UsCC Business	RAND Presentation: RAND is a research company that was hired by DMH to pool the stakeholders, and find out what DMH is doing well, what DMH is not doing well, and to provide recommendations to executive management on the DMH strategic planning and the stakeholder process. They are doing focus groups which will take about 90 minutes and they will come to the meeting to talk. Three questions they'll be asking: 1. What's working? 2. What's not working 3. What recommendations to improve it?

	Community Co-Chairs – Nominations: As of now there is only one Co-Chair for the LGBTQI2-S group which is Terri Jay. Julian unfortunately had to step down, things that are changing with the stakeholder process is that the co-chairs for these groups should not be DMH employees. DMH employees should attend but co-chairs should be community members. We need to vote in a second co-chair. Kelly asked that the group think about people that would be good co-chairs for this subcommittee.
	Requirements are: Co-Chairs will have to attend LGBTQI2-S monthly meetings and monthly UsCC Leadership meetings. UsCC Leadership group is all of the co-chairs from each UsCC groups that come together and talk

about things that affect all of the subcommittee's as a whole and other DMH priorities.

- If you'd like to nominate someone they would have to attend meetings on a regular basis
- You can nominate yourself or someone else.
- To have voting privileges you would have to attend in person or by phone 50% of the meetings over the last 12 months to be able to vote
