	<ul> <li>Disability Peers Training (Peer Mentor Program) Disability Resource Center Roque Bucton shared with the subcommittee a course he is taking.</li> <li>DMH funded project called, "Peer Specialist Training Course" at the Disabilities Community Resource Center.</li> <li>Roque stated there is a lot of disability resource knowledge; it is great for networking and advocating for the Access for All subcommittee.</li> <li>The next class will be in the middle of September and held on ZOOM.</li> <li>Update on UsCC Funding: All UsCC subcommittees will continue to receive the annual allocation that is provided every fiscal year, in the amount of Two Hundred Thousand dollars (\$200,000.00).</li> </ul>
Ongoing Discussions Related to COVID-19 Co-Chairs & Subcommittee	<ul> <li>A. People's Wellbeing: Mental Health – Open discussion</li></ul>

	Telehealth. Due to lack of accessibilities, he recommends trainings for the front line staff and Clinicians.  Junko Nagamatsu: Sometimes there are difficulties via telehealth for Deaf clients to have their interpreter on the call with them.  Dr. Sandra Chang informed the subcommittee that the Department is exploring a new technology called VC (Video Capability). Psychiatrists and Clinicians are testing it, and this will be made available soon. The feedback has been positive.  Amy Kay: Suggested for DMH to provide training on how to work with interpreters. It will also benefit clients who have transportation problems. The Access for All subcommittee should support that.  Sunnie Whipple invited the Access for All subcommittee to attend the CCC Leadership meeting this afternoon. They will have speaker from WET (Workforce Education Training) who can answer their questions.  B. Law Enforcement Agencies: Their Role in Mental Health Issues  Our Law Enforcement do not have training on how to handle a situation that might involve a physically disabled, Blind, Deaf or Hard of Hearing person.  Statistics says that ¾ of the people killed by law enforcement are from the disabled community.  A Community Wellness Team needs to be developed.  People with Mental Health Disability issues can be approached by unarmed trained team members who can provide medical assistance if needed.  The team would be composed of a Social Worker and an Emergency Medical Technician (EMT).  With proper training, a dispatcher will be able to determine if a call should go to Law Enforcement is dealing with something that they are not prepared to be doing.  The number of deaths are rising in the Disabled, Deaf, Hard of Hearing community while in need of help, due to lack of training within Law Enforcement.  C. Social Media Platforms: Talking Circle – Web Conferencing & The Healing Circle  Talking Circle – can be done through social platform to help the group figure out the logistics to connect with one another and provide services to the community.
