




Post-COVID Housing Push From Home For Good Draft Framework v3. May 11






Over-65 Homelessness is rising rapidly LAHSA HMIS, Actual data through 2017-18, PIT-adjusted, then forecast






Project Roomkey Progress to date

Key pillars of success

- Exit hotels into permanent housing, or path to housing
- Draw on a mix of existing resources, including
 - Rapid Rehousing and shallow subsidies for most
 - Permanent supportive housing for some
 - Nursing home care for some
- Housing stabilization case management must include mainstream benefits enrollment, services, tracking





Proposed USC/UCLA survey project

- During pandemic: monthly panel survey of 100+ clients from sheltered, unsheltered, Roomkey, PSH
 - Housing, COVID protection, symptoms, isolation, Quality of life
- Representative panel survey of LA PEH, starting with 2021 PIT
- Linkage to HMIS, PIT will facilitate validation of measures
- Potential backbone for integrated service delivery app

Need to bridge the digital divide for PEH!!!



Other major challenges

- Roomkey capacity must rise, especially in SPA 6
- Identify, address other equity considerations in PRK
- Anticipating / addressing potential rise in homeless inflow
- Reconciling post-PRK housing system to existing CES system
- Building a CES triage tool that accounts for social/environmental/political risk, not just individual factors
