## **Legislative Update**

### Kei Nagao, DMH Legislative Analyst and Keris Myrick, DMH Discipline Chief, Peer Services

Presenters reported senate and federal government both are making most of their decisions basically through the COVID-19 crisis. Peers have an essential part of the workforce to support people, especially those who are in crisis or distress because of COVID-19. Also, reflected on the bills sponsored by Los Angeles County, SB 803, AB 2025, SB 855, and AB 2112 suicide prevention, AB 1935 Program to study mental health among women vets from California, AB 2118 transgender wellness law and equity fund, AB 2830 Healthcare payment data program. - ADA services-meeting is not ADA compliant for Co-Chair to facilitate meetings.

### API UsCC - Mariko Khan, Member

- API UsCC has been creating projects that are intersectional across various API groups such as domestic violence and LGBTQ issues.
- API is concerned how COVID-19 has a cultural impact on the community particularly the attacks on API that are being tracked. Attackers are not distinguishing who we are. They are saying you are API.
- The API Council's Mental Health Committee is very concerned about the lack of MHSA 3-year plan addressing disparities and cultural competencies. This needs to be addressed.
- API submitted a report to DMH and would like to see more movement on this issue.

## **Department of Mental Health Report**

## Impact of COVID-19 on DMH Overall Budget – Greg Polk, Chief Deputy Director reported:

- Revenues are shrinking at all levels of government that impacts Los Angeles County. State level prediction is estimated about \$54 billion shortfall. Federal level shortfall impacts the Department's realignment at the local level. DMH is taking a \$150 million hit in realignment. DMH has overmatch that is over and above the maintenance effort required in the budget. The overmatch helps DMH ride the storm without any major impacts.
- CEO implemented a hiring freeze on new-hires and hold on promotions. Possibly 650 layoffs which is less than ½%. DMH is reimbursed for COVID-19 activities and will be applying for grants and reimbursement from the federal government.
- To focus on community engagement, the CEO will play a major role in what we do in the future
