Project Update	 Speak Your Mind Academy Project awarded to Star View Behavioral Health, Inc. Will be countywide and include all ethnicities Mirtala reviewed the solicitation process that was conducted by ISD and reported that this process requires 2-3 different reference quotes for informational purposes only The implementation process will begin shortly and the vendor will be required to come to the subcommittee on a quarterly basis to provide status updates regarding the project's deliverables Sometimes subcommittees underutilize their dollars but since the dollars are one time dollars per year, whatever is not utilized cannot be rolled over to another year What was the funding limit for the Speak Your Mind Academy? Each UsCC subcommittee will vote on what they want to implement for next year. This last time there were at least six proposals. The two that were voted on included the Speak Your Mind Academy and a 	
	 Mental Health Conference. Once the vendor is identified, our unit oversees the project implementation and closely monitors to ensure that all the deliverables are being met. Can we know how much was funded to Star View? We can follow up with the Program Support Bureau's Administration regarding this. For this project, our Unit took the original proposal and expanded it to include all Service Areas and all ethnicities. Will this project include the Iranian community as well? Once we meet with Star View and review the expectations of the project, we will discuss structuring the project to target as many ethnic groups as possible, including the Iranian community. Star View is very good at partnering with other agencies. We will also invite them to come and present their plans to the subcommittee. Will you monitor how that plan will be implemented to the various people of our communities? Yes. We will monitor it very closely.

The target population will be consumers, professionals, and community? Yes. Recommendation to have presenters with lived experience, not just professionals.
