Training topics are to include: current expanded definition of IPV, prevalence, traits of perpetrators and victims, impact on individuals and their families, intervention strategies for responding to IPV survivors and their family members, cultural factors associated with diverse IPV survivors, case management issues relevant to working with this population including general case management assessment to identify legal and community resources, and self-care strategies for dealing with vicarious trauma.
