They analyze all the various sectors of disabilities and evaluate how each sector is doing - the education, employment and services (such as medical services). They produce two documents yearly which are about to be released. It's a great data that will show the whole field about disabilities in the United States.
	Alex Elliott:
	<ul> <li>The State mandates to collect the demographic information about disabilities which is funded by MHSA.</li> </ul>
	• There are 53 Counties in California that may use 53 different ways trying to comply with the State plan.
	<ul> <li>The data elements would be good to look at, as it relates to disabilities that can be captured through the electronic health records. When someone comes in for services, he/she will be given an assessment, and asked questions related to disabilities.</li> </ul>
