health system. It will address confidentiality, privilege, reporting requirements, PHI, HIPPA, informed consent, agency policy/procedures and appropriate documentation within the scope of SRS. In particular, ethical decision-making approaches, legal issues associated with working with homeless and/or severe and persistently mentally ill consumers will likewise be covered. This training will provide strength base strategies and vignettes that will enhance understanding and applicability of key concepts essential to legal and ethical considerations.

TARGET AUDIENCE: SRS DMH and contract providers (Community Worker, Senior Community Worker, Medical Case Worker I and II, Substance Abuse Counselor and Community Services Counselor)

OBJECTIVES: **As a result of attending this training, participants should be able to:**

- 1) Define legal and ethical standards as associated with the SRS workforce.
- 2) Apply public mental health system policy and procedures as it relates to the role of an SRS.
- 3) Define and identify approaches to managing patient/provider privilege, PHI, HIPPA and Informed Consent.
- 4) Discuss reporting requirements for SRSs.
- 5) Discuss the maintaining of professional boundaries within a recovery focused, diverse and culturally understanding environment.
- 6) Identify three field safety strategies
