Welcome, Prayer & Introductions	Nikki Crow lead the meeting with prayer. Members were asked to introduce themselves.

Capacity Building Projects - Update Kelly Wilkerson	<ul> <li>Kelly Wilkerson reported to the group that she is working on developing a SOW (Statements of Work) for each of the projects.</li> <li>Mending the Hoop: Gathering of Nations/Congress</li> <li>Social Media Campaign/Podcast/Radio Interviews</li> <li>Youth Academy</li> <li>Language Forum/Tribal Gathering</li> <li>Kelly will keep the subcommittee informed on next steps.</li> </ul>
Co-Chair Report Out – Sylvia Gonzalez Youngblood	<ul> <li>Sylvia Gonzalez-Youngblood reported that she and Shannon Rivers had to rescheduled their visit the Latino and API UsCC subcommittees.</li> <li>They rescheduled for September.</li> <li>Sylvia suggested having SAAHAS Courage of Change do a presentation for the AI/AN subcommittee.</li> <li>Sylvia informed the group that their Data Collection for Native Americans and Indigenous people ties in with the work that Dr. Cain presented to the subcommittee last month.</li> <li>Sylvia shared that the Department of Education is doing a project with NAMI.</li> <li>Sylvia believes it would be a great idea if the Department of Mental Health collaborated with the Department of Education to help bring in the missing cultural piece.</li> <li>This collaboration will better help reach the Native American people to receive resources, education, and acquiring knowledge.</li> </ul>

## **Gallup Wellbeing** Pinki Mehta shared that May 2021 the Outcomes Division partnered with Gallup to collect adult well-being data with Survey survey questions. **Outcomes** Pinki informed the group of the miscommunication regarding the survey since it comes from Gallup, and people **Division** might not respond. Pinki Mehta Pinki would like to share and inform people that it's okay to take the survey. It's not coming from Gallup. It is on behalf of the Department of Mental Health. Pinki shared that the survey was sent out to 12,000 people and only received 500 responses. Pinki informed the group that this would be the Department of Mental Health's first Outcomes measure for adults across the department's programs. Hector Ramirez advised that the flyer be put on the Department of Mental Health's website to be more accessible. **Mental Health** • Dr. Jorge Partida gave an update on the Mental Health Promoters program. Promoters -Dr. Partida stated that the program's overall structure is that the Promotores de Salud program has existed as a pilot Update program for the last ten years. Dr. Jorge Partida • The Board of Supervisors extended the program from serving the Latino communities to a Countywide program. The Board of Supervisors directed the Department of Mental Health to expand the version of the program to other underserved cultural communities of priority: 1. African American Heritage community 2. American Indian Alaska Native community 3. API community. • Adriana Carrillo stated that the Health Promoters program developed three related topics that one of the USCL groups helped develop. • Adriana stated that the Center of Excellence gave the curriculum to the Health Promoters, and they could adapt it to the AI/AN, with Alaska-named components. Adrianna suggested that the subcommittee revisit the PowerPoints that the Health Promoters developed from the workshops. Adrianna stated that the Board of Supervisors granted DMH 300 positions under the category of Mental Health advocates. The position of Mental Health advocate is 30 hours a week. Under the F item, there are 300 positions for the Mental Health Advocate position, and the department filled only 95 out of the 300 jobs. Dr. Partida shared that the RD division is operational and approved. The RD staff advisory council is looking at issues of work environment, increased equality, increased transparency, addressing systematic racism and oppression within the department. **DMH Updates &** Pinki Mehta stated that September is Suicide Prevention Month, and the department engages heavily in some Other suicide prevention activities throughout the month. Announcements There will be a pre-conference event and a week-long summit around education and other resources, followed by a post-conference training that is open to anyone that would like to attend. Community Nikki Crow announced that UAII would be having their Indian Day on Saturday, September 11, 2021, at the Whittier **Announcements** Narrows park from 11:00 am to 2:00 pm. & Resources If you cannot attend UAII's Indian Day event, it will be streaming on Facebook Live.

Subcommittee	<ul> <li>Wildflower Robles-Ontiveros shared that SSSP will be kicking off in October four days of training offered to the community called Indigenous-Centered training for people with disabilities.</li> <li>Wildflower states that these workshops provide parents, caregivers, and Family members with tools to advocate for their children with different disabilities in a way that reflects Indigenous core values.</li> <li>Robyn Gomez shared Pukuu Cultural Community Services is partnering with Indigenous Circle of Wellness will be having their Wellness COVID-19 Circle tonight, September 1, 2021.</li> <li>Indigenous Circle of Wellness will be starting another Wellness Circle that happens in the community and is available for people to share.</li> <li>Pukuu will have a Food Pantry starting September 9, 2021, and every Thursday after that from 12:00 pm to 5:00 pm. in San Fernando Valley.</li> <li>Robyn also shared a Youth Empowerment program, teaching the Youth to take care of themselves Physically, Mentally, Emotionally, and Spiritually and connect with the community.</li> <li>Kelly Wilkerson will share all flyers posted on the chat via email.</li> </ul>
