This condensed training will provide an introduction to mental health law and an overview of ethical issues as they relate to involuntary detention. The clinical component will discuss the mechanisms of the LPS application. The participant is expected to spend a minimum of two hours in self-study prior to the class and exam. 2. Define the impact of the Lanterman-Petris-Short Act on the rights of the mentally ill.
3. Identify who has authority to initiate an involuntary detention form and understand the scope of that authority.
4. Identify the responsibilities inherent in initiating involuntary detention and the ramifications of that responsibility.
5. Discuss how different cultures and subcultures are considered when assessing consumers in crisis.
