## Future Capacity Building Projects

- Subcommittee reviewed ideas that were identified in the previous subcommittee meeting
- Project for FY 2016-17 must be implemented quickly and be completed by June 2017

### Themes/Topics/Ideas from previous meeting

- Media Campaign with FNX (First Nations Experience) targeting the Native American community
- Project focusing on co-occurring disorders-possibly utilizing the PSAs-developing resource guides or materials that list health/mental health/substance abuse providers (resources where co-occurring disorders can be treated)
- White Bison Training-implement again in Los Angeles County, in particular a training for doctors regarding substance abuse and the Native American community (two tracks-one for professionals and one for community)
- Host a Townhall meeting in order to inform the community about this UsCC group-attempt to brand DMH and the Native American UsCC to make it more recognizable to the community-specifically inform the community what DMH does for Native Americans, and then bring it all together with the conference
- Community discussions (focus groups/community assessment) regarding the needs, trials, tribulations and challenges
  within the Native American community, bring the community together and hear their needs and provide them with
  resources/referrals
- Wellness workshops (substance abuse, physical health, mental health, nutrition, whole health/holistic approach) for Service Area 1
- Host a Health Fair for the Native American community-have someone to develop partnerships with different non-profit
  organizations that provide specific services to the Native American community and provide a series of wellness
  workshops that target children and families and provide them basic information about health, wellness, mental health,
  substance abuse, LGBT, HIV, nutrition, etc.
- Write up a press release/article that can be submitted to tribal newspapers-inform the community at large what work the subcommittee is doing

### New Ideas

- Work with Out Front Media to advertise with the Metro (buses, trains, etc.)
- Media/advertising campaign to abolish Columbus Day-connect how the County honoring Columbus Day has a negative impact on mental health for Native Americans (Recommendation from George Funmaker that the subcommittee draft a letter to submit to the Board of Supervisors regarding this and have community members join him at the Board of Supervisors' meeting on 11/4)
- Campaign to educate people regarding culturally insensitive Native American mascots, sports teams, and Halloween costumes-develop flyers or materials, write press release, media campaign-"I'm Not Your Mascot"
- Hold a conference of Native American services within LA County (urban Native American health conference) on American Indian Day
- Extend the conference that is planned for next year to two-days (pre-conference day)
- Hold a DMH hosted pow wow (first annual)
- Community readiness model involving the Executive Directors of all Native specific agencies in order to find out where

their politics lie and what their focus is-know where they stand on all issues specific to the Native American community-find out how informed they are about mental health, HIV, substance abuse issues, etc.

#### Recommendations

- Combine projects:
  - White Bison Training, project focusing on co-occurring disorders, wellness workshops
  - o Townhall meeting, health fair, community assessment/discussion

#### Outcome

- Projects to focus on for FY 2016-17:
  - Media campaign with FNX
  - o Advertising campaign with Out Front Media
  - Wellness workshops in SA 1
  - Host a townhall meeting
  - Press release (in addition to another project-potentially without a cost)
- Projects to focus on for FY 2017-18:
  - White Bison Training
  - Health fair
  - o Pow wow
  - Community assessments/focus groups
  - Community readiness-bring leaders of Native specific agencies together (possibly do it the day before the conference)
  - Project focusing on co-occurring disorders (possibly utilizing the PSAs)-develop resource guides or materials that list health/mental health/substance abuse providers (resources where co-occurring disorders can be treated)
  - Media campaign (flyers, billboards, social media, etc.) to educate people regarding the negative impact of acculturating Native American culture through mascots, sports teams, Halloween costumes ("I'm Not Your Mascot")
