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### **UPDATES TO THE INCLUDED & ALLOWABLE ICD-10-CM DIAGNOSES LISTS**

Per State Department of Health Care Services (DHCS) Information Notice (IN) 20-043, issued on July 8, 2020, the Outpatient & Day Services and Inpatient "included" ICD-10-CM Diagnoses lists have been updated effective October 1, 2019. Based on the date of DHCS notification to the County, providers do not need to make retroactive edits or changes to existing claims. The updated diagnoses should be used from the date of this bulletin forward for new or returning clients or when a diagnosis needs to be updated. Providers do not need to change existing diagnoses based solely on the updates.

## Change in Use of R69 Diagnosis Deferred (Illness Unspecified)

Since R69, Diagnosis Deferred (Illness Unspecified), has been removed from DSM-5, providers should no longer use this code when assessing a client. Instead, providers should use Z03.89, Encounter for Observation for Other Suspected Diseases and Conditions Ruled Out, previously referred to as No Diagnosis, during the assessment period in which a diagnosis is yet to be determined (or when the determination is that no diagnosis exists).

#### Addition of F84.0 Autistic Disorder (Autism Spectrum Disorder) as an Included Diagnosis

F84.0, Autistic Disorder (Autism Spectrum Disorder), has been added as an included diagnosis under outpatient specialty mental health services (SMHS) to align with DSM-5 diagnostic criteria. Individuals who would have been diagnosed with Asperger's Disorder or Pervasive Developmental Disorder NOS under DSM-IV should now be given a diagnosis of Autistic Disorder (Autism Spectrum Disorder) under DSM-5. Providers should no longer use the DSM-IV criteria for Pervasive Development Disorder as previously directed in QA Bulletin 17-07 (based on IN 16-051). Although Autistic Disorder (Autism Spectrum Disorder) is now considered an included diagnosis, no new obligation has been created for outpatient SMHS providers to cover and/or treat clients with this diagnosis. For example, Applied Behavioral Analysis (ABA) and other behavioral health treatment services are not considered SMHS and therefore are not covered/reimbursable services. Providers should continue to offer existing SMHS to this population while the Regional Centers and Managed Care Health Plans continue to provide the services for which they are responsible (DHCS All Plan Letter 18-006; Responsibilities for Behavioral Health Treatment Coverage for Members under the Age of 21).

#### **Organizational Providers Manual**

The ICD-10-CM included diagnoses lists for Outpatient & Day Services and Inpatient Services will be removed from the Organizations Provider's Manual and will be posted separately on the DMH QA webpage (https://dmh.lacounty.gov/qa/qama/). Additionally, DMH will no longer maintain a list of "allowable" ICD-10-CM diagnoses for contract providers. Contract providers should ensure a valid ICD-10-CM code is used on claims. A list of valid ICD-10-CM codes can be found on the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) website (https://www.cms.gov/Medicare/Coding/ICD10). This list includes both "included" and "excluded" diagnosis codes. As a reminder, services for Medi-Cal must be directed towards addressing the "included" diagnosis except while conducting the assessment or emergency/crisis services. Refer to the Organizational Provider's Manual for additional information related to when an included diagnosis is required on claims.

As a reminder, more diagnosis updates will occur on **October 1**, **2020**. Legal Entity providers should check the CMS website for any changes and updates. For Directly Operated providers, IBHIS is automatically updated so no action is necessary.
