Development of a DMH Staff Survey re: LGBTQ+ Mental Health Knowledge and Skills, Current Clinical Environment, and Training Needs-Rebecca Gitlin (minute 34 in the audio recording)

- New/First LGBTQ+ Clinical Specialist for the Department
- Provide culturally responsive services to sexual and gender minorities
- Make necessary improvements needed
- Develop a voluntary survey for DMH staff
- Develop a group of clinicians who are specialized in working with this community
- Specialized training for clinicians who want to work with transgender and non-binary folks to write letters for gender affirmation treatment
- Feedback: Do not refer to the LGBTQIA2-S community as a minority, be sure to consider intersectional identities, provide updates regularly to subcommittee

• Kelly updated subcommittee regarding the departmental freeze on non-COVID related spending. Will continue to keep the subcommittee updated.

FY 20-21 - Proposals

- 1. Greg Wilson (minute 58 in the audio recording)
 - For the SAGES
 - Designed to provide a Safe and Supportive environment for Black Gay men 50 years of age and older in Los Angeles County. This project will provide Education, Support, Community Outreach, as well as provide Resources for older men. The Monthly Support Meetings;
 Community Forums; Outreach; Sharing of Educational Materials; Data/Survey Collection will help to address the issues and needs of older men.
 - o Recommendations from subcommittee: include Black bisexual men, include Latino gay and bisexual men, focus on masculine identified individuals to include transmen and transmasculine individuals as well
- 2. Addison Rose Vincent (minute 65 in the audio recording)
 - Non-Binary & Intersex Mental Health Study

As non-binary and intersex identities are becoming more visible and understood by the public, there remains very little data and research around mental health and related issues/challenges regarding non-binary and intersex people. With a rapidly growing population in Los Angeles, this project would focus on conducting research to better understand this community here in LA County, and provide our data and findings to community-based organizations, schools, and businesses.

- o Recommendations from subcommittee: look at all age groups, focus on outreach and education-consider using different language-avoid use of the word "study" and consider "survey" or "assessment" instead and also include an educational component
- LGBTQ+ Youth Mental Health Video + Print Campaign
 The campaign will focus on addressing the decrease in positive/supportive social connections and the increase in anxiety, depression, and suicidal ideation experienced by LGBTQ+ youth during COVID-19.
 - o Recommendations from subcommittee: propose this as a PEI project as well, be aware of structural bias and toxicity in media,
- LGBTQ+ Youth Innovation Lab & Fellowship
 Despite decades of progress and inclusion for LGBTQ+ people, many LGBTQ+ youth still face unsafe and hostile school environments, as well as stigma, shame, and other barriers that prevent them from seeking support
 - Recommendations from subcommittee: propose this as a PEI project as well, consider scale so it fits within this particular funding opportunity so you don't lose the quality
