## School Based Services Plan

#### **School Based Community Access Platform (SBCAP)**

- Expands access to prevention services
- Supports students/families towards individual and community wellbeing

#### SBCAP provides support to the school community through collaborations that:

- Raise awareness
- Promote resilience
- Build organizational and community capacity
- Build the capacity to recognize and respond to trauma
- Build bridges to mental health care

# DMH SBCAP Regional Team

The DMH SBCAP Regional Team consisting of 25 members, support and functions as a bridge between innovative initiatives, the 81 school districts in Los Angeles county, and the 71 legal entities and school mental health providers.

## **LACOE Community Schools**

The Community Schools aim at disrupting poverty and addressing longstanding inequities by highlighting areas of need and leveraging community resources.

- 15 Community School sites across 15 school districts
- LACOE Community School activities resulted in:
  - 4,042 referrals received
  - **3,064** linkages to resources
  - **167** new partnerships with community agencies
  - Over **287** outreach and awareness activities

## LAUSD TRIEE

LAUSD + UCLA community school initiative focuses on creating a trauma informed classroom and school setting for preschool aged students, increasing trauma informed practices at early education centers and the subsequent elementary schools.

#### Goals to increase:

- trauma informed practices knowledge
- the capacity of EEC teachers and aides
- the number of MOUs and community partnerships
- social connectedness
- parent/caregiver engagement and participation

#### Efforts resulted in:

- 539 Mental Health consultations reaching 901 parents and staff
- 98 staff wellness activities were conducted for 739 staff members
- 47 parent workshops reaching over 437 parents



#### **DMH, DPH and PPLA Wellbeing Centers (WBC)**

The WBC partnership provides youth with health, mental health and substance use services by educating youth on protective practices and promotes wellbeing.

- Regional Team presented live virtual workshops
- Recorded workshops available on Wellbeing4LA (English/Spanish)
- Planned Parenthood Los Angeles: Call Center
- Planned Parenthood Los Angeles: social media posts

## **UCLA Public Partnership for Wellbeing (PPfW)**

A high impact partnership designed to strengthen communities and improve the wellbeing of Los Angeles County residents by providing a holistic foundation for addressing inequities and advancing wellbeing.

- Trained over 1,000 educators
- Four-part virtual workshop for school educators
- School Wellbeing Toolkit

#### **Community Ambassador Network (CAN-Youth)**

The CAN-Youth program aims to support the student body and school community by bringing mental health promotion and awareness on school campuses and empowering leadership roles among students.

- CAN-Youth collaboration DMH, LAUSD, LACOE
  - Initial phase FY 2021-2022 : 5 high school sites
  - FY 2021-2022: Summer Youth Academy
