<ul> <li>Glenda discusses FSP office location issue</li> <li>Issue of Indian FSP targets not being met due to lack of office space. They are currently using spare space donated by UAII, but those spaces are unsustainable.</li> <li>UAII has space in an adjacent building available for FSP, but Public Works has prohibited usage due to building code violations. However, the same building houses DPSS workers and a dialysis clinic.</li> <li>This space is ideal for the FSP program due to its proximity to UAII. Indian clients know where UAII is and can also use its services in conjunction with FSP.</li> <li>UAII has been using its own funds to pay for this space so that they can partner and collaborate with FSP</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>would like for DMH to contact CAO or Public Works to see if the UAII space can be approved</li> <li>Glenda is currently searching for alternative office spaces by driving around LA but does not think she can find something feasible</li> </ul>
<ul> <li>UREP Proposal</li> <li>website will link all mental health resources and websites within county and state</li> <li>would like for the website to be linked from DMH and MHSA website</li> <li>include information related to WET and PEI</li> <li>current DMH website not user-friendly, especially for Indians</li> <li>website good tool for building up youth leadership within community</li> <li>100K available for current fiscal year (by June 2008)</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Monique will draft the proposal and flesh out details</li> <li>need to have website available on all search engines</li> <li>try to connect with MHSA website and purchase redirecting domain name</li> <li>possibly offer trainings to those who are not computer or internet savvy</li> <li>Elton will look at other sites for ideas and will send relevant links</li> <li>One Sky Center (oneskycenter.org) is a good national example</li> <li>Sam Chan suggests looking into technical assistance grants in case MHSA is unable to fund the website</li> </ul>
<ul> <li>Glenda discusses Learning Collaborative proposal</li> <li>proposal in conjunction with Dr. Shaner and UAII</li> <li>Evidence-based practice project utilizing Indian elders to conduct intake interviews</li> <li>Proposal approved: state will provide 150K if county can provide matching funds of 50K. LA one of 6 counties selected.</li> <li>No Indian-based evidence-based practice projects</li> <li>Currently 1 promising practice, came out of SAMHSA research</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>committee has agreed to strongly consider this proposal for UREP funding</li> <li>proposal will be sent to committee</li> <li>Next Meeting:         <ul> <li>ad-hoc meeting will be arranged between Gladys and UREP chair committee to discuss proposals</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
