

## Intimate Partner Violence 101 (Non-Clinical)

This course is designed to provide participants background knowledge and context related to the support and safety needs that can be offered to the survivors of Intimate Partner Violence. Case Management/Rehabilitative staff may work with survivors of IPV and their children on a daily/weekly basis. Understanding the various forms, frequencies, patterns, and social impacts associated with IPV is critical to the delivery of mental health services. As a result of this training, Case Management/Rehabilitative Staff will better support and/or provide case management/rehabilitative services. Training topics are to include: current expanded definition of IPV, prevalence, traits of perpetrators and victims, impact on individuals and their families, intervention strategies for responding to IPV survivors and their family members, cultural factors associated with diverse IPV survivors, case management issues relevant to working with this population including general case management assessment to identify legal and community resources, and self-care strategies for dealing with vicarious trauma.

**OBJECTIVES:** As a result of attending this training, participants should be able to:

1. Summarize the current expanded definition of IPV, prevalence, traits of perpetrators and survivors of IPV.
2. Recognize the impact of IPV on the survivors of IPV and their family members.
3. Identify strategies for responding to IPV survivors and their families.
4. Demonstrate knowledge of and sensitivity to cultural factors associated with diverse IPV survivors.
5. Demonstrate understanding of the use of general case management assessment for legal and community resources so as to assist the survivors and family member of Intimate Partner Violence.
6. Identify self-care techniques to address vicarious trauma.
